

We really struck it rich this month in the Jaguar Journal. Fred Mack also made the front page in his XK120. On page 7, my contribution of the Great Race Route was published. On page 9, members Ralph Steinberg and Wife Candy Stephani stand by with the orange XK120. Charlie Olson, V.P. contributed the JCJOC article on Page 22 and Mike Tate contributed the two-page article on now famous Fred Mack M.E. on pages 44 & 45. Also, six JCNA sanctioned events for DVJC appear on the last page, thanks to Kit Racette. It was a good month for DVJC in our Journal.



Anniversary of the SS

It is exactly 75 years since William Lyons introduced the "SS" line of fine automobiles. It was 1931 and up to the time Swallow Coachbuilding Company had manufactured bodies, which were placed on other manufacturer's chassis without the distinctive "SS". In "The Motor" for October 20, 1931 the following appeared: "Swallow Coachbuilding Co.... This concern exhibits four examples of their bodywork on popular British chassis. A very attractive model is a two-seater sport Wolseley Hornet with polished mahogany interior fittings and a neatly contoured hood with rigid side screens. The price is Pounds 225. The "SS" Standard chassis are shown with sports coupe bodywork. These are particularly attractive cars with specially low chassis and long bonnets with radiators of outstanding design. The Little Nine coupe sells at pounds 198 and the 16 h.p. car at pounds 298. The other exhibit is a two-door four seater sports saloon on the Austin Seven chassis, the price of which is pounds 165 ---Holbrook Lane, Coventry". So began the story. "SS" became "SS Cars" which became "SS Jaguar" which, after the war, became "Jaguar", what a wonderful Cat. Sometimes nearly extinct but still roaming the world.

Gang Played Dodgems with Collector's Jaguars

I received various reports early in March from Kit Racette, our correspondent in the UK...PGT and my trusted computer that a gang of young vandals had destroyed a collection of Jaguars. Reports say that sixty cars have been wrecked by teenagers playing "dodgems". The gang broke into a warehouse and hotwired the cars, then smashed into each other.

The report continues that staff arrived the next morning to find a heap of twisted metal. It was the most valuable private collection of Jaguars in Europe and six were to have been used for Queen Elizabeth's 80th birthday celebrations in April.

The owner, James Hull, was "devastated" at the damage at an industrial park in Newport, South Wales. He said, "Some are irreplaceable, part of motoring history". Mr. Hull, a 46-year old dentist started collecting Jaguars in 1979. Some were more than 70 years old and he was planning to open a motoring museum. As yet there has been no further detail of the exact cars destroyed. However I did see a photo and did pick out a MK 2, an early SS and an XK8.

It is said that the police are questioning some 16 year olds. So what's the problem with these youths? In the UK, they smash up Jaguars and in the USA they set light to churches. Perhaps we should bring back conscription. In my days we had to do 2 years in the armed forces. That gets rid of any misdirected energy!

Jaguar As An Investment (and Lots of Fun)

The magazine "Sports Car Market" publishes an annual "Pocket Price Guide. In this they provide 1,000 up-to-date prices. I recently received my copy. Besides showing prices they also indicate a 5 star investment rating and a 1 year % change in price. So let's see how Jaguar has done: Listed also are 36 cars to watch in 2006. There is only one-Jiaguar listed (\$45,000-\$70,000), the 1956 XK 140 DHC. They say "The XK 140 offers a few more inches of leg room over the 120, so if you are close to six feet tall you can fit in the cockpit. The closed styling grows on you and you can be on the road for a whole lot less money. Look for over heating and normal Jaguar leaks and fluid puddles before writing the check".





In 1922, young motorcyclist Bill Lyons joined sidecar builder William Walmsley to form the Swallow Sidecar Company in Blackpool, England. Their stylish, distinctive aluminum sidecars proved popular.

In 1927, the Swallow Sidecar and Coachbuilding Company was born. At the 1931 London Motor Show Lyons entered the market with cars of his own with long, low styling and leather and wood interiors that would become Lyons' trademark.

The company name changed to SS Cars Ltd in 1933 when Swallow cars stopped production. In 1935, Lyons introduced the SS Jaguar 100 as the first to bear the Jaguar name which he chose because it suggested power and elegance.

The company introduced a new Jaguar saloon in 1948, the Mark V and a new sports car, the Jaguar XK120, Named for its top speed, it was the fastest production automobile of its day.

In 1954 Jaguar incorporated a company in New York and began exporting cars to the United States.
