High Performance: When Britain Ruled the Roads

High Performance: When Britain Ruled the Roads is the title of a book I recently ordered. I can't tell you much about it at this point as it is still bobbing about in the Atlantic on its way here from Merry Olde. However, I think "When Britain Ruled the Roads" is a quite apt description of the field at this year's "Cars and Motorcycles of England and DVJC Concours" event. There was plenty of British Racing Green mixed in with so many other colors so beautifully suited to the British sports car and saloon.



It would appear that whatever sacrifice Jim Sjoreen made to the rain gods worked, because it was a great day to pull the top down and go motoring to a British car show. Plenty of great cars showed up. Of course the centerpiece of the show was the long double row of gleaming Jaguars. Our magnificent Marque was very well represented. There were even a couple of non-JCNA Jaguars that were registered with the CMOE British car show on the field. I'm told that the owner of one of them, a stunning blue XKR Portfolio Edition, joined our club on the spot.

The entire span of Jaguar history was well represented on the field from the 1938 XK-SS to a 2019 iPace and pretty much every model in between. It was truly a "Jaguar Kind of Day" for both the owners who displayed their cars and the spectators who were wowed by them. When Sue and I arrived, a bit before 8am, the field was abuzz with Jaguars coming up the lane from Bethlehem Pike and down the lane from the trailer parking area with Union Jack flags waving them to their designated spaces. Quickly the field filled up and it was time to move from flag waving to Concours judging. After the judges meeting, Charlie announced "Rags Down!" and, suited in our white safety vests with clipboards in hand, we descended upon the neatly lined up Jaguars in search of authenticity

and cleanliness. While every Jaguar on the field was quite special in its own right, and truly represented "The Art of Performance", there were a couple that particularly caught my attention.



Seeing Alan and Margaret Brown slowly motoring their magnificent British Racing Green E-Type Coupe down the field to their assigned space brought such a smile to my face. Many of us have been following the restoration of said E-type for a couple of years now. When I saw Alan and Margaret at the last DVJC Breakfast Social, both were quite committed and determined to have the E-Type ready for the Concours; and they did it! From the delightful tales they have shared, this restoration was truly a team effort from both of them; right down to installing the seats on Friday night. Well Done to Team Brown!

Dennis Mamchur's 2005 XKR Stirling Moss Edition immediately grabbed my attention with its Racing Green stripes over silver and "Grand Sport" style wing stripes. As one of only five made, it is a rare and magnificent cat indeed. The Stirling Moss Edition has special paint, Brembo brakes, Recaro seats, Borla exhaust, Fooze wheels, and a plaque affixed to the inside of the boot lid with Sir Stirling's signature. You just don't see one of these every day.... It is one cool car!

In my short tenure as a judge I've helped score a couple of 100.0 point cars, but these were mostly very highly restored XK 120s. A brand new Jaguar driven off of the showroom floor might be a 100.0 point car if, and only if, the dealer had a really good detailer with extraordinary attention to detail. When the other two judges, who were judging the exterior and engine bay, and I conferred after our inspection, we all said the same thing simultaneously..."I can't find a thing wrong here!" Everything was as new and there wasn't a speck of dirt to be found anywhere. Robert Silvestri's 1998 Meteorite Silver XK8 convertible was indeed a 100.0 point car. It was just as if it was on a Jaguar dealer's showroom floor twenty one years ago. Well done Robert!



Jaguar sports cars are supposed to be fun. When I look at Kevin Fitzgerald's 1969 E-Type OTS, I just think fun! While not authentic in the traditional Concours sense of the word, it is authentic fun! His beautiful blue E-Type has a number of very tasteful modifications that a young man, such as myself or Kevin, might have applied to an E-Type in the early seventies. In fact the same items, generally acquired out of an AMCO catalogue, graced my MGB in the day. Wire stone guards over the headlights, Stebro, Ansa or Abarth free-flow exhaust, Lucas fog lights, racing mirrors, wood rim Moto-lita steering wheel, wood or leather wrapped shift knob, these were the things we spent our money on to make our sports cars unique in the day. Kevin's blue Etype genuinely captures the feeling of that era; and the matching hard top is the cherry on the top. I just love that car for the feeling it evokes in me. Well Done Kevin!

The Concours on June 1st was really the climax of what was a "Jaguar Kind of Month". May was full of "Jaguar Kind of Days". For me it started with Bill Beible and me as guests, representing DVJC, on Steve Saffier's CarSmarts radio show. An opportunity to "Speak of Things Jaguar"? What better way to spend a Saturday morning. Bill and I showed up quite early with enough notes prepared to do a six hour monologue for a one hour show. As Steve led us up to the WIP studio on City Line Ave, he explained that this is live radio and we would only have a couple of minutes to get set up in the studio after the previous show exited. Steve also mentioned that one of the cast members of the previous show often brings his dog and can be a bit eccentric. Next up was the Annual Triumph / Jaguar Delaware River Scenic Drive from Yardley to Hellertown. Unfortunately I had a family conflict on that date and couldn't make it, but I understand both clubs were well represented and a good time was had by all. A Private Tour of the NB (Nicola Bulgari) Center in Allentown Thursday June 27, 2019

The NB Center is a 21 acre compound located on the site of a former drive-in movie theater; the screen is still there and is used regularly. The compound houses Mr. Bulgari's private collection of over 150 car, mostly American cars from the 30's and 40's. Among the collection are several cars that most of us have seen in the movies, such as the taxi from "It's a Wonderful Life". In addition to the collection there is perhaps the most comprehensive automobile restoration facility in the world. Each discipline of the restoration process has a separate building. Many of the same tools and machines that were used to originally build the cars have been restored and are in use restoring the cars. The full time staff, more than a dozen technicians, restores the cars as they were built with the same materials and craftsmanship regardless of cost. The Compound also houses the Historic Vehicle Association Laboratory. This is a rare opportunity to see a unique facility dedicated to the preservation of the automobile.
