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



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
In order to achieve a very durable paint finish on small parts, apply epoxy spray paint and then bake in an oven at 300 degrees for about 15-20 minutes. I personally have used a small electric oven with a timer and have produced excellent results. Allow the parts to cool slowly.

The Problem: Owning wire wheels! Grease and dirt accumulate at the hub and on the lower part of the spokes. Centrifugal force causes the grease inside the hub to migrate through the spoke holes and up the spokes. Once this happens, dust and dirt stick on the grease, creating a tough cleaning job. What to do? Eliminate grease from accumulating on the spokes as follows: With the wheels off the car, remove excess grease from inside the hub using a paper towel or rag. Now clean the inside diameters of the hub where the spokes come thru using a petroleum based degreaser (Prep-Sol) and a paint brush. No need to clean the greasy spline area, only the heads of the spokes and the adjacent area. After allowing the area to dry thoroughly, apply silicone with your finger, spreading all around the hub I.D. A thin rubber seal will now form, isolating the greasy area from the spokes. When the silicone is cured, regrease the splines, replace the wheels, and drive as fast as you wish, without accumulating the usual mess!
