REASONS TO CELEBRATE

So it is 2001. The 36th anniversary of the formation of our club. And for those of you who attended our December party you had the the pleasure of meeting the DVJC 's founding President Frank Weikle. How wonderful that he is still interested and attends our club function. Also just think how many Jags have grown old and valuable in that time and all because of people like Frank , all around the world, who recognized the beauty of the beast and saw there was a need to preserve and cherish each one.

It is not only our anniversary. We can also celebrate the 100th anniversary of Sir William Lyon's birth, the 70th anniversary of the launch of the SS, the 50th anniversary of the win at Le Mans by the "C type", the 40th anniversary of the launch of the Series 1 XK-E and the 30th anniversary of the launch of the Series III XK-E. We therefore have every reason to make this a banner year.

To help us achieve that Jaguar Clubs Of North America (JCNA) has announced the 2001 Challenge Championship and Annual General Meeting to be held in Franklin, Tennessee July 24 - 28. Franklin is a small civil war town just South of Nashville.

In attendance will be both the current and the recently retired Presidents of Jaguar Inc, Norman Dewis who was the chief test engineer for Jaguar Ltd. until 1985 and a number of other noteworthy Jaguar people. Have you noticed that there are a lot more Jaguars on the roads these days?? At one time you had an occasional sighting but now it is a regular occurrence. In mid December I went to the theatre in Philly and as I passed City Hall there were two S-Types parked in line and just round the corner in Broad Street was another plus an XJ8. When we came out of the theatre there was another XJ8 siting in the middle of Broad Street waiting to pick someone up. Next day at my Post Office there were two identical XJR's parked side by side.

And the Company has been winning some major awards to confirm this success. At the Manufacturing Industry Achievement awards, held at the Grosvenor Hotel in London, England they were awarded the Exporter of the Year award. Also they won the coveted Manufacturing EXCELLENCE Award which was awarded for their QUALITY improvements at their Castle Bromwich and Brown's Lane plants.

Earlier this year Jaguar won the Queen's Award for exports but more importantly they won the US based J. D. Power Gold Award putting them on top for reliability!!

All this is wonderful and is reflected in results. "Classic Jaguar World" magazine reports that statistics show that Jaguar is one of the fastest growing brands. Sales in North America were up 35% Jan—Nov, a record 35,039 cars. The S-type was the leading model with 20,435. In Europe, an estimated 46,275 S-types were sold and it is great news that the XJ range is holding its own with some 18,825 sold in comparison to 18096 during the Jan – Nov period in 1999.

Also the Jaguar Racing Website has beaten all –comers to be named "Best Sports On-line Site" at the world-recognised EMMA awards. The wwwjaguar-racing.com site was voted top by 40 judges who said it was a "stylish and slick site with good use of design and technology with extensive information"

Jaguar says that 88 million hits have been registered with more than 60,000 signing up as members of Jaguars virtual worldwide club. In the "Events Calendar" you will see I have included this years Formulae 1 agenda so you can watch the races and support Jaguar on Speedvision. This year they must be up front challenging for the leading positions.

The Formulae 1 season starts in Australia on March 4

COKE THERAPY

Tip Top Tech Tips

I have owned my beautiful 1948 Jaguar MK IV Drop Head Coupe for about twelve years now; enjoying every minute of it. My garage is full of trophies won by this wonderful auto; a tribute to the late Sir William Lyons whose cars were the most classic of their times. The car has been virtually trouble free since I restored it. It had belonged to Babe Paley, wife of William Paley, founder and president of Columbia Broadcasting System. When Babe, a prominent society person reputed to be one of the best dressed women of her time, passed away, she left this beautiful auto to her secretary who could not drive it. So her secretary had it flat bedded to her retirement farm in lowa, where it was put into a barn on a dirt floor without a cover. There it sat until her death, at which time I purchased it from her estate.


Of course, it needed total restoration, but it was all there and with only 29,000 miles on the odometer. After two years I had restored it to its original grandeur, and it has since been a joy to behold; fun to drive and the winner (usually first place) at such prestigious shows as the New Hope Auto Show, the all British auto show at Greame Park, the Jaguar Driver's Club of L.I. concours and recently as the poster car for the Buckingham Concours D'Elegance at

Just recently the car started to run hot. After a trip it would sound like a coffee maker boiling, spitting water out of the radiator ornament with temperatures climbing to 110 C; much too hot for that or any car. My mechanic and I tried everything. I called my good friend Tom at British Auto U.S.A. to see if he had any ideas and he suggested I call club member Bob Brosen from whom I had gotten parts during restoration, to see if he had a new water pump. Bob had one, but he said it was expensive. Instead he told me how to make an inex-

pensive American one work, by fastening it to the housing with stainless steel screws, a great and inexpensive way to replace the pump (it's this kind of help we get from fellow members that makes this club so worthwhile). So you can see that we do have a network of great people in this organization always ready to help.

Finally, after two flushes with the strongest flush I could find (remembering, as Tom had told me, that today's flushes are made for aluminum engines and probably are not strong enough to clean out a fifty one year old push rod). Still nothing helped, and in desperation we took out all the hoses and cleaned them out (Not too clean after so many years). After we back flushed it was a little better, but still not good enough. We even got a new set of freeze plugs and thought we might take out the old ones, clean her out with a wire hanger, but never got to that because my mechanic and friend Ralph Tompkins asked me if I had the guts to take a chance on something he was told by the mechanic he learned from. I said I would try anything to fix my baby especially if it meant we would not have to pull the engine. He said he felt it was sludge and dirt in the block that was not letting the

cooling water pass through. We took, out the petcock and even then the flow was very slow and almost stopped at times. He said do you have Coca-Cola or Pepsi-Cola. I replied that I did and he said let's put it in the cooling system and run it awhile. I was shocked, but also desperate so I agreed. We put three cans in filled it with water and ran it for a long time. I then took it for a drive and the temperature never went above 70 degrees Centigrade. We were elated and we let the Coke sit in the system for a couple of days then we flushed it out and back flushed again. You would not believe the dirt that came out, and now when we took of the petcock at the block, it gushed out like a waterfall. We then put everything

back, filled it with fresh fluid, a can of Gunk water pump lubricant and rust inhibitor and a bottle of Water Wetter which I got from British Auto, and drove her again on a hot summer day and she never went higher than 70 degrees Centigrade. It was all over and the car ran as nice as she always had, and all it cost was less than \$2 bucks and a couple of long distance calls to Bob Brosen and British Auto. Those are the kind of repairs we all love, so if you should experience the same problem in your Jag, try Old Dr. Pincus' inexpensive remedy for what ails her, a little Coke Therapy can go a long way. For those of us that love Coke. did you ever wonder what it's doing to the lining of your stomach?
