

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

Under a canopy of blue sky the Sports Car Vintage Racing Association (SVRA) presented the 1990 Grand Bahama Vintage Grand Prix which was held in Freeport/Lucaya, Grand Bahama Island January 7th through 14th. Just like the words to that popular song both the racing and the social opportunities were "hot, hot, hot".

A full schedule of activities were more than available. Between a beach party, a sock hop and the Bahama Motorsports Club Fall-Down things were cookin'. In between these official parties, and a few others more impromptu, there was actually some time for racing with group practice sessions, qualifying races and the feature races on Sunday, the 14th. A race car Concourse d'Elegance was held with the beautiful 1959 Jaguar XK150 owned by Bob O'Brien taking second place in the Vintage Production-Based class.

Also present and racing in Group 5 was a 1952 Jaguar XK120 driven by Graig Hinton, a 1959 XK150 driven by Bob O'Brien and a 1953 XK120 driven by George Veale.

Seriously, it was very informative and included a hands-on demonstration of their equipment which included a stitch welder and a MIG welder. Joe Johnston was in his element (no pun) when he picked up the welding electrode. He ran a welding bead smooth as silk with a surgeon's skill! A pity it wasn't a contest as he was the best by far!

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# Quick cat won't prowl U.S. roads

Jaguar sets production — but no U.S. export — of XJ220 supercar

ll hail the newest supercar! The Jaguar XJ220 has been approved for production. Initially, JaguarSport will build 220 cars in 1992, the car's first year, and hopes to eventually reach a production target of 350 annually. And the cost? A mere \$464,000.

JaguarSport has

responsible for the project.

However, the car will not be coming to the U.S. because Jaguar figures it can sell the limited volume of cars, like Porsche's 959, without having to face the seven-figure cost of developing the car to meet U.S. federal emission and safety legislation.

But left- and right-hand-drive versions will be homologated for all major European markets. And Japanese buyers, if they wish, will be able to personally import XJ220s. Jaguar started taking orders last week, together with deposit checks of \$75,000.

The decision not to sell the XJ220 in the U.S. is doubly disappointing. The production car will be much closer to the

October 1988. The 48-valve V12 engine has been replaced by a detuned version of the latest twin-turbocharged 3.5-liter V6 engine used this year in Europe in the XJR11 Group C race car.

formed a subsidiary called Project XJ220 Ltd., which will be On the track, the engine develops 1000 horsepower for qualifying and almost 800 hp in race trim. JaguarSport managing director Tom Walkinshaw mused that it will be much tougher to develop the racing V6 at a catalyst-equipped 500 hp for the street than to produce 1000 hp in race-qualifying trim. The engine will develop 472 lb ft of torque at 5000 rpm.

Top speed will be more than 200 mph-drag coefficient is an impressive 0.32 g. Zero-to-60 mph time is claimed to be four seconds, with standstill-to-100 mph taking only eight seconds.

The car, again like the F40, will be rear-wheel drive, not fourwheel drive as originally thought. The suspension is a four-corner double-wishbone arrangement like the Group C car and the steering

In order to preserve the chrome plating on wire wheel knock-offs, do not use any hammer whether lead, rawhide or copper directly on the knock-off. Instead, place a piece of oak wood (1" X 1" X 12") against the wing and then strike the wood with the hammer. Do not use pine or other soft woods as it will either splinter or compress without loosening the knock-off.

Now that colder weather is setting in, make sure that you check the air pressure in your tires. Remember, colder weather will make the air contract inside your tire and therefore exert less pressure. Add appropriate volume of compressed air to bring the reading up to specs.

Cold weather also means time to check the anti-freeze. Almost everyone is aware that anti-freeze protects against freeze-ups, but it also contains rust inhibitors. of course, do not want rust in our cooling systems, as in the summer time it will add to our coolant woes. Change the antifreeze at least every two years using a 50-50 mixture of anti-freeze and water (do not use pure anti-freeze as ethylene glycol is a poor conductor of heat. Its main purpose is to lower the freezing point and raise the boiling point of water). alternative to changing the anit-freeze is to add a rust inhibiting solution. but do this only once.
