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



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Reporting on the Concours in the June Purr I failed to mention that Frank Weikel, our founding President, presented me with a large Album with a cloisonné of the Club's Emblem attached to the cover. The album contained Frank's personal chronicle that he presented to the club's President, Jack Sanft, in commemoration of the Club's 25th

anniversary in 1990. If you're as interested in our club's history as I am, you'll be delighted to sign this out from Kurt Rappold, our club's historian. It contains a lot of photos and explains how the club was founded by the inspiration of Frank's involvement with the Jaguar Driver's Club in the U.K.

Frank was already enamored with Jaguars in the early 50's when in the Air Force stationed in St. Louis. A Jaguar dealership featured a pearl gray XK-120 sitting next to a matching colored MKVII. So, Frank settled for a used (they didn't call them "pre-owned" back then) XK-150 DHC Drophead, as they are called, after he was discharged in 1955. The bug didn't bite me until '61, when I saw a brand new "E type" OTS parked at the curb as I left classes at Drexel University. Perhaps a lot of our members were bitten by that first sighting, like me? However, I had to be content to climb into my '29 Model A Ford Coupe, my transportation at the time. Enough of my digression!!

Frequent business trips to the U.K. resulted in Frank becoming a member of the JDT and his appointment as their American Representative. In the meantime, he was aware that the Jaguar Clubs of North America, Inc. had four USA and two Canadian regions. The only clubs in the East were New York and Washington. Other groups were located in St. Louis, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Seattle, Montreal, and Toronto.

In 1965, Frank successfully petitioned the JCNA to form a club, which led to the authorization to form the Philadelphia Division of the JCNA. Then, after meeting with Jaguar Owners from the Delaware Valley area at the Holiday Inn, Mount Laurel, N.J., he was elected Director! The Club wasn't named the DVJC until --- Well, I've got to find out. They didn't rename Directors as Presidents until Jack Sanft was elected in 1970. He was succeeded by Kurt Rappold in 1994.

I hope you found this synopsis interesting and perhaps I'll be able to submit the "The Rest of the Story," as a series in the PURR! With help from our past Presidents, some still active, I'm sure it won't be too difficult, especially if I give them an assignment.

It's a real pleasure for me to see that our past Presidents still have an interest in our club and attending functions. Larry Schear was active as a judge in this year's Concours as well as Kurt Rappold as Chief Judge. Dick Michie also visited to show his support and of course Frank Weikel, who traveled all the way from VA.

In reviewing our calendar for upcoming events in July, I must remind all of our officers to be sure to attend our meeting on Saturday the 21st at Mainline Jaguar at 9am. One of the main items on the agenda will be the Concours location for 2008.

Our next sanctioned meet is on Saturday, July 28th. It's our 4th Annual Slalom. Be sure to see the Flier/Application insert and please register for a competitive but fun-filled event. I also want to₅

encourage the wives, and all the women with a Jaguar available, to compete in our Slalom! Ann Perry, our Secretary, has competed driving her '85 XJS coupe in all three of our past Slalom Events. She can attest that it's a lot of fun and women can easily compete with the guys. Incidentally, the fastest participant in a JCNA Sanctioned Slalom last year in the entire country is a woman! Her name is Karen Jones, driving a modified '72 XKE! SO ladies, you can do this too . . . without the risk of being dubbed "Fast Women"!!

Speaking of Sanctioned Events, it's a great weekend in Pittsburgh for their Grand Prix and Concours! Gerry Kunkle and I, with several other members of the DVJC, were in attendance last year. See the Flier/Application enclosed.

Now I hope you've all heard of the Challenge Championship in Indianapolis, because its takes place the week after our Slalom. It's not too late to register, but you should decide shortly. Usually it's not a last minute affair to register, but I'm sure you can be accommodated.

We've been promising more social events and a daytime Rally to our members. I hope to remedy that at our next officer's meeting in July. So it goes at Ford. No wonder they are in a mess. First they adamantly say that everything is on the table for sale including Jaguar. Then they say, just as adamantly, that Jaguar is not for sale. Only last month I reported that Ford's top man, Mulally, had said at the New York Car Show that "Jaguar was not for sale. They had lost money but they had a very good plan to become profitable." Forgive me. I only report what I read or hear. Now in a plan called "Project Swift" our favorite marque is up for sale as quickly as possible!!!! I only hope that this time they do sell it so that Jaguar can move forward and once again regain that "WOW" factor for which they were once famous and which Ford has worked hard to dim. Many speculate that the latest turn of events has been dictated by Daimler Benz divesting Chrysler and the resulting up turn in their stock price.

The press and unions in England have been prolific in their discussions on the situation and my correspondent in the UK, PGT, has mailed me a large envelope stuffed with the latest shots in the top newspapers.

Under headlines such as "No News Is Bad News", "Jaguar and Land Rover For Sale? We told you so...", "Wanted: rich new owner for old Jaguar in bad condition", "Unions' fear of 'asset strippers' means bumpy road for Ford", "Ford to off load luxury brands", and "Fire Sale", there are common themes as follows:

Ford has been quietly looking to off load Jaguar & Land Rover since January despite their constant denials. Both companies are on the

verge of releasing new products which will require huge investment but Ford is already bleeding cash and requires investment money for their traditional home volume products. There is even talk of Ford becoming insolvent with or without an injection of cash. Another common theme is that the number of suitors is thin. Companies like Fiat, Renault-Nissan and even Hyundai have taken a look at the books and turned the option down. The greatest fear is that this then leaves the 'asset strippers' which could lead to a death similar to Rover/MG.

There are many quotable quotes in the UK press but the one I liked best is from Jeff Randall's column in the Daily Telegraph of June 15 "Whoever buys Jaguar, they will carry the burden of history. In a world of clone cars, they will become custodians of a name that used to stand for style and individuality. It can do so again. Woe betide them if they screw it up."

To show my faith in the long term success of Jaguar I invested in two more this month. An X-type wagon (Very popular in the UK) as a 50th anniversary present for wife Mo. And for me, as I was part of the event in July 1957, I invested in a 1967 420 with four on the floor -- a proper motor car.

We arrived at the Polo Ground which was in a tranquil and spectacular setting. The field was surrounded by gleaming white tents and we were directed to a prime viewing area -- the "Classic Car Parking." This was conveniently located next to the V.I.P Champagne Tent.

As part of our package for attending the event we were issued silver wrist bands which declared "Polo V.I.P Champagne Tent" where, besides the bubbly, we were given smoked

salmon sandwiches, melon & cheese sandwiches (Try it -- it is superb) and lots of other goodies.

This is a charity event and the resulting funds are given to the Bonnie Brae residential treatment and special education center for emotionally disturbed boys, ages 11 – 18, which is located on 100 acres of land in Bernards Township, New Jersey. It has instrumentally helped and changed the lives of more than 4,300 young men.

It took about the same time but was 20 miles shorter, much quieter, less traffic, and less stressful. The Mark 2 enjoyed the countryside and behaved. I did notice early on that the petrol indicator was not registering but that was Ok as I knew there was plenty to make it home. My mind started to think how many \$\$\$\$\$ to put that right as I assumed it was the level indicator in the tank. It was only later that I noticed that the water and oil8

ndicators were not working as well so three were out. Good news it was only a fuse that had gone.

A cooling gin & tonic as we recounted what an excellent outing it had been. We have been invited back and hope many more members will come next time.



There are signs for GVHS as you approach the school. The school is not visible from the road; look for the sign at the driveway as the school sits back from the road down a long driveway.

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
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
