

Recently, I received e-mail from member Brian Edwards. Brian and his wife, Debby, show their red 1975 E-Type Jaguar in the national JCNA concours shows. He relayed some show statistics that I found interesting. Collectively in the eight JCNA car shows we have entered to date, Delaware Valley Jaguar Club members in the Championship Division have won 28 first places, 8 second places, 4 third places and one fourth place, I'm impressed with the interest and obvious quality of the Jaguars being shown and the attendance and interest our members have demonstrated. Like I have been saving all along in my tenure as your President, "The key to success is showing up"! A long time ago, my friend, fellow DVJC member, and Jaguar owner Paul Poinsard relayed this quotation to me. He got it from Wood Allen at a show in New York.

I had thought about making a little spiel about membership and attendance in the November issue and to also address membership. Our club is fortunate to have 207 family memberships this year and I hope we can continue to do this well. I know we see different members and their guests at different events. We may see you at the White Marsh Country Club with your guests and not see you until next December. Some we only see at car shows or at the rallies in the spring and fall. This month as I write this before the rally, I have been passing out flyers and pushing this Fall Pumpkin Rally. At this point, I expect a female driver and her male navigator to drive here from Kansas and Texas to run with us. We have a national rally committee, one representative from each of the six. The October 15th BCCD Car Show held in Delaware City saw ten Jaguars show up, 3 of which were DVJC members. The site, which is located in a park beside an original boat dock for the C & D Canal, is across the street from "Downtown Delaware City". This show is open to all British Cars and we had guite a variety of British Iron in attendance. An MGTD took Best in Show and we had 56 cars in attendance. Three MG's showed up from New York for the show, given the fact that it only took me 45 minutes to drive to this show, I was surprised not more DVJC cars were there.

The following day the HCCP (Historical Car Club of Pennsylvania) held their annual DCCC (Delaware County Community College) car show, (another day of great weather), with categories from motorcycles and antique cars up to 70's muscle cars and lots of them. I did not get a count, but would guess about 300 vehicles were there. There was a large flea- market, at which I was successful in getting some older matchbox Jaguar cars. My grandsons also found a new Jaguar item being made. It is an XK120 pulling a small house trailer and a MKII pulling a tractor, a very cute little model at only \$5.

Only four DVJC members showing their cars represented Jaguar, an XK120 (Fred, of course) and three early E-types. None of us won a prize, as it must have been an MG weekend for the judges. It was nice to talk all day to spectators who seemed to agree the E-types were the most beautiful of all the vehicles present at the show. This show concludes the 2006 season of car shows. I am aware of a special invitational show at Hilton Head coming up. At least two of our members have been invited to attend and are actually driving 1.5 days to get there. That in comparison to 45 minutes to get to the two local show here this past weekend.

Our Fourth Quarter Director' meeting was held October 21st in the JCNA districts. I sent each one of the reps an invitation to "show up" and run the Old Car Rally in Millsboro, DE this year. I started my rally experience by working at checkpoints and driving the follow-up case truck. This led me to enter a Jaguar and actually run the rally. I continue to believe that rally scores involve a lot of luck and skill. You really see some neat cars entered in the rallies. I would like to see us have 15 jaguars entered again like we had in the past. It is a worthwhile affair and the nicest time of the year with all the fall colors and crops being harvested in the region we run in. Just like the slalom, we give our Jaguars a little bit of exercise and they seem to like it.

If you haven't been able to attend our 2006 events, that's too bad. Be sure to mark your calendar for the final event of 2006. It will be Sunday, December 3rd at the White Marsh Country Club. You may want to approach your dealership or service facility about the possibility of a door prize donation for our Holiday Party. This makes the activity a little more interesting and we always give credit in the Jaguar's Purr to those vendors who come up with door prizes. Please keep your club in mind as you write a check to your vendors and please patronize our dedicated advertisers who offset some of the costs of production of the Jaguar's Purr. Just like your annual personal dues, the vendor dues are also due by December 31,2006 for the 12 issues of advertising for 2007. Please be prompt in paying your dues as our club officers are all volunteers and they should not have to do unnecessary work to remind people that their dues are due.

Chester Shop. A lot of teamwork was obvious and that is a good feeling, as the club will survive very well with such enthusiasm! Many important issues were discussed with the elections occurring as you read this issue. Please vote and show your support. Mail in your ballot to secretary Ann Perry at the address noted on the ballot.

The Fall Tour should be a fun trip, especially with the fall colors and all the interesting details of touring a British Restoration shop that Mike Wolf has been working on for the group. Thanks for setting this up. The club appreciates your effort!

At the Chester Shop we have the use of 12 tables. These surround our 40 assorted chairs with three additional tables in the middle. I have set up club photographs on the inside tables and Jaguar publications, books and magazines. Those are free for the taking. The idea is that you can read any of the books, use them for research or study, then return them so another club member can utilize them. If you happen to have any Jaguar books that you would like to donate to the collection, please do so. Magazines like the Jaguar Journal, E-Jag, Hemmings, and new members trying to get up to speed and educated themselves to all the various Jaguar models often seek after Jaguar's Purr etc. To further confuse the marque, we now have new cars coming off the line with the old "XK" designations.

Sadly, I must report the passing of longtime DVJC member, Jaguar restorer and friend, Lou Ottaviano on October 23rd. Lou was the proprietor of Lindley Motors and has held technical programs at his beautiful shop for the club. We will miss him. God speed, Lou.

A DAY AT HERSHEY

The Antique Automobile Club of America's club at Hershey, is the Sponsor of the Eastern Division National Fall Meet, internationally known simply as "Hershey"! This is their "Concours d'Elegance"! Of course most of us car buffs attend regardless of ownership and for me as a Jaguar owner it was no exception, as I tramped thru the various marquees of show cars in their various classes waiting to be judged.

An unusually well restored car to original standards always catches my eye and so it was with this 1971 series II XKE OTS. I was a bit puzzled by the fact it was a 1971 for I thought the last series II was in 1970. So, I congratulated the owner on his magnificent restoration but said I was of the understanding Jaguar designated '71 as a series III!

He introduced himself as Mr. Dom Mari and explained that Jaguar did indeed add a V-12 and called it a series III prior to '71 but this car is a 4.2 liter six cylinder OTS which they continued to produce thru Jan of '71 and according to the Chassis #2R.13640 it's one of the last 19 made. He also explained that his car incorporated two of the three options available: A factory made Hardtop and Air Conditioning! A power steering option was also available, but not chosen on this car.

I usually ask who did the restoration work and discovered he was the restorer of many cars over the past thirty years and this was his first Jaguar. Acquiring information to make the car authentic as possible was not an easy task. Our DVJC was not forth coming with information upon his inquiry by phone, mainly due to not having a member owning a similar car and member confidentiality. So, Mr. Mari had to look for other sources .I regret deeply that this had happened and a procedure will be put into place to help find and encourage restoration by individuals not affiliated with our club, but who want to restore or own a Jaguar!

However he did manage to obtain a JCNA series II judging guide which was paramount in providing information for authenticity, which served to make the corrections prior to completion! He continued to tell me about his experience that a lot of us shared, when preparing a car for important competition. Starting 3years and 6 days until the last hour at 5pm, Friday the day before he was scheduled to compete, the car was started and driven into the enclosed trailer! A surreal moment he confessed after 30 years of ownership, when he fired up the engine! He happened to mention that my good friend Chris Leydon owner of Leydon Restorations of Lahaska an accomplished restorer assigned associate David King do the engine work. They also did the engine work on a Delahaye that was a 2005 winner at Pebble beach! So, it was no surprise that Mr. Mari wanted quality and perfection, which was obvious in the finished product that is museum quality"!








1471 Jaguar Series II 4.2 liter OTS with Optional Factory Hardtop installed




Frontal view showing Chrome trim surrounding bonnet air intake





Interior view showing round speaker Recessed door handles & AC outlets






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1971 Jaguar series II 4.2 liter O1S




1971 Jaguar Series II 4.2 liter OTS with Optional Factory Hardtop installed





Frontal view showing Chrome trim surrounding bonnet air intake

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


