
### All Aboard the Holiday Light Express

### **Speaking of Things Jaguar - October 2019**

### The X-100, Special Editions

Over the ten year run of the X-100 XK8/XKR a considerable number of special edition series were produced both by Jaguar and by private Jaguar specialty companies. It seems just when I think I am aware of them all, another one surfaces. I'll do my best here to cover them all, but if I miss one that you own or are aware of, please drop me a line and I'll be happy to profile it with as much info as I can gather.

### **XKR Silverstone**

With Jaguar's entry into Formula One racing in 2000, Jaguar decided to celebrate its return to the famed Silverstone circuit. Jaguar had seen many victories at Silverstone in the 50's and 60's. Silverstone is the historic track where the first British Grand Prix was held in 1948. For Jaguar, returning to the circuit with a Formula One team was indeed a cause for celebration. I think Jonathan Browning; Managing Director at the time positioned it best:

"The XKR Silverstone is a celebration not only of Jaguar's return to racing through Formula One, but of our long association with the world famous British circuit, scene of over twenty Jaguar racing victories. But above all, the XKR Silverstone, with its supercharged engine, finely tuned chassis and distinctive style, is a sports car for the true driving enthusiast".

In April of 2000, Jaguar announced the launch of 100 special edition XKR Silverstone models; half to be convertibles and half to be coupes. All were finished in Platinum Silver. The convertibles had black tops. Other than

the 20 inch Detroit R-Performance alloy wheels, the only exterior difference from standard XKRs were the unique bonnet and boot badges denoting "Silverstone" rather than "Supercharged".



The big 20 inch wheels gave the XKR Silverstone a menacing stance. The R-Performance handling package with Brembo brakes and CATS (Computer Active Technology Suspension) suspension gave it the road holding performance to match. The standard 4.0 liter supercharged V8 engine, putting out 370 hp, provided performance well aligned with the handling and looks. Entry to the cabin displayed special sill plates with a "Silverstone" inscrip-All XKR Silverstones sported Warm Charcoal leather interiors with contrasting red The red stitching was carried stitching. through to the carpet and leather sport steering wheel. The woodwork on the dash was gray smoke-stained bird's eye maple with the "Silverstone" insignia etched on the passenger side. In total 102 XKR Silverstones were built.

all were right-hand drive for the UK market. The price premium for the XKR Silverstone was about 10k GBP over list for the standard XKR.



Lucky buyers of the XKR Silverstone were invited to bring their cars to Silverstone on the final test day leading up to the British Grand Prix to watch Eddie Ervine and Johnny Herbert prepare their Jaguar Formula One race cars for the event.



It seems the colonies were not going to stand for a special edition Jaguar XKR being limited to the mother country. Demand from North America and the rest of the world was significant enough for Jaguar to announce and additional run of 500 XKR Silverstones. These were produced as 2001 models within the 2000 production run. While 500 were announced in "Phase 2", only 456 were actually built making a total of 558 XKR Silverstones produced. Recently an XKR Silverstones produced.

stone showed up on my favorite car site, Bring a Trailer, and it sold for \$19,000 which is about \$5000 over what standard XKRs of that vintage are trading for today.

### **XKR 100**

Commemorating the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of Sir William Lyons in 2001, Jaguar announced commemorative centenary editions of the XKR and XJR; the XKR 100 and XJR 100. Again, Jonathan Browning, Managing Director of Jaguar Cars Limited explains it best:

"The commemorative XJR 100 and XKR 100 embody traditions that Sir William Lyons himself established for the company right from its earliest days – a combination of performance, luxury and style that is unique to Jaguar. The XJR 100 and XKR 100 bring these traditions fully up-to-date, and with the inclusion of exciting new sports features from our evolving R Performance range, represent the ultimate road-going Jaguars for the driving enthusiast."



Available in both coupe and convertible, all XKR 100s were finished in Anthracite Black with 20 inch BBS Montreal wheels being the most distinctive exterior feature. A special bonnet badge in red, black and silver identifies each as being the XKR 100 special edition.



The standard 370 hp 4.0 supercharged V8 was complimented by Brembo brakes, CATS suspension and the full R-Performance Handling Pack.



Inside, the Recaro sports seats were finished in Warm Charcoal leather. Aluminum alloy surrounded the instruments and shift gate and the driver's feet found drilled aluminum pedals. Alloy commemorative plaques adorned the gray smoke-stained bird's eye maple dash. The leather wrapped Momo shift knob and sport steering wheel both carried the R-Performance logo. 500 examples of the XKR 100 were produced as 2002 models. The premium over the standard XKR was in the range 11,000-13,000 GBP. There is presently a nice example of an XKR 100 for sale at Valeurosport in Apex, NC for \$23,975. Valeurosport specializes in X-100 Jaguars and presently has four nice examples for sale.

#### **XKR 400**

In 2003 when the 4.2 liter V8 was introduced on the XK8/XKR, the supercharged version on the XKR made 400 hp. Hence the XKR 400 special edition. With the normally aspirated version making 300 hp, one might ask why not an XK8 300? Same thought occurred to me and I have no answer. It seems the UK dealers were the driving force behind this UK only special edition. I guess the premium price they were able to command on the XKR 100 left them wanting more. Anyway the XKR 400 sat on 20 inch BBS Montreal alloy wheels with bright red caliper Brembo brakes.





Most of the distinctive features were in the cabin. The leather and Alcantara seats were complimented by a leather R-Performance steering wheel, leather shift knob, chrome J-Gate surround and drilled aluminum pedals. The dash fascia was in piano black. Only 100 XKR 400s were produced as 2003/4 models; 60 coupes and 40 convertibles. Dealers were limited to five orders each. The list price premium on the XKR 400 was sig-

nificantly less than what the XKR 100 commanded; just 2-3k GBP. Of the one or two I have seen for sale in the UK over the past couple of years, they are now commanding about a 10k GBP premium over standard XKRs.

#### XKR Portfolio

As 2003 drew to a close, sales in North America were slumping and Jaguar decided to see if they could turn that around a bit with a special edition focused on that market. The Portfolio was available only as a convertible with the supercharged 4.2 engine. Aside from the 20 inch Detroit Alloy wheels, the Portfolio was distinguished on the outside by its two unique colors; Jupiter Red and Coronado Blue.





The interior, however, boasted many, less than subtle, features. The Recaro seats had exterior color matched center panels. That theme was also carried out on the door panels, shift knob and center console stitching. The upper and lower sections of the steering wheel that were normally fascia matched wood now boasted exterior color matched leather. The dashboard and J-gate surround

were finished in bronze stained Sapele wood.





Both the Jupiter Red and the Coronado Blue models were fitted with black tops. Two hundred Portfolios Editions were built; 100 in each color. All were sold as 2004 models. DVJC is fortunate that we can list one of these unique special edition Jaguars among our member cars.

### **Carbon Edition**

Jaguar introduced carbon fiber to X-100 in the Carbon Edition which was available exclusively in the UK. It was a fully loaded XKR, available in both coupe and convertible sporting a distinctive carbon fiber dashboard and J-gate surround. It was marketed as the "most well equipped" Jaguar ever (to date).

"Most well equipped" included a compass integrated in the rear view mirror, a dual band telephone, a first aid kit and a stand up warning triangle that was not to be interpreted as anticipating a breakdown. As if that wasn't enough to bring on buyers in droves, each buyer got a short holiday break in either Scotland or Dartmoor; fully paid by Jaguar! Production was limited to 100 lest the company be bankrupted by promotional lodging expenses.....



**Stirling Moss Edition** 

The Stirling Moss Edition is by far the most exclusive of all of the X-100 special editions. Only five were produced. Where many of the previous special edition cars only had subtle exterior clues to their exclusivity, the Stirling Moss Edition absolutely identifies itself immediately as a cat that is truly special. Finished in Jaguar racing livery of silver with double racing green stripes and red "Grand Sport" stripes adorning each of the wings, it is the most striking of the X-100 special editions. With 466.9 hp under the bonnet, Brembo brakes, Super-Sport suspension, 20 inch BBS Detroit wheels and a Borla exhaust system, the Stirling Moss Edition has the performance to back up the paint scheme. Inside the boot of each of the five is a small

plaque personally signed by Sir Stirling. As incredibly rare this edition is, DVJC was graced to have one on the field at our Concours last June. It was impressive indeed.





**Victory Edition** 

In March 2005 Jaguar announced another UK only special edition called the 4.2 S. In June they followed that with the Victory Edition for the US market. The cars are essentially the same except for the location of the steering wheel. The Victory Edition was to commemorate the fourth Trans Am Championship for the Jaguar XKRs of the Rocketsports racing team. Rocketsports campaigned the XKR in the Trans Am series on behalf of Jaguar. The Victory edition had a production run of 1050 cars. While the victory edition was mechanically a standard XK8/XKR, there were a number of significant features including growler badges incorporating a checkered flag emblem and special Victory Edition sill plates.





The XK8 Victory Edition models had 19 inch Atlas wheels as standard and the XKR version wore 20 inch split rim BBS Pereus wheels. Optional upgraded wheel selections were also available. The Victory Edition was available in all standard paint choices plus four colors unique to the Victory Edition;

Copper Black Metallic, Front Blue Metallic, Bay Blue Metallic and Satin Silver Metallic. Both models had darkened taillight clusters. Inside, the dashboard and trim were finished in Elm for the XK8 and carbon fiber with Elm as an option for the XKR. For the owners of the Victory Edition Jaguar produced a very attractive hardbound brochure. The cars were built with pretty much every optional feature that was in the catalogue. As well as being a fitting tribute to the racing success of the XKR in the Trans Am racing series, the Victory Edition was a very fitting tribute to one of the world's greatest looking and performing sports car GTs. The Victory Editions were the last of the X-100s to roll off of the assembly line at Brown's Lane.

As I explained at the beginning of this story, special edition X-100s were numerous and varied. I've captured for you all that I am aware of. There may be others out there and there were certainly a number of one-off specials built by both Jaguar and specialty shops. I may explore them in the future. Additionally I had planned to cover Trans Am racing and my perspective as an X-100 owner this month, but, given the number of special editions that were covered this month, those stories will wait until next month.



# Kennett Symphony's "The Classics at Brantwyn" Brunch, Blues, and Hot Cars A Fundraiser to Benefit the Kennett Symphony of Chester County

**DESCRIPTION:** The **Classics at Brantwyn** is an event centered on beautiful and historic automobiles from the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century to the present. It is not your typical car show – rather we like to describe it as a great social event and party that happens to have some magnificent automobiles on display. Held on the exquisite grounds of the Brantwyn Estate (formerly a DuPont family residence), the event features an open bar, gourmet brunch catered by the DuPont Country Club, and musical entertainment along with the magnificent cars.

MISSION: The Classics at Brantwyn was developed as a fundraiser for the Kennett Symphony of Chester County (KSCC) in order to ensure that the orchestra continues to achieve its mission of presenting symphonic music along with providing musical education and outreach programs in the community.

**EVENT DETAILS:** The event will be held on Sunday October 6, 2019 at the Brantywn Estate, 600 Rockland Road, Wilmington DE. The main event is preceded by an optional one-hour rally by the car show participants through the back roads of Chester County. A **Grand Parade** onto the Brantwyn grounds kicks off the main event at 11:00 am. Each car pauses in front of the mansion to be introduced to the guests who are sipping "Lamborghini Bellinis". The cars proceed to assigned spots in the garden at the rear of the mansion and remain on display while the guests enjoy brunch, drinks, and chatting with the car owners. Voting for "People's Choice" award concludes the event at 2:30 pm. This signature automobile event attracts more than 250 guests and car owners and has received rave reviews from both exotic and classic car owners.

**ENTERTAINMENT:** Prior to the Grand Parade, strolling musicians mingle with the crowd. The Terry Klinefelter Quartet entertains with upbeat jazz and blues selections during brunch and for the remainder of the afternoon.
