President's Mewsings July 2016

A Perfect Storm

I am writing this column shortly after being discharged from Paoli Hospital. For a person who has been healthy all his life (that was only the third time I was confined to a hospital, including my birth 73 years ago), it was a bit disconcerting. It all seemed to start while my lovely wife Irena and I joined our Vintage Sports Car Club of America (VSCCA) friends for a rally in the Berkshires on Father's Day weekend. One of the cars, a beautiful Cunningham, stalled out and I attempted to give it a push start (with me being the pusher). Well the push-start was not successful and I pulled a muscle in my back and was popping Advil for the next couple of days. Aside from the back pain, which nearly immobilized me for a few days, I started to feel a shortness of breath on Monday especially when I was in a prone or slightly inclined position. I saw my doctor on Tuesday afternoon who sent me to get a chest X-ray. The X-ray revealed a slight accumulation of fluid in my lungs. I was then sent to Paoli Hospital for a complete lung and cardiac evaluation to determine if the fluid was caused by an infection (such as pneumonia) or early onset heart disease (such as congestive heart failure) - both of which cause fluid build-up in the lungs.

The CAT-Scan ruled out infection, so I went through a battery of cardiac tests. Bottom line, I had a valve in the upper part of my heart that was "fluttering", i.e., not staying in synch with the lower valve. This caused my heart rate to increase (120+), my blood oxygenation to drop (90% instead of 97%), my blood pressure

to increase (175/105), the heart to get overworked, and the blood flow pattern to be irregular - potentially causing swirling which could lead to blood clots. This was confirmed by an ECHO-Cardiogram that shows the heart not "squeezing" properly and therefore not operating efficiently. They gave me medication to slow down the heart rate along with a blood thinner and they were going to shock the heart back into rhythm. But during the night, my heart went back to a normal rhvthm on its own, undoubtedly helped by the The heart rate and blood medication. pressure returned to normal (70 and 120/70, resp.), oxygenation level returned to normal, and the shortness of breath symptom disappeared. They then did one more test, a catheterization where they see if there is any blockage in the arteries around the heart. Thev found a 70% blockage in one of the arteries and installed a stent. I am taking medication to help regulate the heart rhythm and I have to follow-up with a cardiologist on a regular basis.

So, bottom line, the stress of pushing the car probably triggered the irregular heartbeat (though I told my wife it was the stress of her yelling at me to not push the car) - which was just waiting to happen sometime. If it occurred under the wrong conditions, a stroke or heart attack would likely have happened because, as stated above, the condition causes clots where the blood accumulates under irregular flow.

Good Press for the XE and F-Pace

Al Haas's article in the July 3 issue of the

Philadelphia Inquirer was titled "Two smooth, agile luxury cars". He noted that the two models will put Jaguar in play in two crucial segments where it had not been represented. According to Nathan Hoyt, Jaguar Land Rover's product communication director, the compact sport sedan is the largest segment of the premium auto market and the compact SUV segment is the fastest growing.

Regarding the XE, Mr. Haas states that "The car affords a quiet comfortable ride, vet is remarkably agile thanks to a suspension more sophisticated than you'll find in its BMW and Mercedes Benz counterparts. Its power steering is the best electrically-assisted system I've found in a sport sedan."

Regarding the F-Pace, Mr. Haas states that it is a "practical sports car. Like its XE and XF brethren, Jaguar's first crossover uses a double wishbone front suspension very similar to the one in the F-Type sports car. But the F-Pace's suspension goes beyond exceptional agility, which is usually obtained at the expense of ride comfort. It affords both, causing me to nominate the F-Pace for an automotive Oscar for 'best cohabitation of handling and ride comfort in a crossover'."

It is an exciting time to be a Jaguar lover.

Be happy. Drive safely. It's a Jaguar kind of day.



Special thanks to Rich Rosen who organized the event along with me, but planned the route, and made the restaurant arrangements.









DIRECTIONS:

<u>From the North:</u> Northeast Extension 476, continue on 476 Blue Route to Route 1 South to Route 202 South or go to Valley Forge Exit 26 to Route 202 South. Follow Route 202 South towards West Chester. Turn left on Smithbridge Road for 2.1 miles. GVHS is on the right.

<u>From the East (NJ)</u>: Take the Commodore Barry Bridge, go South on I-95 to exit 2 and go north on 452 to Village Green and West on Concord Road. Follow Concord Road through Aston to the traffic light at Smithbridge Road. Turn left on Smithbridge. GVHS is down the road on the left.

If you 'wind up' on Route 322 continue to right turn on Route 1, then turn right onto Concord Road. From here, you would turn right onto Smithbridge Road. GVHS is down the road on the left. (There is no exit from 322 onto Smithbridge Road.)

<u>From the South:</u> From I-95 take exit 8 to Route 202 North. Continue on Route 202 North into Pennsylvania. Turn right on Smithbridge Road. Bruster's Ice Cream is on the right. Continue on Smithbridge Road for about 3 miles. GVHS is on the right.

From the West: On the PA Turnpike, take exit 23 South on Route 100 to Route 202 South to left on Smithbridge Road. GVHS is on the right.

There are signs for GVHS as you approach the school. The school is not visible from the road; look for the sign at the driveway as the school sits back from the road down a long driveway.
