



I went through the new membership list and found we had 99 E-Types. I'm sure if I did it again it would be over 100! There are 45 roadsters, 33 coupes and 2+ 2's and 11 were not specified. In total the club has registered 245 Jaguars. There are 23 XJS's, 32 XJ6/12 &C, 4 XK8, 9 XK120 Roadsters, 7 DHC's, 3FHC for a total of 19 XK120's There are 8 XK140 roadsters. 6 DHC & 4 FHC's for a total of 18 and 8 XK150's 1 being a FHC and the rest OTS. There are 13 MK2's and 1 Mk1, 2 XJ8's, 3XJR's, 3 2000 S -types. Then there is 1 MK1V, 3 MKV's, 1 MK V1, 1 MkV111, 5 MK 1X, 2 MK X and 3 420's. Finally there are 3 SS100's and 1 SS Tourer. I am sure there are more cars not listed by members. The point however is we know we have all the above cars so lets see them at the concours. If you don't want to drive your car then you should have purchased a painting of one and stuck it on the wall!

- Michael Smyth, President of Great Britains, has kindly invited us to a visit at his Willow Grove facilities on Saturday November 3<sup>rd</sup> The session will include a talk on how to winterize and properly store your car plus how to take care and protect your paint work. There will also be a discussion on anti-lock brakes and their use. We will also be able to see all the new cars.
- Two years ago in early May Paul Racette and I set out as complete novices to take part in the "Rally Round the Holly" starting from Millville. Paul was the Navigator (the more difficult job) and I was the driver. We spent two great days touring the wonderful countryside, enjoying the fine weather and food. We actually won a prize. Last year we went again. Same great countryside and food. We did not win a prize but really had a ball. We took my E-type and two weeks later this car was in the Concours and took second place in its class to a trailer queen with a score of 98.8 We are off again this coming May 4,5,6 and I do urge members to come and enjoy the fun. Its not difficult and your car will not suffer and can be soon spruced up for the Concours.
- There was a good crowd at the tech session at Cloverleaf Auto on March 31. After some interesting car talk, food and drinking of a keg there was an auction of parts, books and magazines. I picked up a pile of 1950 magazines for \$20. One magazine dated July 1955 has a new car price list. For Jaguar it says MKV11 L1616, XK140 L1598, D-Type L3663!! The exchange rate was probably \$3 to the pound so you could have a D-Type for around \$10,000 now worth a \$million. Just as interesting were the adverts for used cars. Lots of MKV11's & XK120's for sale at L 800. But the advert that really caught my eye was this "1937 SS100. 21/2 litre, excellent mechanical condition, full weather equipment, spot lamp, twin aeros L245 or say \$750!!!! Also not a Jaguar but not bad.... there was a 33hp coupe Bugatti for L275 or about \$800. Now if I had bought the new D Type, a used XK120, an SS100 and a Bugatti for a total cost of \$12,350 where would I be What was my Mother thinking about when all she told me was to "pull my shoulders

back, eat with my mouth shut, say thank you and keep away from girls" When she could have said "invest in those cars"

Jaguar collectibles

A major subject in the world of Jaguar is the collecting of Jaguar related items. Those of you who went on the Fall Foliage tour on October 15 2000 and visited the home of Al Pincus not only saw his wonderful collection of cars but also his display of brochures, newspaper cuttings, awards, posters, models, badges and mascots. All these make up the collecting hobby

My own particular weakness is Jaguar models which is a massive subject all on its own. Simply put for every Jaguar ever manufactured a model has also been created. Not just once but by many manufacturers and not only in standard form but in every color and in a multiplicity of racing formats. So it is very possible to have a display of every Jaguar made, every race winner, every variant. This is why, over the years, I have accumulated over 800 different models

These models are made in a variety of materials including tin, glass, metal, plastic, wood, copper, silver, pottery etc and range from toys costing a few cents to detailed sophisticated creations costing hundreds of dollars. Especially interesting are the toys that were made at the time of the original cars release. An example of this would be the Dinky toys that were released at the time of the XK 120 in the fifties. Sold then for a few cents in good condition they now bring about \$200 if they are with the original box. The original box adds about 50% to the price

For those of you who want to learn more about the subject there is an excellent book called "Jaguar Collectibles" written by Ian Cooling. This book is the definitive history of everything to do with Jaguar except for the cars themselves including descriptions and photos of the many Jaguar models available It would make a good gift and I have seen a copy at Borders but you may have to order it

Also for those interested in Model Collecting only there is a club based in the UK which has a few hundred members. 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
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### KIT'S KITTY

I have the pleasure of being married to a Jaguar car nut. Over the years Paul has painstakingly restored an E type series 1 and a Mark II . My favorite Jaguar model has always been the XK120 drop head so when my brother in law Norm found one in Ottawa I was willing to consider adding it to our collection. Photos and videos were sent and after due consideration it was decided that it was worth the ten hour drive up there to have a look. We arrived at the garage and gave the car a careful look over. It was

largely original although in the 70s the upholstery had been covered with vinyl and the top had been replaced with the same material and it was looking tatty. The numbers however all matched and it ran. A deal was made!! Although the car had only been driven a short distance over the past 10 years, Paul drove it 100 miles to his brother's house in Montreal without incident. It was then loaded onto a dolly and towed back to our garage in Spring House. Going through customs proved to be more costly than we had anticipated. We had calculated that we were importing a car from Canada and therefore under NAFTA no duty was required. Wrong!!! The car was made in England and therefore dutiable but given our allowances and the price of the car the damage was not excessive and the customs agents were all appreciative of the car.

Once home Paul wasted no time gutting the car into a better condition. The paint was original but very oxidized and it looked black. After extensive polishing the true color showed through - British Racing green and good enough that re-painting was not necessary. The wood was stripped and re-varnished and the upholstery redone in suede green leather. The chrome was pitted but given its originality Paul decided to keep it and simply give it a good polish. The top proved to be a more complex problem. He had never redone a top and they are very complicated and he could not find any one local to do the pin-beading. We decided to put the car back on the dolly and take it to Bassetts in Wyoming, Rhode Island who specialize in upholstery.

Along with our editor Mike Tate, we had an uneventful trip up the I-95 to within 100 miles of our destination. Suddenly the dolly plus car began to fishtail and pull on the tow car. The right retention chain snapped and then the left spinning the dolly and car 180 degrees in the middle of the I-95. The car finally came to rest with the right back corner hard up against the concrete divider! It was the longest 8 seconds we have ever experienced !!!! It turned out that the ball had gradually worked its way off the trailer hitch. To cut a long story short, the dolly and car were put on a flat bed and taken to Bassetts. What a sad sight that was!! But like all such stories, it has turned out very well. The only rust in the car was in the damaged back right corner and therefore the repaired car is now rust-free!! Once insurance

problems had been sorted out Bassetts undertook to repair the damage and respray the car, as well as installing the top, complete with pinbeading.

Six months later we were back in Wyoming delighted to pick up a re-painted XK120 with a beautiful new top - thanks Bill Bassett - and bring it home on the repaired dolly. Needless to say we checked the trailer ball frequently on our drive back home!

Since then we have taken great pleasure in driving the XK120 on sunny days and taking it to car shows. It has become my pride and joy.

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
