
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



I like to encourage all of our members to become candidates for any of the positions listed above. **However**, if you wish to serve in **any** capacity without being on the ballot, please send Ann Perry your interest. I foresee the possibility of new officers being appointed before our next election and I'd like to know in advance if you are interested in serving.

I'll be also be asking our Area Coordinators to contact those in their geographical area, by E-mail or the Postal Service to inform **you** that you're assigned to **them.** Perhaps you have seen their names listed in the Purr, but unsure of which coordinator to contact. But now, they will be contacting **you!**

I'm especially concerned about you continuing your membership in 2009. We want to know what kind of events and service we can provide for your continued interest. We also hope your attendance at the Holiday Party will be the opportunity let us know early to help plan our activities for next year.

Perhaps for some of our new members I should mention that as the DVJC we're an affiliate of the National Organization, the Jaguar Club of North America, and required to have at least one sanctioned event each year called the Concours d'Elegance. 

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America's British Reliability Run

Now In its sixth year, America's British Reliability Run, sponsored by the Vintage Triumph Register, was a challenging, but fun driving event that previ-

ously had raised more than \$130,000 for worthy children's charities. This year's run had three separate 700+-mile runs on the same weekend, September 27-28, 2008, that benefited three highly-rated, local children's charities. The original run once again started in Michigan, another in Pennsylvania, and yet another in Alabama! Each one/two-person team paid their own expenses out-of-pocket and had a goal of raising \$500 for the charity. The Pennsylvania run that Mike Wolf and myself I participated in raised over \$10,000 for the Gia Nicole Angel Fund. The total three runs raised over \$18,530.

Up to 40 British cars of any marque or vintage could participate in each run. Mike Wolf and I had the only Jaguars in the Pennsylvania run, we represented the <u>Delaware Valley Jaguar Club</u> (and Delaware Valley Triumph, Ltd, with other DVT members.) I made this run with my co-driver, Joyce De Lucia, in my 1991 Jaguar XJ6 VandenPlas. 735 miles in two days in



either my TR6 or a XJ6 VandenPlas Grand Touring Saloon?...hmmm....the choice was pretty easy. Mike made his run solo, in his 1967 Jaguar XKE.

Saturday was great, as we left Quaker-

town, PA at 7:00am, with a little mist and rain. DVT's Dan Tinsman had designed a fantastic back roads route to Lime Rock, just some great roads and scenery, the leaves were even changing, or changed up there. We arrived at 12:30 p.m. and did three ceremonial laps at Lime Rock.



After lunch we headed west through the Catskill Mountains over more scenic back roads to Johnson City, NY (near Binghamton) for the night, and arrived about 6:30pm. The drive was great to there. Just a superb route, well thought out, and how he found some of the back roads was amazing. We traveled about 410 miles the first day.

Sunday was just a complete deluge; it started raining as we left Johnson City for the Watkins Glen. My co-driver took the wheel for the ride up there, through that deluge. We stopped by the International Motor Racing Research Center at the Glen, ate donuts, watched the Singapore F1 race on big screen, and got a tour. We also did two laps around the amazing old street circuit. We then took a unanimous vote to forget the back roads, and headed home eventually via Interstate 80 and PA turnpike. The event had only two minor mishaps. A TR 7 blew a oil pressure switch, and amazingly another TR7 driver had not one, but two spares with them! One-half hour at a gas station, in appropriately named Coventry, NY, 15 mechanics looking over the problem, and we were off again. The only other mishap was a flat tire, near Watkins Glen, NY.

support). Total mileage for the loop was 735 miles, and the teams drove through some of the Northeast's most scenic roads near the peak of the Fall Color season. As previously stated, the teams pay 100% of their own expenses (gas, <yikes!> food, and lodging) for the run. We also need to thank Mike Engard of Ragtops and Roadsters, who was bringing up the rear in the van/trailer. I know that most of us were much more relaxed about anxieties of reliability knowing that he was there. This trip could not have been a picnic for him. We got to enjoy our sports and classic cars (even the wet ones) while he had to drive the van and trailer all the time. He didn't even have a passenger to keep him company! The bridges we toured were constructed in a popular (Theodore) Burr arch truss design, a patented wooden-span trussing system that ties the arched trusses directly into the stone bridge abutments.



As if this wasn't enough excitement, keeping in mind the competitive nature of our DVJC members, Gerry made it interesting by including a DVJC shoebox at each one of the bridges where each car was instructed to pick up one card. Prizes were to be awarded at the end for the best poker hand. Each car was also provided with a raffle ticket which made you eligible for numerous gifts at the conclusion of the event.

When we arrived back after the tour, we were greeted with a lunch buffet, which was followed by presentation of gifts for poker hands and raffle winners. EXCITING PLANS FOR MEMBERS TO VISIT WATKINS GLEN IN 2009

Jimmy Clark, Innes Ireland, Dan Gurney, Jack Brabham, Mario Andretti, Graham Hill, Sterling Moss, Jackie Stewart, Richard Petty, Rusty Wallace, Kyle Petty, Geoff Gordon and even Dan Blocker's ("Hoss" Cartwright in TV show Bonanza) 1965 Genie MK 10 have all driven there in Formula 1 or NASCAR races and every year in early September Vintage Car Racing takes over the Glen. Yes, for many of us, all those wonderful cars of our youth will be exercised in an exciting event that draws crowds from all over the country. It is a festival that should be experienced at least once by every car buff. Perhaps the best part of the festivities is the cars that travel with the spectators.

So now is your chance to drive these historic tracks and roads as part of the Delaware Valley Jaguar Club's caravan that will be attending the 2009 event. But if you want to participate you better decide NOW. The numbers are limited to 10 cars.

Ef Adnopoz, a fellow club member, and I have often talked about getting a group of classic and vintage car enthusiasts together and visiting "The Glen" for the Vintage Car Racing. I first went there in 1999, knowing nothing about "Watkins Glen" except that it was a famous venue for car fans, racers, and the gathering of elite drivers. At that time I was surprised at how easy it was to gain access to, most importantly, the Pits where all the cars were assembled and drivers and their crew members were very pleasant and willing to answer questions. I understand that little has changed especially the smell of hot oil and the sound of rumbling engines. Then there were the vintage cars, and if memory serves me correctly, there was the Quaker State 44 Jaguar XJR competing against a list of similar racers.

Early this year, during the first weekend in October, Mo and I pointed the XK in the direction of the Fin-

ger Lakes to spend the weekend with Susan and Efrim (EF) Adnopoz at their delightful home on the slopes of Lake Keuka. The drive of 280 miles was thoroughly interesting and not a lot of traffic with the trees starting to change their colors. The lakes were calm and the sky was blue presenting a gloriously different and relaxing atmosphere. Their home is built on different levels in the gently sloping banks from the road to the shore of the lake with glorious views of the water and the opposite banks and wooded fields. Nestling at the water's edge is the family motor boat in its cradle and cover . . . but most importantly, opposite to the driveway entrance to the home, is the recently built garage which shelters Ef's pride and joy, the red OTS Series 2 E-type. See it in full flight in this issue on the flier announcing the vintage car experience. He loves to drive it through the magnificent wine country during the summer months and therefore knows where to lead us to see the best of the countryside.

Part of Watkins Glen folk lore is right in the town itself. Advertised as 'The Foreign Car People since 1941', Smalley's Garage, whose family started as blacksmiths in the late 1700's, has been the place to get your foreign car back on the road. Flossie Smalley moved her family from Foggy Harbor, Maine to the Glen during the depression where she started the garage. After World War 2 she worked with local sports car enthusiasts to foster tourist trade with the formation of the Watkins Glen Grand Prix. Subsequently, the Foggy Harbor Road race was established through the streets and surrounding countryside and was the foundation of the venue that is now famous throughout motor racing. Smalley's Garage became the official inspection station for the cars. For the past 35 years Flossie's son, Tom, has run the garage and now two of his sons, Patrick and Trevor, learning the trade.

It is to Smalley's that Ef brings his E-type when it needs attention and he swears that Tom's diagnosis is always 100% accurate and to point with a solution. I had spotted the Garage when I had entered the Glen on my way to Susan and Ef's home. Not that I was aware of its history and it is not a place that impresses you with its

Ryan said they had nine employees. I believe they have a very good incentive program where to ensure jobs are completed with high quality and on time each employee is given a particular job with certain objectives. Ryan came outside to see us off and we agreed that when it came time to restore my new XK it would be a very different ball game. 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
