

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A Visit to Castle Bromwich

By "Where's Bob?" De Lucia, DVJC

While on a recent visit to the UK for the huge three-day 2008 Classic Car Show at the NEC in Birmingham, I also had the opportunity

to take a tour of the Lotus factory and Classic Team Lotus near Norwich, and of interest to readers of this news-



letter, the Jaguar factory in Castle Bromwich, about a ½ hour east of Birmingham city center.

The factory is located on historic grounds for the UK. In 1938 Morris Motors opened the factory, but political infighting had Lord Nuffield resign and Vickers-Armstrong took over this factory and on this same site during

World War II, this factory then produced approximately 11,780 Spitfire fighters, and 305 Lancaster bombers. This fact is readily produced for visitors to the factory, in a brochure from the Jaguar-Daimler Heritage Trust outlining this as visitors enter the Jaguar reception area to begin their tour. This fact is further reinforced on a local

roundabout near the factory, with a large Spitfire sculpture of the fighters in a dogfight during the "Battle of Britain".

In addition the factory site is also the previous location of the Fisher-Ludelow, who made many body shells for Standard-Triumph, and Morris Minor, and then British Motor Corporation in 1953 At one time the Nash-Metropolitan was also made here. Jaguar took over in 1980, producing the XJS sports and XJ

saloon models which were assembled and painted before being sent to Brown's Lane for final assembly.

Upon being greeted warmly at the Jaguar reception area, with an offer of hot tea on a traditional damp English morning, and after the Jaguar orientation film in their theatre, my motoring colleague and I were given bright safety-yellow vests with a leaping Jaguar on the back, and introduced to our tour guide. Tom was one of four dapperly-dressed tour guides, all in sport jackets and matching Jaguar green and yellow ties. We had the luxury of having one tour guide for just the two of us, so we could ask ample questions of this now-retired former Jaguar factory assembly line supervisor for door gaps. Tom started work for Jaguar in 1966 in Brown's Lane.

As expected, we were told we could not take any photos inside or outside, once we were inside the gated area of the factory. In addition,

because of some new product testing in the fitting out building (finishing), we would not be allowed in that section, which is usually included in the tour. Indeed, the building itself had bubble-wrap on the all windows, and doors with windows, so nothing could be seen inside. Our guide would only hint that things and designs were happening inside there, "...watch

this space; a lot of exciting things are happening at Jaguar". And indeed, during a walk

through the assembly-line area, we noticed several body shells for the new XF's sitting there. Interestingly enough, they were all LHD, and the barcode that each vehicle has on it said "normal hood", as opposed to what? Perhaps a new supercharger coming, that would need a hood scope? As Tom said, "watch this space". We got to walk through many areas of the plants, including the power train area which was pretty



interesting.

Jaguar manufacturers the XJ, XF, and XK in Castle Bromwich, so you'll have to guess at new model changes. From what we could tell, there was no influence from TATA Group, and it was explained to us that Jaguar has been told to follow through on the Five-Year plan that was included in the purchase by TATA.

Being their luxury sports car, they only make 620 units per week of the XF. There are robotics here, as they have about 145 robots, but everything is handcrafted after they are painted. There are 15 stages before they do go into the paint shop though. Each car also has a "history" book for it, that remains with Jaguar after it is completed (my colleague

has a Jaguar X-type Saloon wagon, and tried to get his "book", but they are unavailable to the general public Jaguar owners).

Tom told us that all the Jaguars sent to the US have the 4.2 engine, and unfortunately we cannot get the "fantastic" 2.7 diesel they produce.

From there we went to the Jaguar-Daimler Heritage Trust at Brown's Lane in Coventry. Sadly the old Jaguar factory at Brown's Lane, which many DVJC members had visited in the past, is now totally torn down, and the ground leveled off, nothing but rubble is left, although the Museum and Shop are still open and free to visitors.

"At one time Pennsylvania had over 1500 covered bridges. Today, 211 still survive with 12 bridges located here in Bucks County, 9 of them still open to traffic. Today we will drive



through five of our Covered Bridges that will connect us to a more rural landscape. When built, it was believed that covering a bridge could add 10 years life to the wooden structure. They were correct as many of these bridges still stand today. These bridges were built between 1832 and 1874, at a time when horse drawn buggies were the main means of transportation. During a trip from town by way of

covered bridge it was considered quite natural for a young man to steal a kiss from his female companion while passing through the darkened tunnel. Younger brothers and sisters would climb up into the rafters of the bridges to watch for couples on their way back from town. The final comment above says it's already time to start thinking about 2009 and Jaguar can celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Mark 2 saloon. This was one of Jaguars most successful products and this is illustrated by the fact that Jaguar produced roughly three times the number of Mark 2's to XK 120s, XK140s and XK150s. With 2009 in mind, John Murphy, Jim Shield and I visited the newly founded Simeone Foundation Museum located not far from Philadelphia Airport. We had the place to ourselves so were able to closely inspect each exhibit This is a dream come true for Dr. Simeone who has been collecting the "display of racing sports cars" since he was a young man. The sheer variety of cars takes the breath away (go to www.SimeoneMuseum.org to see). One of the unusual features is that most of the cars exhibited actually competed in the settings displayed. It is our intent to organize a club visit to the museum in March and, hopefully, with Dr Simeone himself giving us the tour. We will announce details shortly.

One of the thrills, for me, was seeing a 1953 Jaguar C-Type and a 1956 D-Type. Similar cars both won Le Mans and these particular cars came third in the 1953 and 1956 respectively Sebring 12-Hour race. Some time ago I wrote in these pages that I believed "my bum" had sat on the Connolly Leather seats of every model of Jaguar except the XJ 13, C-Type, and D-Type and there were the latter two standing there. It so happened that an attendant appeared while we were inspecting the C & D and Jim Shield

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
