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





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


Why Some of us Do not make the Delaware Valley Jaguar Car Show!

FORD MANAGEMENT

It was good to see ex Jaguar Chairman Sir Nick Scheele, who is now Ford President, present a check (British spelling is cheque) for 900K to Pistol Pete Sampras after his win in the US open. He still has a ready smile and a no nonsense approach....I suppose that applies to both Sir Nick and Pistol Pete! Philip Porter writes in the "Jaguar Driver" clubs magazine "Like many, it seems, I did not shed a single tear at the departure of Dr. Wolfgang Reitzle. I was fascinated to read a very out-spoken piece by Mike Rutherford in the Daily Telegraph (a top British newspaper). He accused him of being a jumped—up, arrogant, thoroughly objectionable man who was superfluous to requirements at Ford. (Editor I wish he would be more direct and stop beating about the bush!) Rutherford went on to criticize Reitzle for setting up his HQ in Berkley Square "month after month, Ford has been losing an average of \$9 million a day. Meanwhile Reitzle and his ego set up shop on one of the most expensive pieces of land on the planet". In another part of the same newspaper Porter says "Push came to shove when Reitzle demanded that he should report directly to Ford Chairman Bill Ford rather than Nick Scheele, with whom he didn't get on. "A request like that requires a very small mind and almost certainly numbers your days of employment if I remember rightly!!

RELEASE OF THE 2004 LONGER, TALLER, WIDER, LIGHTER XJ

The 2004 XJ (we showed you a photo in the last issue) was released at the Paris motor show on September 26th to rave reviews. The press was ecstatic saying that this was the best thing that Jaguar had ever done and BMW and Mercedes will have to think again! It is the seventh generation of Jaguar's flagship sedan.

More than 800,000 XJ's have been sold worldwide which accounts for over half of all Jaguars made. Similar in looks to the outgoing range it takes a cue from the Series 1 having the inner headlight smaller than the outside light. The car is 4 inches taller, 4 inches longer and because of the extensive use of aluminum is 440 pounds lighter than the outgoing model. The interior is flush with wood, leather and all new switchgear. The car comes as XJ8 and XJR. The former is powered by a 4.2- liter V8 developing 294 horsepower and the" R" uses a supercharged version of the same engine producing 390 horsepower. The car goes on sale in Europe early next year and in the US by mid-year.

JAGUAR RACING

Well, Sir Nick Scheele's ultimatum to Jaguar Racing seems to have had the desired result. In the F1 race at Monza, Italy on September 15 Jaguars two entries qualified well, got a good start and were part of the action throughout the race. Pedro de la Rosa went out near the end with broken suspension after another competitor clearly side swiped his car. Then the great news as Eddie Irvine followed the Ferraris home in third place and a podium appearance. Eddie had qualified 5th so it was an all round great effort for Jaguar and perhaps gives them some breathing space to continue the improvements to their cars.

PEBBLE BEACH WINNERS

At the 52nd Pebble Beach Concours in August there was a special exhibition of Jaguar race cars which were featured in a special class. This was Class Q. First was a 1955 D Type "Short Nose" from the Cavallino Collection, Seatle, Wash. Second the Robert Peterson, Los Angeles 1956 XK SS and third the Hans Rausing, East Sussex, England 1963 E Type Lightweight. In total about \$3 million in value I would imagine!

THE BUCKINGHAM CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE

Despite being postponed from September 15 to the 22nd because of bad weather the Buckingham Show was again an outstanding success. Held to benefit the Buckingham Land Preservation Fund in the ideal surroundings of Holicong Park, the show attracted over 230 of the highest quality automobiles and an appreciative crowd of visitors. The day started out with a full breakfast served under cover in a large marquee (Mimosa, Scrambled egg, bacon & sausage) which alone is a good reason to get up early on a Sunday morning and drive that top car. Despite warnings of showers the weather turned out to be glorious getting warmer and warmer as the day progressed. Every type of manufacturer was represented from Bentley to Rolls Royce, Cord to Ford, MG to Austin Healey, Triumph to Packard, Pierce Arrow to Studebaker, Jensen to Mercedes, BMW to Bizarrini etc etc and of course Jaguar. Twelve very assorted cars represented our favorite manufacturer. There was Paul Maletsky with his low mileage and special XJS – C, Adam Hepburn had his 1973 XJ 12 and Charles Olson his 1987 XJ 6. It was good to see George Carr, despite his illness, make the effort together with wife Doris to bring their 1958 XK 150 Coupe (They also had a very nice MGA at the show). William Simpson brought his beautifully prepared 1953 XK 120 Coupe And Gary King his 1959 Mk 1X. I was there with my 1934 SS 1 Tourer. Paul Racette's XK 120 developed a malady during the week and he was reduced to bringing his and Kit's 1989 Bentley Mulsanne as substitute!! Tough.

For judging they broke us into two groups. All the above cars in group 1 and in group 2 the five E-Types in attendance. These were Ed Dean's 1969 Coupe, Jill Powell's 1967 OTS, Patrick Petrillo's 1972 Series 3 OTS, Robert Steig's 1970 Coupe and Bruce Langevin's 1972 2+2 Series 3. Prize winners were: Best Jaguar Will Simpson's XK120 Coupe. Best E-Type Patrick Petrillo's 1972 Series 3 OTS. First in Class Group 1 above my 1934 SS1 Tourer. It was a great day in great surroundings. Congratulations to Al Pincus and the rest of the organizing team!

AUCTIONS

There were a number of cars out there that I thought got good bids but the owners would not sell. Examples were a 1954 XK 120 Roadster in white with red leather. Recently restored. Bid to \$35,000 at which it was believed to be underprized. A XK 150 Roadster Imperial maroon & black leather. 50,000 miles. Car was nice but not spectacular Was bid to \$52,000 but remained unsold. This was not an "S" and I would have thought 52K was a good price. A 1961 XKE 3.8 S1 Convertible. Dark blue with

tan leather. 9,761 miles. A really nice car that got a high bid of \$80,000 but remained unsold.! Many cars did sell though. A XK 150 Fixed Head Coupe in white with red leather. Automatic. poor door and trunk fit. It sold at \$22,000. A 1984 XJS Coupe. BRG with tan leather. 60,932miles. Good interior, paint, & chrome. These cars will be the next classics. Sold for \$8,305. Now here is one for the record books. A 1960 XK 150 Drophead Coupe. Red with tan leather. 87,583 miles. Automatic. Close to a 100 pointer. Sold for \$121,000 which is amazing for an automatic non "S" XK 150 DHC

In the September edition of the UK magazine "Classic Cars" under the headline "Club Class" there was an interesting article on car clubs. Some interesting comments are "Owning a classic car might have started as a flight of fancy, but when you need a shoulder to cry on where can you turn? Amazingly they say "There are over 400 Clubs, Societies and Registers dedicated to ownership and preservation of every type of every vehicle imaginable. If its got wheels someone will love it" Of these 400 clubs the MG Owners Club is the largest but the Jaguar Enthusiasts Club is second with membership at 20,000 and it has long since outgrown its parent ... The Jaguar Drivers Club. They continue to say that "These days to get people involved in all the usual club activities is difficult so we try and provide something for everyone on the basis you only get 10% of any one organization doing any one thing so if we can provide lots of 10% then there is a chance of keeping most people happy. I would comment that this applies to DVJC. "Many people join clubs to find parts, advice and have a shoulder to cry on in the midst of a restoration" Our "Technical Advice Forum" which is announced elsewhere in this issue will help club members who need this type of advice. Another interesting comment is "Perhaps surprisingly the dominant car in the Jaguar Enthusiast Club is the XJ-S. It's the car of the moment. In fact 60% of their members have a Jaguar which is 1980 or newer. If you think about it, it's the car the current generation grew up lusting after and now they are affordable" So there is something to think about because the article goes on to say that a lot of clubs are struggling with the older models because the younger interest is not there. The moral for us is that we must encourage those owners of the current Jaguar range to join and participate in our club

Jaguar publish an internal quarterly magazine for employees called "ROAR." In the current edition there is an article outlining the benefits of Dealerships encouraging relationships with local Jaguar Clubs. Obviously retailers want to sell new cars and do club members buy new cars is the question. "Absolutely, club members do buy cars. They also have friends and relatives they send in. The relationship with clubs is a win-win when it comes to revenue, sales and service" says manager Phil Blake. As part of this article there is a two page spread of our club's E-Types that took part in The Northeast Old Car Rally with a description of the race under the headline "Delaware Valley Jaguar Club steers The Great Britains in the right direction" Fame at last!






