



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The Prez Sez June 2008

As I sat down to finally write the Prez Sez I realized it was June 6th and I took a moment to reflect how fortunate I was on June 6th 1944, that the boat I was boarding in that early morning hour wasn't going to ferry me across the English Channel, but down the Delaware River on a Jr. high school excursion. Weather was a factor then as it was 3 years ago, when on June 6th I decided to go with the Concours under the promise of a better weather forecast. I lucked out then, but this time required very little luck with the decision to "Go" on Sunday!

And so it was a beautiful near-perfect day that we all enjoyed! It was a new venue for us and having a Jaguar Concours combined with an "All British Car Show",

sponsored by the Triumph Club of Delaware Valley, required close communication to avoid problems of logistics! Especially when you change the day of the event! I lost some key people in handling registration and Judging the Operation Verification! However, everyone seemed to "step up" to get the job done! I really appreciated their efforts! I thank those involved!

The Judging teams started around 10:30 a.m. and had the task of reviewing the 47 cars on the field to determine the Division and Classes to be judged, including two display vehicles. We knew that several National winning vehicles were on the field, for I had judged three of them the week before at the Susquehanna Valley Jaguar Concours. So - it came as no surprise to me that we had **six 100-point Champion Division winners and a 100 point winner in the Driven Division!** These are cars that deserve reaching that seemingly unreachable plateau!

These owners strive for perfection in authenticity and quality and present a car that's museum quality, that may serve as a historical display for future generations! Not too mention added value, which I feel is of secondary importance to those individuals. As Chairman, I have adopted a policy of not letting inconsequential dirt, dust and a finger print cause a problem in reaching that 100 point goal. That is not to say that dirt in some instances when determined it's the neglect of the owner, will not get a deduction. That's why the judges must be specific in recording on the score sheet the location and not just some arbitrary determination of cleanliness.

The winners in their Division & Class are listed separately with their scores on a separate page in this edition.

While I'm on the subject, I should point out about items of authenticity, especially in the Champion Division. The Judge should provide the entrant with opportunity to justify the disputed claim. If they cannot, the entrant must sign the score sheet under the Non-authentic column. If they **do not**, they will be disqualified. SO - even if you do not resolve the issue with the Judge, it doesn't necessarily mean you agree. There is a protest procedure in place to resolve

the issue. But first talk to the Chief Judge for most times that issue can be resolved locally. This is especially true in the Driven Division where more latitude is allowed for the driven vehicle, where tires and radios are not given point deductions unless it's obvious they're inappropriate. It still has to look like a Jaguar!

I was delighted to see we had quite a few **first time Entrants** and you'll be receiving your score sheets in the mail. Perhaps if you feel you were penalized unfairly as you review the judge's deductions, you may contact the Chief Judge by



phone or e-mail, he will investigate and get back to you. The Chief Judge has taken the time to ensure that the numbers add up before he sends it to you, but he may not be aware that an unusual deduction was made. This is the time to "get it right"! The Chief Judge is Kurt Rappold, 610-538-4055.

I urge all of our members who are interested in learning more about the judging process with the possibility of becoming an apprentice Judge, to attend one of the

Judging Seminars that I'll be conducting starting in **January** of 2009. It's a great time to interest your spouses to come, especially when concluding with lunch! We always need more **Trained Judges** and I'm trying various incentives to attract them. Then, when its time to actually judge at a Concours, you can be teamed up with an **experienced Judge** to gain confidence.

If you form teams ahead of time, you can be assigned specific classes and develop more knowledge of authenticity pertaining to that class.

Our next Sanctioned Event is our **Slalom** which takes place Saturday, July 26th at the Garnett Valley High School! Coincidentally, they proudly proclaim that they are the home of the Jaguars! Their mascot, of course! If you haven't experienced something other than a Concours or Rally this is your opportunity to try out your driving skills. This is FUN for most and the gals that have participated seem to enjoy it.

DIRECTIONS:

<u>From the North:</u> Northeast Extension 476, continue on 476 Blue Route to Route 1 South to Route 202 South or go to Valley Forge Exit 26 to Route 202 South. Follow Route 202 South towards West Chester. Turn left on Smithbridge Road for 2.1 miles. GVHS is on the right.

<u>From the East (NJ):</u> Take the Commodore Barry Bridge, go South on I-95 to exit 2 and go north on 452 to Village Green and West on Concord Road. Follow Concord Road through Aston to the traffic light at Smithbridge Road. Turn left on Smithbridge. GVHS is down the road on the left.

If you 'wind up' on Route 322 continue to right turn on Route 1, then turn right onto Concord Road. From here, you would turn right onto Smithbridge Road. GVHS is down the road on the left. (There is no exit from 322 onto Smithbridge Road.)

<u>From the South:</u> From I-95 take exit 8 to Route 202 North. Continue on Route 202 North into Pennsylvania. Turn right on Smithbridge Road. Bruster's Ice Cream is on the right. Continue on Smithbridge Road for about 3 miles. GVHS is on the right.


<u>From the West:</u> On the PA Turnpike, take exit 23 South on Route 100 to Route 202 South to left on Smithbridge Road. GVHS is on the right.

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WHAT A BONANZA TATA WON – JAGUAR, LAND ROVER, AND WORLD-WIDE PUBLICITY

It is May 15th and as we will be on the good ship Queen Victoria at the end of the month, heading for the Baltic, I thought I should complete my monthly piece before I go. I wonder how many Jags I will see in Russia.

Now that the saga of the Jaguar purchase by Tata is in the books I can't speculate on that anymore. However I was out on the road glorying in the wonders of my new XK when it came into my mind what a shrewd and commercially spectacular deal Tata got. For \$2.3 billion, \$1.7 billion net, not only did Tata get Jaguar and Land Rover but also an amazing amount of related publicity for themselves as a company name but also the products just at the time the XF was being released and receiving rave reviews world- wide. At the same time the XK was being hailed as an icon and the new range of Land Rovers was also receiving plaudits. It was indeed a masterful piece of commercial wizardry!

The resulting publicity for Tata was enormous. For a mega conglomerate, little known outside of India, it received headlines in major newspapers, magazines, and TV world-wide. Following are several examples of this from the US: Road & Track ran a piece this month on the plan to reintroduce the shelved F-Type lower cost sports car including a visual of the product. As it did in 2000, when the concept hit the Detroit Motor Show, it still looks remarkably fresh and a winner. Commenting on this a Porsche spokesman said that if the F-Type had been released when planned it would have been a serious challenge to their Boxter taking a substantial part of their eventual market. A rare admis-

sion from a competitor. Business Week magazine, in their issue of May 5, ran a headline article begging the question "IBM VS. TATA Which is more American?" They made their point by telling us that "Mumbai based Tata Consultancy Services, India's largest home based tech-services company, collected 51% of its revenues in North America, while IBM only collected 35% the remaining 65% being collected abroad! They also mentioned that IBM is the No. 1 seller of tech services in India. Auto Week devoted two pages mainly covering the approved product plan for the next five years. Lots of new goodies. Non car magazines also had articles explaining who Tata was as did all major newspapers. Some wag wrote that all Jaguars will have standard colored interiors from now on. Tan Doori, the joke being that this is an Indian food. "The Guardian", a top UK newspaper, reported that Jaguar Dealerships in North America claimed customers would balk at buying a Jaguar that was made under Indian ownership. Amazing. I believe the same thing was said about Japanese cars!! Say no more. In the same month, illustrating the strength of India's people Fortune magazine ran an article headlined "What makes Pepsi great?. An American icon was transformed" The accolade went to Pepsi CEO Indra Nooyi. Not only Indian but a female as well. Have we stopped drinking Pepsi?

A common theme was the explanation regarding the new commercial competition coming from the emerging nations such as Korea, India, and China predicting that they will be world super powers. A light hearted article in the May Jaguar World magazine with the headline "Jaguar manufacturing to go to low-cost base overseas" Supposing that the article was written in 2068 it said that Jaguar manufacturing had been in India for 50 years but due to escalating labor costs it will be forced to return the manufacturing of Jaguar cars to

Britain. They pointed out that Jaguars had originally been built in Britain and it gives much pleasure that the wealthy East can assist the economically impoverished West, afflicted as it is by the collapse of the Euro and the terrible drought induced by the unexpectedly severe effects of climate change. Don't laugh. It could happen. We won't be here but our cars could be.

So what a deal. . . How much would Tata have had to pay to get such a feast of publicity for their name together with that of Jaguar? I will have to leave the answer to that to my eldest son Russell who is a top guru in the advertising business. Can you put a number on it Russ?


