## OUR AGM (ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING) EXPERIENCE

Charlie Olson and I met at the Philadelphia International Airport about 3:30 for our flight, which Charlie had arranged. We had a good flight lasting 6 hours. We were in the hotel in Seattle by 11:30, thanks to Charlie's son Chuck. Chuck lives and works with his family there, at Boeing Aircraft.

The hotel was about 8 floors with a clear atrium type roof over a large open center section surrounded by balconies overlooking the middle. On Friday we attended two seminars, one of which dealt with the Series 1.25 and 1.5 67 - 68 Jaguar E-type. These details are available for printing on the Internet and were "officially" approved by the AGM for use in 2006. Anyone may copy this work, which must have taken years of research to complete. It is a judge's guide to be referred to if necessary by judges for authenticity questions and answers and in particular people restoring the E-type Jaguar. I must admit I had a different version of what 1.5 was and now it is clearer by the addition of the 1.25 category. We also attended a seminar on carburetor tuning and function and brought copies back with us. I suggest we run the carburetor piece in a "Jaguar's Purr" issue for all club members to benefit from.

We also attended two additional seminars on Saturday. One covering the newly approved JCNA checklist score sheet, which has been revised for 2006. When you have your car judged this year in Jaguar Concourse, be sure the three-page form says 2006 on the lower left hand corner.

After the seminars Saturday, we passed through the hotel lobby to see the new 2006 XK Roadster on display alongside a beautifully restored XK120 OTS. I must say the new XK is simply gorgeous with a large V-8 motor, fine wood and leather interior. It was finished in gray; the interior wood was a pale yellow birch look on gray leather, something different than I've ever seen. Begin to look for this car at our local dealers in the Delaware Valley soon.

We left the hotel and were bussed to the aircraft museum where we enjoyed seeing all sorts of aircraft on display for four hours. We had gathered for dinner, sitting at tables among the aircraft. I sat next to a Russian 2<sup>nd</sup> World War fighter which had 17 red stars on it. They have even saved the first Boeing "Red Barn" aircraft factory building with old belt driven line shaft wood working equipment. You see, our first aircraft were built of wood. Even the propellers were manufactured of laminated wood. Everyone had a great time at the museum. We were treated to two new additional Jaguars - an XK coupe and an XJ8 with the big new wheels and small tires. This will take me some "getting use to" as I'm a big fan of large sidewall tires (old). Guess I must change my ways again!

Speaking of change, the next day Charlie and I were up, fed and attending the Directors' Meeting at 8:00 a.m. The change I speak of is our officers. 107 delegates elected President Denis Enyon of Arizona, SW, Steve Weinstein, Vice President, NE, and Sherman Tiefel, Secretary, NE. We wish them a lot of success and hope they can fulfill their goals. I guess the most important is to keep the membership up by having good programs that hold and interest the membership. They did decide to hold off on an increase in dues; hoping that a stable membership roster will continue, funds will continue to flow and budgets may be maintained.

There were many other issues discussed and voted upon. Not all issues passed, so if you read the agenda items that were to be discussed and voted upon, don't assume they all passed, as some never even made it to our meeting. They got shot down by the Board meeting Friday and we did not pass quite a few. One that did narrowly pass was in concourse, that we would now inspect the batteries in all XK120 cars, but not XK140 and XK150 and the XJ40 battery and jack in the trunk. So if you show your XJ40, clean the backside of your spare time so that you don't lose points for cleanliness (The jack is behind the spare on these Jaguars). A nice new addition to our Rally competition is that our novice people can enjoy that status for national competition for two years instead of only the first year. That makes sense as it takes a couple of years to get all you must absorb into your rally portfolio.

After the AGM convention, Charlie attended two seminars then went to the banquet hall and set up 61 national award trophies. Of those, 15 were the newsletter article awards. I'm sorry to say, none of our great stories from DVJC received awards. The categories of travel, heritage, technical, photography and event reports were judged for these awards. The Andrew Whyte Award was presented by Kurt and winner, Bill Streitenberger to Jackie Maletsky, Membership chairman for 33 years in the neighboring club of Jaguar Touring Club. The Fred Horner award went to Cynthia Loverall of the Heart of American Jaguar Club. She competed in 3 concourses, 3 rallies and 1 slalom. Doug Ingram, Newsletter Editor award winner this year, was delighted to receive the gorgeous Karen Miller annual award. We also awarded the Website Manager of the Year to Dana Brown of the San Francisco Club of California.

By the time you receive this, we will have had the second quarter Directors' Meeting and our first Rally in Millville, New Jersey, supporting the Thunderbolt Club. This was formed to assist the deserving folks of Millville to continue their education. Even if you are not inclined to participate and run in our rallies, this is a worthwhile, tax-deductible organization, which does a lot of good for that area. Long time Jaguar owner and DVJC members Dave and Robin Gilbert are the rally masters for this, our first rally of the 2006 season.

Jonat, the national tour of the U.S. by Jaguar, left Seattle the last day of the AGM. They headed south, then will cross west to East to Florida, then north and will be arriving in DVJC turf at our concourse near Mt. Holly on June third. If anyone from our club would like to ride our planned tour Sunday or ride our planned tour north to the hand off point in Patterson, New Jersey on Monday, please let me, Charlie Olson or Jerry Kunkle know so we can plan accordingly. The final route is not definite as yet, but we will probably stay close to the Delaware Valley, possibly visiting Longwood Gardens and or Valley Forge. Anyone inclined to host a Sunday cookout for Jonat can excel and be a noteworthy host.



## A Timely Reminder

We have previously published a similar warning in the Purr but member Dave Duckett sent me the following and I thought it was worth reminding everyone.

"A 36 year old female had an accident several weeks ago and totaled her car. A resident of Kilgore, Texas, she was traveling between Gladewater and Kilgore. It was raining, though not excessively, when her car suddenly began to hydroplane and literally flew through the air. She was not seriously injured but very stunned at the sudden occurrence. When she explained to the highway patrolman what had happened he told her something that every driver should know-NEVER DRIVE IN THE RAIN WITH YOUR CRUISE CONTROL ON. She thought she was being cautious by setting the cruise control and maintaining a safe consistent speed in the rain. But the highway patrolman told her that if the cruise control is on and your car begins to hydroplane – when your tires lose contact with the pavement, your car will accelerate to a higher rate of speed and you take off like an airplane. She told the patrolman that was exactly what had occurred. He estimated her car was actually traveling through the air 10 to 15 miles per hour faster than the speed set on the cruise control. The same thing will happen on ice."

## Interesting Jaguars For Sale Or Sold

A company called Morris & Welford in the USA. are advertising for sale a model that is very rarely seen or even heard of...a 1935 Jaguar SS 90. Chassis number 249478 is the first customer supplied and licensed SS90 of just 23 cars built. First sold in June 1935, the original owner was Captain J. Black, managing director of Standard Motors, who supplied chassis and engines to SS cars. It is fitted with its original six-cylinder side valve engine and four-speed gearbox; it has been beautifully restored in recent years. Arguably the first true Jaguar Sports Car. If your interested, please contact Miles Morris, at 203-222-3862. I suspect it will be priced at mega dollars.

Very few C-types come up for sale but in the last couple of months two have hit the auction sales. In January RM Auctions featured the 1952 built XC014. It was sold, including buyer's premium, for pounds 867,000 (\$1.8 exchange rate) this was a pristine car but with very little racing history and was considered something of a bargain.

Christies have tried twice to sell XKC006. This car has tons of history being a 1952 Ecurie Ecosse car. The first sale in the UK last year was unsuccessful with a final bid of pounds 1,050,000. Many thought it should have sold at this price. In February the car was up again, this time in Paris and was sold, including premium, for pounds 947,000. It was thought that as the first Ecurie Ecosse C-type and a car with an interesting and well-documented period race record it offered a lot of history for the money. Other historic Jags going through auction were a 1951 XK120, which had been privately entered in those years 24 hours of Le Mans. Though the C types took the laurels the XK120 came home in 11<sup>th</sup> place to score the XK120's highest ever place at Le Mans. The car averaged 82.52mph, a speed that would have won the race two years previously. (Let me remind you that the first ever NASCAR race was won by an XK 120, the only non-US manufactured car to win a NASCAR race) Despite its history and a restoration in excesses of \$100,000 the Le Mans car did not sell.

However another 1949 K 120 did sell. This was the 56<sup>th</sup> of only 182 left-hand drive alloy roadsters. It changed

hands for pounds 136,000 Two 3.8 XK150S were auctioned. The 3.8 specifications are the rarest of the "S" specification cars. You very rarely hear of one. There was a 1960 drop-head, one of only 89 manufactured, which sold for \$148,000, which was a very good price for a drop-head. The second car, the most sought after roadster version, sold for \$152,932. Why do I feel that these two are one and the same car and the press have got confused between the Drop head coupe and a roadster in the two separate reports Wish I had not sold my 3.4 version of this car last year!!! Here is an interesting comment in SCM regarding a 1974 XKE Series 3 sold for \$27,000 "Most of this car looks pretty good, but the trunk panel fit is very scary. I am not fond of gremlins and British car

gremlins can cause temporary insanity"!!! Poor fellow...scared of real life.

## Fred Jumped

Those of you who read Fred Mack's story in last months Purr or attended the party in his honor at the Desmond will know that it was his intention to complete a tandem parachute jump the next day on his birthday March 20. I received a very nice "thank you" letter from Fred in which he said, "I completed my tandem parachute jump on the 20<sup>th</sup> with no trouble. From a 15,000 feet fall face down for ten thousand feet in one minute at 120mph, through ice crystal clouds at 8,000 feet. Temperature was -8 degrees compared to 45 on the ground. Then 5,000 feet with parachute open for four minutes. We came in at 5 mph against a wind of 10mph. He put his feet down first and I sat on his lap with no forward motion" Isn't that wonderful? Congratulations Fred

#### Goodbye XK 8

Ten years after its launch production on the XK8 has finished. Now, I presume they will go through the curve of ever-lower prices. Surely they will become the classic of tomorrow for to days' generation. Fancy restoring one with all those electronic gizmos? It is the best selling Jaguar sports car of all time with a total production of 90,616 compared to the E-type production of 72,507. Yes the XJS was in production from 1975 to 1996 for a total production of 115,415 but the XJS was classed as a Grand Tourer and not a sports car. So the trick will be to get one, in good condition, at the right price at the knee of the curve. The convertible is always more popular but for me the coupe is the most beautiful. Perhaps I will get one and keep it with my XJS until I get to Fred Mack's age.



Fast Facts...Hope Lodge and Delaware Valley Triumphs

Hope Lodge's history dates back to between 1743 and 1748 when Samuel Morris - farmer, shipowner, miller, ironmaster, and shopowner during America's colonial period - constructed the dwelling. Morris adopted the most current architectural style of the day in both England and America for Hope Lodge - Georgian - named for King George I...a style characterized by elegant symmetry and balance. The building saw several owners (including Henry Hope from whom its name derived) from the colonial period through colonial revival to today's owners: The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Delaware Valley Triumphs, Ltd. (DVT) was founded in 1977 and is dedicated to the preservation of the Triumph marque. DVT is the oldest local chapter of the international Vintage Triumph Register. This year we are celebrating 29 years of providing members with fellowship and opportunities to learn more about the marque's unique and colorful history.



In 1922, young motorcyclist Bill Lyons joined sidecar builder William Walmsley to form the Swallow Sidecar Company in Blackpool, England. Their stylish, distinctive aluminum sidecars proved popular.

In 1927, the Swallow Sidecar and Coachbuilding Company was born. At the 1931 London Motor Show Lyons entered the market with cars of his own with long, low styling and leather and wood interiors that would become Lyons' trademark.

The company name changed to SS Cars Ltd in 1933 when Swallow cars stopped production. In 1935, Lyons introduced the SS Jaguar 100 as the first to bear the Jaguar name which he chose because it suggested power and elegance.

The company introduced a new Jaguar saloon in 1948, the Mark V and a new sports car, the Jaguar XK120. Named for its top speed, it was the fastest production automobile of its day.

In 1954 Jaguar incorporated a company in New York and began exporting cars to the United States.
