Positive News For Jaguar

Just as Ford was announcing record losses of \$12.7 billion for the year there was good news for Jaguar. Ford President and Chief executive Alan Mulally insisted that he had no plans 'at this time' to sell the company but he repeatedly declined to give an absolute assurance that Jaguar would not be sold in the near future. His statement, no doubt, is influenced by the reception for the stunning make or break C-XF 155mph sedan, which has taken the North American motor show by storm. No doubt if Mulally believes the dramatic car – on sale from 2008 as a replacement for the retro S – Type – can be the springboard for Jaguar's revival as a profitable maker of exciting luxury cars, the "leaping cat" will remain in the Ford family fold.

With this news came the announcement from Auto - Week that they had picked the C-FX as the "Best In Show" and they said "From our point of view, the C-FX is the sexiest four door saloon we've seen from Jaguar in years - and one that draws a straight line from the past Jaguar sedans to Jaguar sedans of the future. We won't forget this one anytime soon" .

So at long last Jaguar has cut the cord to the XJ 6 design with the C – XF showcasing a new design direction for the marque as well as more innovative technology. The design team says they took inspiration from the 1950 Mark V11 sedan and the XK 120. Ian Callum says, "Jaguars should be perceived as cool cars, and cool cars attract interesting, edgy people. (Wow! That's us) this next generation will do just that"

One description of the C – FX is "An aggressive grille is finished in black chrome and set back in the nose. There is no sign of a leaper but there is a large Jaguar head in the center of the grill. The headlamps consist of a single wedge and Pirelli tires surround 21 – inch polished aluminum wheels, "while the interior is described as "one of the most exciting interiors Jaguar has ever done" The emphasis is on performance rather than luxury, with a brushed aluminum fascia and carbon-fiber pattern leather.

Beneath the hood (bonnet) is a tuned version of the 4.2-liter supercharged V8 engine, producing 420 bhp and linked to a six-speed auto transmission. The engines wiring is housed in a carbon – fiber "loom" created by Beru F1 Systems. It will be interesting to see how much of this makes it into production. Perhaps this time, like the XK, this concept car will make it onto the street. I have got comprehensive literature on it so I think its real!!

Auction News

The UK magazine "Classic Car Weekly" states "XJS official classic. 2006 is the year in which the XJS has finally achieved the true classic status it merits and a number of V12 convertibles have sold at auction in excess of \$20,000 and Coupes for in excess of \$12,000." To prove this statement I see that Sports Car Magazine reports the sale of a 1992 XJS Convertible, Burgundy metallic with tan leather. 43,372 miles. Condition 3. Sold for \$21,600. I told you many times the XJS was a sleeper

Also it is said that there is a good deal of upward movement in Jaguar sedans of the 1960's. Examples: - A 1960 Mk 1X. Two tone metallic black and with red leather. Condition 3. 6,793 miles Sold for \$20,520. This car was called a "road restoration" which is an expression I had not heard before. It means that the car is driven as it is fixed up and in this case there is still work to do. Also a 1961 Mk 1X with light blue paint and red leather with 24,036 miles on the clock and condition 4 sold for \$20,900. Backing up these sales was the progress made by Mk 2's. Very popular in Europe where they are valued for their sports car litheness, their road manners, and their exceptionally good looks and often being mistaken for a smaller Rolls Royce. A 3.4 Mk 2 in old English white and red leather with 84,346 on the clock and described with fair older paint which is "lumpy down below" which is a scary thought. Good interior. Condition 4. A comment on the car was "Still under priced in the market. Much better cars can bring over twice this amount" The MK 2 3.8 is the one everyone lusts after because it was the top engine of the period.

A 1963 3.8 painted British Racing Green with tan leather and 83,874 miles. Very good paint and chrome but the window surround on the passenger side was dented and the windshield cracked. Condition 3. Sold at \$36,300 Many E-Types and XK's continue to sell at premium prices and prove their worth as a highly desirable driving machine and investment

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MINUTES OF THE OFFICERS'/DIRECTORS' MEETING JANUARY 20, 2007

The meeting was held in a conference room of the beautiful new Main Line Jaquar facility in Wayne, PA.

Attending were:

The minutes of the October 21, 2006 meeting were accepted as corrected.

President

Charlie Olson announced the creation of a new appointed position, that of Roving Consultant and its appointee, Mike Tate. The Directors supported this recommendation and saluted the President on a wise selection. He also reported that there would be a committee to explore more Concours sites for consideration. He will chair that committee, being joined by Tom Jones, Gerry Kunkle, Steve Poset and Mike Tate. Further to his comments was the wish that minutes of these meetings be made available to those in attendance within 2 weeks of the event.

Treasurer

Gerry Kunkle distributed a written report, which included a proposed budget for the 2007 Club year, which was approved by the body. He also reported that the Club's account had been moved to a bank more accessible to him and probably to most of the four signers. This account was set up to require 2 signatures for a check's endorsement. Gerry also made recommendations concerning restructuring the present Treasurer/Membership/Advertising function into three separate functions with the incumbents having more specific interests in each of the three areas. Gerry implemented a procedure under which funds could be disbursed if he were absent from an event. Some discussion was held regarding events, which historically require a greater expenditure than the income, generated. The Club acknowledged that there are a few instances where such a deficit is not objectionable. Gerry also distributed rosters of members whereon the 2007 paid memberships had been noted. This will be used by the area coordinators to determine by personal contact (1) if the parties wish to continue membership and (2) what concerns or recommendations those individuals might have to present for consideration. Gerry asked that we consider a more appropriate selling price for our enameled badges.

Vice President

Brian Craig indicated that he would be willing to serve as a delegate to the Annual General Meeting in Houston, but that he would not want his participation to obviate the attendance of another delegate from the Club who was hoping to attend with Charlie Olson, but whose intentions were not certain at this time. He also reported that he would be looking forward to the guidance of Charlie Olson in preparing the Club's Grant Applications and presenting them to JCNA.

Our host, Mike Smythe, addressed us briefly to let us know that they (the corporation) understand that the history of Jaguars is important to the brand, to ask us to consider joining them in their "Cars Under the Stars" show, to agree with our sentiments (as reflected in recent publications) that Jaguar's quality is now the best ever, and to express his organization's intention to promote our organization. As evidence of that, he will make the conference room available as needed for our continued use. We thanked him for his graciousness and hospitality.

<u>Director Tom Murray</u> was not present. Charlie Olson reported that we continue to be impressed with the new merchandise made available through Tom's efforts. A request was made that we pursue the remarketing of the window decals that were so well received in the past.

<u>Director Tom Jones</u> expressed the wish that we solicit ideas from the members for events they would enjoy through an article in the Purr. He continues to have exciting options for events, but as Kit Racette pointed out, we would be well served to consolidate some of the planning efforts for these events and general membership communications. Further to that comment, she announced that she, Brian and Pauline Craig would be working together on the Club's Web presence. As always, we should be soliciting more articles and input from the membership for inclusion in the Purr.

<u>Advertising Chairman</u>, <u>Gerry Kunkle</u>, reported that all but one of our current advertisers has already paid for this year and that he has sent solicitations to other prospects. The body restated its opinion that only automobile related businesses be represented in the Purr. Kit suggested that Gerry check that advertisers were included in mailings to be sure they had copies of the publication they are supporting through their ads.

Old Business,

Past President Kurt Rappold presented President Charlie Olson with the Club's seal stamp, bound copies of minutes, and the original log book.

New Business.

President Charlie Olson announced the creation of a new appointed position, that of Historian, and announced his appointment of Kurt Rappold to that position. The body agreed wholeheartedly with this action.

Charlie addressed the possibility of revitalizing the four area coordinator positions. After considerable discussion, it was determined that contact should be established with those coordinators and replacements selected where necessary. They would be apprised of the recommendation (above) that they contact members whose status was not paid up at this point. It was determined that members whose dues weren't received by March 30 would be dropped from the Purr distribution lists. The areas are viewed as The Greater Metropolitan, Southern New Jersey, Greater Philadelphia, Lehigh Valley and Lancaster.

Kit Racette was asked to pursue the spring event at the Desmond. The date will have to be confirmed quickly and then a hard copy mailer will be sent. The events committee, under Director Tom Jones' steering, will be considering, assembling and distributing information on such events as a Chadds Ford Brewery visit; Watkins Glen trip, etc., but that one individual should be named to take the reins for each specific event.

Events known at this time include:

May 5th-7th – Binghamton, N.Y. Rally

June 2nd Concours at Rankokas N.J.

July 28th Slalom at Garnet Valley High School

Oct 26th, 28th - Pumpkin Rally Milsboro, De.

Charlie Olson distributed updated rosters of officers and principal functionaries within the club. He also reported that as Concours Chairman he would be planning several (probably 4) training sessions for judges for that event.

Also under New Business, Gerry Kunkle recommended that the Club consider clarification of its membership fee structure for 2008 and beyond. That recommendation was accepted and tabled until the next meeting.

The next Directors' meeting will be held at the Main Line Jaguar facility at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 21, 2007.

There being no further business to come before the group, the meeting was adjourned.

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


