

We still have another chance in October to get even better scores at the Pumpkin Run in Millsboro, DE on October 27, 28 and 29.

I especially enjoyed the lush pale green forests we drove through in southern New Jersey during the rally. It was very photographic and we attempted this while rallying. Another experience was our lunch break Saturday at the Coast Guard Aircraft Museum in a giant hangar near Cape May. We have a bottom line report also; our 28 rally teams came up with \$4,500 dollars to donate to the Thunderbolt Club. This club was named for the type of aircraft that was being utilized for training pilots in WWII at this site. The kids who benefit from the beautiful club are from southern New Jersey. Last year we were told there were twenty scholarships given through this organization, a very worthwhile task.

Trip To The Old Country

I have just returned from a three-week trip to England. Here is what I saw, heard, read and did while I was there

- 1) The sun was out the total time. Never saw one drop of rain. The countryside was beautiful with millions of daffodils. The fields were lush green and occupied by trees in blossom and all the spring lambs.
- 2) The first thing I saw when I got out of the airport into the parking lot was the new Jaguar XK. It's a beauty and it was love at first sight. It certainly has the 'wow' factor, my brother-in-law walked straight towards it, "Never" I thought, and I was right.
- 3) I visited the local Jaguar Dealer. He had sold 50 XK's and delivery on the Roadster was 10 months and on the Coupe 18 months. Total production this year for the new XK is 12,000 of which 8,000 will come to the USA they told me.
- 4) It is strange to see, in England, Jaguars without the famous "Leaper" on the hood (bonnet). They do not look as menacing and sometimes hard to recognize. Amazing that we in the USA can have the Leaper but in the UK it is banned as dangerous. It's normally the other way round!
- 5) There are lots of "Smart Cars" on the road (Very, very small)
- 6) While I was there gas hit £1.1 per liter. That translates into somewhere around \$7.30 a gallon.
- 7) "Bring back hanging" screamed the headline in one newspaper. The Brits get very emotional about this subject but this time the villains had gone too far. This plea was in connection with the suggested punishment metered out to the vandals who ruined the collection of classic Jaguars belonging to James Hull. 31 of 80 cars were destroyed. This included the first XK 150S ever made, a Coombs MK 2, an unregistered XJS convertible and an E-type. Traces of blood have been discovered in the wrecked cars, which police are hoping to use as forensic evidence in the search for the criminals.
- 8) The Labor Deputy Prime Minister in Tony Blair's government, John Prescott, who is affectionately known as "Two Jag Prescott" because of his love for the car, was disgraced when it was made known that he had been having an affair with his Secretary, Tracey Temple. Prescott, who is 67, has been married for 44 years to Pauline. The British gutter press had a field day with headlines like "Two Shag Prescott".

- 11) It had to happen. It was announced that the Browns Lane factory, Jaguars spiritual home, will finally close down. It has been sold to developers. Just think houses will be built on the ground where once XK's, E-types etc moved down the assembly line. I wonder, if one purchased a home there, would you dream more often of those golden days.
- 12) Another announcement in the press said "The Queen of England confines most of her driving to the royal estates, but maintains a lively interest in automotive technological advances. Recently she had satellite navigation systems installed in her stable of vehicles, which includes three Rolls Royces, two Bentleys and three Daimlers. (One is Jaguar bodied with a Daimler radiator called a Vanden Plas here.)" The question now is "when did one of the Queen's drivers ever get lost?"
- 13) Coventry's recently refurbished transport museum opened a new exhibition called Jaguar by Design which pays homage to the skills of Jaguars engineers. There is a glittering array of models including several concept cars, one being the original 1988 XJ220 which is the only one with a V12 engine. Also there is the 2003 R-D6 coupe and the Advanced Lightweight Coupe which was the basis for the new XK. The very last car to be built at Brown's Lane, an XJ Super V8 Portfolio is also on display. Admission to the museum is free and the museum is open daily 10.00am to 5.00pm.

A pretty full and informative three weeks fortified by good ale and pork pies.
