Tip-Top-Tech Tips

For those Jaguar owners with newer cars here is a very important tip that may save you a lot of aggravation and some money. Never, never, never spray silicone lubricant on any components in the engine compartment. The slightest amount of silicone will permanently damage any oxygen sensors in the engine compartment. Instead use an oil-based spray lubricant such as WD-40 to lubricate throttle linkage. This tip pertains to any car with oxygen sensors.

Here's a handy tip to clean up oil or transmission fluid spills. Sprinkle some Portland cement on to the spill. It will immediately begin to absorb the fluid and the cement will darken as the process continues. Ad more cement as necessary. Sweep up the used cement and dispose of it. Don't worry, the cement will not harden.


