We offer our congratulations to Jack and his wife Bernice who has supported Jack through the years and consistently demonstrated her own devotion to Jaguar.

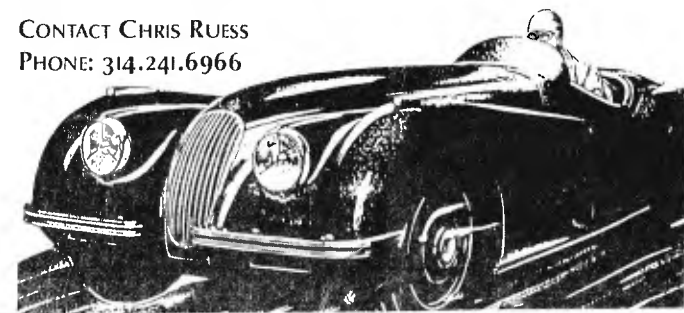
