

It won't be long before the JCNA contingent of delegates and guests arrives at the Sheraton Station Square on the shores of the Monongahela River in Pittsburgh for the 50th AGM weekend.

If you're planning to attend, please arrive early on Friday, March 28 to take advantage of the 3:30 p.m. concurrent seminars of either "Originality Guide: Air Conditioning" hosted by Welsh Enterprises or an "Interview with Norman Dewis," famous Jaguar test driver, hosted by The Jaguar Club of Pittsburgh.

The Captain's Dinner Buffet should please most any hungry land-lubber. It will feature mixed salad greens with Italian vinaigrette dressing, fresh fruit bowl, marinated mushrooms, hand-carved roast strip loin of beef, apricot glazed chicken breast, penne regatte pasta with tomato basil sauce, seasoned rice pilaf, glazed baby carrots with honey, brown sugar and pecans and an assortment of cakes.

Once we're back on dry land, you might want to stop for a nightcap at any of the 20 nearby bars and night spots, including the Hard Rock Café, the Funny Bone Comedy Club, Joe's Crab Shack or Saddle Ridge, a popular "rock-n-country" saloon complete with a mechanical bull.

Good wishes for a happy, healthy and prosperous year. If you have not done so it will soon be time to start those engines. I would like to start the year by thanking Michelle Meehan for all the amazingly good work she did as Editor of the Purr in her first year. Outstanding Michelle!

To start the year we travelled to Michigan on Thursday January 16th. Before landing at Detroit Metro we could see the white uninviting landscape below. We lived in Michigan for eleven years and the view bought back memories of those long, tough, freezing winters. Our visit to the 2008 North American International Auto Show was postponed until Monday January 21st as it was reckoned that would be quieter than the weekend. Wrong!! It was Martin Luther King day and the crowds were huge. Perhaps they had come to watch an unusual vehicle launch featuring the Dodge 2009 Ram Pick-up. To make an impact, cowboys on horseback drove 120 Longhorn Cattle down Washington Boulevard to the show. It was quite unusual as the cattle, despite the cold, got fairly frisky and spent some of the time trying to climb on each others backs. I explained to my Grandson that they were trying to keep warm.

If you have been to the Cobo Center, where the show is held, you will know it is vast with stands on two floors. However it is stated that Cobo will have to be extended to fill future requirement. The alternative is a completely new complex. I can't imagine it being any bigger as I found the present show completely overwhelming. The number of manufacturers, the number of vehicles shown, the number of stands can be intimidating. The overall impression is the hugely competitive nature of the car industry. To com-

pete is hard, to break in is tough, to survive must be a management nightmare.

BMW, Mercedes and VW had huge stands with a variety of cars. Mercedes caught the eye with their smaller sports cars. To my eye (I only have one that works) the slant radiator with the Mercedes logo in the center is really attractive. Rolls Royce had a sedan and a OTS and for \$470,000 you could have one. Then there is Bentley. The Continental Coup, out of all the offerings is the one for me and I could get one for only \$170,000. This means I could get two Bentleys and have \$100,000 change compared to the Rolls Royce.

General Motors had an enormous stand. It was interesting that they had a number of very small cars as their main display with a diversity of engines. Their point was to ensure you knew you could get a mixture of technologies including gasoline, diesel, electric, or a combination of them. It was interesting that a number of major

manufacturers were promoting clean diesel emphasizing that the noisy engines and smell had gone and the economy of the fuel. Jaguar decided to withdraw their X-type from the US market as they will only be furnished with diesel engines. This was not the only reason for the move as profitably was a key factor. You could spend all day looking at the GM display but key offerings were the \$100,000 ZR1 Corvette looking more like a European sports car and the concept

that really caused a stir was the Cadillac CTS Coupe. I understand that the appearance of this concept was a complete surprise to everyone as GM had kept it under wraps and secret. It looked a real winner and, like many of the concepts, ready to go on the road.

One intriguing car was the Fisker plug-in Hybrid Performance

Sports Sedan. Smart looking, costing \$80,000, it does 620 miles with a full tank of gas or diesel or 50 miles on one battery charge. There were three Lamborghinis on their stand two of which were

sold on the previous night to the show opening. There's plenty of \$ about.

Aston Martin and Porsche did not attend the show but Ferrari was there with their latest sedan and sports car. Always

magical. One of the concepts that impressed me was the Ford Lincoln Sedan looking ultra modern. Alan Mulally, Fords

to concentrate on its core business in North America and that Lincoln could be a worldwide luxury brand while admitting that it might be hard to establish Lincoln in European markets. Strange!! They have an established luxury brand in Europe...it is called Jaguar but they are selling that. At the same time as saying that it was all about Ford he said that they needed to concentrate on fixing Volvo and after a full strategic review that they had decided not to sell the company!

It has been said that the Chinese are coming and there they were on the lower level where over the years Japanese and Korean cars have first appeared and been derided and ignored. Their offerings were unremarkable and their sales people were occupied with their paper

work. Perhaps they were plotting their plan to take the market apart.

Yes Jaguar was there. They had a substantial stand, 50% of which was devoted to Bowers Wilkins Sound Systems. There was an upper deck to this part of the stand and I believe where an XF was housed but you could

Our UK correspondent PGT reminds me that he has a great affinity with both Jaguar and Land Rover. He has owned many classic Jaguars and initiated me in its mystic allure. With

Land Rover, fresh from fighting the war in the Pacific, he joined Rover in Solihull their headquarters, and in 1948 on the first Land Rovers hand painted the chassis as the Mastic paint would not go through the nozzle of the paint gun. He painted 10 each day and the money he earned paid immigrants fare (100 pounds) to Canada on the Aquitania He returned a few years later. Now there is a bit of pioneering history for you. The Land Rover's stand was hive of activity and the new Range Rover looked very

imposing.

Whatever the outcome of the sale, the winner starts with some fine new products but they will need to pump some energy and enthusiasm into the Jaguar sales people if this show is any indication.


