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


And after months of heavy work,

For now I owned a Jag-n-ar.



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

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TECH TIPS

- 1. Don't forget to lube universal joint bearings in the drive shafts and the 1/2 shafts of cars with independent rear suspension.
- 2. If you run your fingernail over the surface of a disc brake rotor and your nail catches on a groove(s), the rotor should be re-surfaced.
- 3. Always re-surface both front rotors equally. If not, the thinner rotor will heat up quicker due to less mass and therefore fade sooner, possibly causing the car to pull to the side with the thicker rotor. For the same reason, don't cut the rotors thinner than specs as braking distance will increase.


