The Jaguar XJ-S ... Not So Under-Appreciated

It has been a brilliant year for the classic car market, especially for historic and exotic foreign cars. That sector has rebounded strongly postrecession. The demand for those cars has dramatically pulled up the perceived value of the lesser members of the class (yes, I am still whining about the quintupling in value of my Mercedes 190SL four years after I sold it). Most luxury investment indices show that classic cars have outperformed everything from art, watches, gold and coins over the past decade. The Jaguar XJ-S is beginning to pick up momentum and prove its investment potential as a modern classic.

Despite that, the XJ-S is still under-appreciated by many classic car collectors, including many



Jaguar aficionados. But I am glad to say that its under-appreciation is decreasing at an increasing rate (I loved Ross Perot's political rhetoric and his stats and charts - we sorely need him in this 2016 campaign). The XJ-S turned 40 last September (see the launch poster) and I don't recall any hoopla about the milestone. If there were any major articles written, I missed them. In England, the milestone was recognized indirectly - the 1975-76 models are now tax-free. Hopefully that will strengthen its position as an affordable collectible in the homeland and eventually here in the colonies. Maybe we will see some recognition on the 50th anniversary. Part of the problem, of course, is the 20+ year run of the model. The oldest examples are 40+ years old, yet the youngest examples are not even considered "classics" or "antiques" in most states.

The XJ-S for me is a very rare combination of style and substance. It is an affordable alternative that exudes individuality. The lines are simple, elegant, and beautiful – a Jaguar trademark from day one. An XJ-S stands out from the crowd in a subtle and classy way. It can be elegant, sporty, or rakish – depending totally on your mood and the options you choose.

Like most Jag-lovers my age, the original XKs turned me on to the marque. I remember seeing the 120/140/150 series in my pre-teen and teen years and thought that no car – past, present, or

future - could ever match their beauty. Then along came the E-Type, the beauty of which even caught Enzo Ferrari's envious eyes. Yes. I drooled uncontrollably over the XKs and E-Types and yes, they are gorgeous cars to look at. But from a practical perspective, the XKs drove like trucks (my lovely wife Irena struggles to push in the clutch on our XK-150). While the E-Types are much more nimble, they are cramped and as I approach my 73rd birthday I find I need a special enter/exit strategy making use of all the leverage I can get from the door and doorframe. As I was struggling to exit my Series II E-Type at the post office recently, a guy came running up to me and said, "That's why I got rid of mine".

The XJ-S just strikes a chord with me on so many levels. It may not be a true sports car (I'll give in to you orthodox enthusiasts), but it is a magnificent GT car. The long, simple side profile is very cool and sophisticated, and I love peering over the long bonnet from behind the wheel and seeing the chrome leaper up front (yes, I know that the leaper is not proper, but I don't care). If there is a better GT of this vintage please let me know. Inside it has all the modern conveniences I care about. The engine and gearbox combinations vary from year to year and I would have liked to have found a manual gearbox, but they are pretty rare. I had trouble getting used to the threespeed, tall-geared, automatic gearbox - other than Irena's personal vehicles it is the only automatic I have owned in decades. A four or fivespeed automatic would have been more desirable. You will not burn people off at the lights, but it is no slouch (for its time) and behaves effortlessly at high speeds - the way a GT car with

impeccable manners and breeding should behave.

I've been fortunate to own and drive a selection of beautiful and desirable vintage cars and modern cars. But the XJ-S attracts more attention than most of the other cars I have owned (maybe with the exception of the Ferrari GTS). You really don't see many out on the roads and young folks want to know what it is. Older folks are reminded of the "old days" when a friend or boss had one that they admired. Under-appreciated? Only by the most snobbish of our colleagues.

Besides, the following people can't be wrong:

Ian Ogilvy (Simon Templar, The Saint) - White XJ -S Coupe Princess Diana - Black XJ-S Cabriolet Adrian Smith (Iron Maiden) - Gold XJ-S Coupe Frank Sinatra - Red XJ-S Coupe Tom Petty - Silver XJ-S Convertible Prince Edward - White XJ-S Coupe Sarah Ferguson - Black XJ-S Convertible Martin Brundle - Hot TWR XJ-S ... and many other cool people.

In my opinion, the best advice for someone considering the purchase of a classic car is to buy what you love, what turns you on, what you have a passion for. Any appreciation should be secondary to the pride of ownership - and the responsibility of preserving a slice of history for future generations.

Be happy. Drive safely. It's a Jaguar kind of day.
