From all of the directors that attended, "THANKS JOE" for the wonderful Hospitality!!

# Roving Reporter By Michael Tate February 2006

#### Great Britain's Growing – Growing – Growing -

I had the great pleasure of meeting with Michael Smyth, President of the Great Britain's Jaguar and Land Rover Group the week of January 30<sup>th</sup>. Michael is very bullish on Jaguar. So bullish that he has expanded his staff at the dealership in Willow Grove by appointing a General Manager, Tom Burton and bringing back long time employee Bill Marshall. Both of these gentlemen worked for the Mercedes Benz dealership in Doylestown. Bill Marshall actually worked for Great Britain's for 18 years before being tempted away by the Mercedes dealer. He feels good to be back in the Jaguar fold again. I purchased most of my various Jags from Bill but he missed out on my XJ 8 purchase last year. It is good to see him back.

#### **Philpenn Purchased**

The really big news, however, is that the Group is expanding its operations on the Main Line. They already operate Main Line Land Rover (800 sold last year) and have now acquired the established Jaguar dealership of Philpenn. Competitive sealed bids were made to secure the dealership but any winning bid had to be approved by Jaguar. Great Britain's came out on top. Their approach to this new venture is to show the Main Line public they are there with two famous and fine brands and they are housing them in premises worthy of their names. This new 34,000 sq ft facility is being built in Wayne on Lancaster Avenue (Route 30) close to Acme. A rendering of the new premises is shown in this Purr. "Is it not a credit to the brands?" Michael Smyth says, "It is in a great location and is designed to fit in the local scene with local stone facings. I expect it to be very successful. The reliability of the current cars is just awesome. I would argue with anyone that the current cars are the best that Jaguar has ever built".

A major construction decision is to put the 22,000 sq ft Service and Parts operation below ground. It is expected that the operation will employ 60 people and will open for business for service in early May and the remainder will open in July. Michael Smyth is really excited about the opportunity and will come to speak to us about it at the Desmond on March 19 .We look forward to this visit with great anticipation and to Great Britain's successful future.

#### AutoWeek February 6

This edition of AutoWeek has the photos of two cars on its cover with the headline "Topless Beauties....Two Convertibles To Make Anyone Look Good". One car is the Cadillac XLR-V and the second is the Jaguar XK. Inside the magazine two pages are devoted to each car. Lots of very good things are said in favor of each one. The Jaguar has the traditional swooping lines whereas the Cadillac looks rather square. The General Motors car's price starts at \$100,000. The Jaguar Convertible will be \$81,500 and the Coupe is \$75,500 (i.e. the price of a good XK 150S!)

The magazine also states "Healey Returns". "The classic Healey sports car will make a comeback this year as an open-top two-seater in the mold of the 3000, famous for its rallying exploits in the 1950's. The revival was sparked by the sale of the Healey name by the family of founder Donald Healey to British classic sports car builder HFI.

U.S, sales are possible by 2008, following a European debut in 2007. A prototype, with a steel space-frame chassis, composite body and powered by a Volvo inline-six, which already exists. An entry-level Sprite two-seater is also part of the plan.

#### Bibiana Boerio

My correspondent, PGT, in England recently sent me a half page interview from "The Daily Telegraph" with Bibiana Boerio the first female Managing Director of Jaguar Cars. She was appointed to this position in July 2004. Not only that but I was amazed to read that she is one of our own. She was born March 17, 1954 in Latrobe, Pennsylvania. She also was educated here in PA. She has a degree in textiles and design at Seton Hill University, Greensburg PA, and an MBA, Pittsburgh Graduate School of Business.

She has had an interesting career in the car industry joining Ford Motor finance staff in 1976. In 1986 she became programming manager and in 1987 became regional marketing manager. It was in 1995 that she had her first spell at Jaguar as finance director and then in 2000 became executive vice –president of Ford Credit. Referring to the new XK she says, "It is an outstanding combination of glamour, sophistication, style and great performance and technology which Jaguar does better than anyone else. It is the essence of new-fashioned luxury. Oh, and when you push the accelerator down, it knocks your socks off." She sounds my kind of girl. Gorgeous!
