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

### By-Laws Revision: A Message from the President

The September Purr carried a Copy of the Revised Constitution & By-laws for our members to read and make comments before receiving a ballot and instructions to ratify or reject the new Revision. The current By-Laws are dated November 1981.

The Constitution describes the purpose, qualifications, and governing body and the By-Laws are the rules by which we are governed.

The necessity to update the By-Laws was due to a change by the JCNA in defining "A Member" and the addition of a Youth Enthusiast category. A By-Laws committee was formed to decide what needed to be changed and restructure the Constitution & By-Laws to comply with the JCNA and "up-to-date" requirements. Several meetings were held to address changes to the current By-Laws line by line so that a comprehensive revised copy could be presented to the membership for their questions and comments. Usually a copy of the current By-Laws would be enclosed along with the revised edition, so that one could question or agree with the changes.

If need be, the unmarked version of the November 1981 Constitution & By-Laws are available to those that request a copy.

One of our members that read the revised version in the September Purr presented a series of questions/concerns to Brian Craig, the By-Laws Chairman. I thought it might be helpful to present his more salient concerns to our members, along with our response!

- Q.1 Is there a copy of the original Constitution & By-Laws of November '81 now in effect?
- A.1. Yes, and it is available to those who wish to receive a copy.
- Q.2. Article IV, Sec. A: Shouldn't the two-year terms be staggered, so that we don't have the entire executive committee change at one time?
- A.2. We discussed staggering the terms and acknowledged the limitations. However, it was agreed that the process would only be complicated by a yearly procedure that would be required to stagger the positions. The reality of getting people to serve is difficult enough.
- Q.3. Shouldn't we limit the number of consecutive terms an elected officer should serve?
- A.3. Term limits were discussed, but practicality again took precedence. Since I have been President, I have made several requests in person, to people to serve in various offices and always appeal to members present at the Holiday Partys. If anyone thought I should have asked them please, ask me!
- Q.4. Shouldn't we continue to have a clause to impeach officer's if they are absent from four of seven Quarterly Officer's meetings?
- A4. No, since that is highly unlikely and electronic reports can be provided via e-mail for officer's not able to attend a meeting. For example: we have an officer who is on reserve duty which takes precedence of attendance. Officers are responsible people, and if circumstances are such, they resign voluntarily.
- Q.5. Article II SecIV: Shouldn't the treasurer be the officer to sign a check that exceeds 500 dollars along with another officer of the executive committee? (President, VP, Sec. & Treas.)
- A.5 The Committee did not feel the Treasurer needed to be one of the signatures because he may not be available when needed, especially in an emergency. The President and Vice President have checks to cover these situations. The Treasurer reports all transactions at each quarterly meeting. Any misappropriation would surface at that time. Routinely, our Treasurer issues and signs checks to be countersigned by the President and any amount exceeding a budgeted item must be approved by the board, either at the meeting or by phone or e-mail.

## By-Laws Revision: A Message from the President . . . (cont.)

- Q.6. Article V, Sec. 1, Subsection C: Allowing the executive committee to determine if a proposed change to the Constitution & By-Laws should be submitted to the membership for a vote is questionable!
- A.6. The intention of the review is to see if the proposed amendment is appropriate for presentation to the membership. Sometimes the proposed change is misinterpreted or covered somewhere else and the screening process simply insures this doesn't happen. Of course the person is informed of the outcome.

Director Glenn Davis, a practicing attorney, took this on as a project at my request for it was obvious we needed legal advice to compose the necessary papers to update our non-Profit Corporation status with the State of PA and the IRS. We owe Glenn a debt of gratitude for his pro bono contribution.

As a Committee we have spent **our** time to present to you this revised version to hopefully-"**Get** it right"! Please, take **your** time to read it over and mail in **your Vote!** It will be greatly appreciated.



#### THIS AND THAT

I have varied reports for Tata (Jaguar/JLR) in the autumn of this year of Grace – Space – and Pace. As we have seen it's a dynamic car market place. After many months of discussions with Lord Mendelson, the Uk Government Business Secretary, JLR floated a commercial loan because they feared government participation in their business plans. Mendelson unveiled the scheme in January when he pledged to support investment programs of British-based manufacturers with loans and loan guarantees. Up until now no loans have been awarded. However on September 18 Tata became the first company (It's only been 8 months!) to secure a loan from the scheme. The \$16 million from the Government will support the \$38 million of Tata's own investment in plans to develop and manufacture Tata branded electric cars in the Uk.

I can see it now:

Our UK correspondent PGT has been strongly promoting a small car which he firmly believes should be called a "Jagette" and perhaps this is it. Perhaps he is onto a winner and the salvation of our favorite brand. I can see it now. "Jagette runs Porsche and

BMW into the ground. McLaren Mercedes give up." The company, it is said, is now "considering locations" in Britain to set up a factory. Along with the Tata Motors European Technical Center at the University of Warwick, which already employs 180 people, the project could support hundreds of jobs. Lord Mendelson said, "Today we are backing Tata as Tata backs Britain." Rule Britania!!

Anyone want to bet on who will be first on the road with an electric car ... John Murphy with his XJ13 or Tata? My money's on John. To be factual Tata has already developed a four-seater electric vehicle in partnership with Norwegian group Miljo Grenland/Innovasjon. Production of the vehicle should begin in Norway later this year.

Shortly after the above announcement JLR said that it would decide in 2010 whether to close its factory at Castle Bromwich in the West Midlands, which makes Jaguars, or its factory at Solihull, which makes Range

Rovers. It was said that there would be no compulsory lay-offs involved in the closure. It also said that 800 new jobs would be created at Halewood on Mersyside because the new Range Rover LRX will be built there. As we said last month, the decision to end production of the X-Type at the end of the year will I am sure influence all these factors. I discovered that total production of the X-Type, as at the end of 2008, was in excess of 200,000. You have to wonder what all these users will do when it's time to trade on. Many will not be fortunate enough to be able to afford an XF but by then there could be a number of lightly used S-Types and XF's available.

#### PEBBLE BEACH

As many of us are aware, one of the most coveted awards is to win at Pebble Beach, perhaps the most prestigious Concours in the world. Jaguars are rarely mentioned but this year there were two remarkable strikes. All entries are by invitation only so the first thing is to get an invitation to attend and I must confess that, how to do that, is a bit of a mystery. Well Robin and Alison Green were asked to bring their SS Jaguar100 and they won, with 100 points, the "European Classic Open" class. I understand that the car was only one of two to be awarded 100 points. To do this at Pebble is an outstanding achievement as it is always in the jaundiced eye of the judge.

This reminds me of a tale John Murphy told me regarding his SS100. John was getting his car valued for insurance and an expert came to his home to do this. When the valuation came to him he thought it was low so he called the insurance company for an explanation. They said the experts report said there was wear on the seats and the roof. John challenged this as both the seats and the roof were new and had not been used since the upgrade!!!! So how do you get 100 points at Pebble???

The second strike was made by XKC007 which was the first C-Type delivered to North America and was driven by Phil Hill to victory at Elkhart Lake. Phil's son, Derek, drove the car onto the rostrum at RM Auctions where it achieved a world record price at auction for a C-Type of \$2,530,000. In private sales C-Types have fetched in excess of this figure

#### WATKINS GLEN INTERNATIONAL

September 10 thru 13 was the 17<sup>th</sup> annual Grand Prix Festival of Watkins Glen and the 61<sup>st</sup> anniversary of the first post-World War 2 road race in the United States which was held in the Glen. Glorious with cars that brought memories of my youth flooding back.

Thursday the 10<sup>th</sup> was warm and sunny as we left Plymouth Meeting with club member Mike Wolf leading the way in his E-Type coupe and my wife and I following in the modern XK Coupe — up Route 476 to Wilkes-Barre at a steady 70 mph which suited me just fine. The only incident was when I hit a pothole in the middle of my lane. Yes on 476! I thought it had taken my passenger side front wheel off. These low profile tires don't absorb such a violent punch at high speed. The steering did not give any problems then or since.

From Wilkes-Barre, Mike led us through miles of glorious country-side stopping at an interesting and unusual place for lunch. Burger for Mike, Chili for me, and coffee and ice cream for Mo. We arrived at our destination, 289 miles, at 5:00 PM and met at the wonderful lakeside home of DVJC members Susan and Ef Adnopoz who had organized the weekend. I was in heaven as I had been fortunate enough to drive all those miles looking at the hind quarters of an E-Type Coupe. Could life be better? Longtime DVJC members Kit and Paul Racette had driven down from Montreal in their 1996 Corvette (14,000 miles on the clock) and we all enjoyed a dinner kindly prepared for us by Susan.

On Friday we all met at the Best Western and led by Ef we set off for a country drive. The views and scenery of the Finger-Lakes gives so much to be visually enjoyed and the line of cars added to the enjoyment. Our destination was a country market where Mennonite farmers auctioned their produce to the highest bidders. There were long lines of trucks all laden with a variety of vegetables, flowers and plants. I nearly bought a large load of cabbages for a dollar each. If I had and sold them on it would have been better than the stock market. It looked to me that it was as much a social event for the farmers and their families as the ladies met in tight knots discussing the topics of the day. Really colorful and something unique to see.

From there we descended into Watkins Glen,

parked our cars, and walked into the town center. As we walked a variety of old and modern sports cars passed by but mainly 50's 60's vintage. It really was a most amazing awakening for me. Having been born and raised in England from 1931 until we moved to Jamaica in 1970 and having owned my first Jaguar, a 1956 MK VII, purchased for \$750 in pristine condition and a 3.8 Mk2 from 1962 and then a 3.4 S-Type from 1960 which I traded for a Triumph Spitfire (Yes, I did.... please forgive me) to see these cars as the center of every ones attention was a revelation.

The main street was full of vendors selling their usual wares and crowds of people enjoying the spectacle. A special area was reserved for a Concours and there were a number of interesting cars including exotic Bentley Continentals, Jaguars including an XK 150 S, which brought a tear to the eyes as it was not as good as my late model, and many others of Britain's motoring history. We stopped at the famous Smalley's Garage



and had a chat with the famous man himself.

As Morgan were celebrating their 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary they were the featured marque this year. As such we witnessed a diverse selection of Morgan's parading at speed down the Glen's main street in an official acknowledgement. On Sunday at the track they held the Feature Race – Centennial Jubilee 100 years of Morgan. This was an interesting event because all the cars had been in preliminary races and set an individual time for the distance. They were then handicapped with the intent that if the handicap was right all the cars should finish together in a straight line. Of course they didn't but it was fun watching Morgan's that had been souped-

up going at high speed and three wheelers with J.A.P. engines looking as if they had a force of nature holding them back.

# J.A.P. Engines: Engines manufactured by J.A. Prestwich Industries in England.


J.A.Prestwich was responsible for the design and manufacture of engines used in a great many famous marques and had numerous racing successes. JAP engines were still used in speedway bikes well into the 1960's. Complete motorcycles were built from 1904 to 1908, and subsequently the factory concentrated on supplying its proprietary engines to other manufacturers. After 1945, production was taken over by the Villiers factory. *Mike Wolfe* 

Saturday and Sunday were race days with the ladies going site seeing with Susan, to their great enjoyment. Saturday were qualifying races and Sunday the final races. There are many vantage points to watch the cars in action. The variety of cars is amazing all entered by their owners at their own cost, which in many cases must be very substantial. Drivers have their team of mechanics and their motor homes and self contained workshops. 18 wheeler trucks would be dwarfed by these.

To me the racing is good but the real joy is walking around the pits and being able to get up close to the cars. We saw such cars on the track as Alfa Romeo's, Austin/Morris Coopers, Marcos Mini GT, Fiat Abarth, MG/Triumphs/Austin Healey's/Porsche/Corvettes/Morgan in all their many forms and years of manufacture. Also represented was Lotus, Lola, Elva Courier, Aston Martin, McLaren, Ginetta GT, Shelby Cobra, AC Cobra, March 817 Can Am, BMW 2002 and many others including, would you believe, a Ford Pinto!!

Jaguars were represented by the three beautiful E-Type Roadsters entered by Donovan Motorsports of Lenox MA. These cars were sponsored by Jaguar as they did a countrywide tour at the introduction of the Aluminum bodied XJ 8's. Also there was a very rare Lister-Jaguar colored white & blue entered by Michael

Silverman of Scottsdale, AZ and a superbly prepared 1962 E-Type in blue & yellow owned by Farrell Preston from Largo, FL. The best of the Jags was the Group 44 XJR 5 in white and green, driven to first place in 1985 at Le Mans by Bob Tullius , Claud Ballot-Lena & Chip Robinson. What a monster when compared to all the others.



The oldest car entered was a 1926 Bugatti type 35 B followed closely by a 1929 "Ardent Alligator". If the designers of all these historic old cars could see them racing at twice the speed they were designed for their faces would be wreathed in smiles.

Club Treasurer, Gerry Kunkle and his son joined us on Saturday. Both Friday and Saturday nights we all had dinner at very good restaurants and on Sunday Susan and Ef Adnopoz gave a farewell barbeque at their home. In the morning they had led the way on a scenic drive through most beautiful country side and after the

#### **BUCKINGHAM CONCOURS**

As always, it seems, the Buckingham Concours d'Elegance got the weather for their 11<sup>th</sup> annual show. The day started off with their traditional breakfast of bacon, eggs, sausage, champagne & orange juice, etc. This really is a most enjoyable way to start a car show. Judging by the crowded and overflowing tent which held the food and tables the car drivers and their families thought so as well. This show is one of my favorites and now that they are holding this show on a different date than Radnor Hunt, it makes it possible to be at both. I did not get to Radnor as we had the club event in Watkins Glen.

The setting is ideal and the organization of the show cars puts European and British Cars in close proximity and the long history of American vehicles also together. The final count of all cars must have been in excess of 200. On arrival we were presented with a full bag of goodies including a full set of screwdrivers and a lavishly prepared program containing many color photos of participating cars. This also contained a very moving tribute to Al Pincus titled "The Tale of a Young Dreamer" written with great affection by

Jan Tompkins, one of the show organizers.

There were eleven Jaguars not counting the Mk IV and the S-type of Al Pincus. Club President Charlie Olson was there with his 1994 XJS convertible with the top down as a Display Entrant. This is a very striking car in Kingfisher blue with less than 32,000 miles and of course as time goes on the XJS is finding much favor with collectors. A really good one is harder and harder to find.

Jeanette and Stanley Loose brought their 1953 XK 120 OTS (First in class) and P Dale Shafer had a 1952 XK 120 OTS. Bob Delucia had a very smart XJ6 Vanden Plas and I came in my 420 Sedan. The remaining cars were all E-types. Ed Marozza had a 1967 OTS (Best in Show), Robert Stieg a 1970 Coupe, Les Anderson a 1969 OTS, Jill Schader- Powell came in her 1967 OTS (always very good to see Jill at this event), Jay Timbers' 1967 2+2 was in pristine shape and Bruce Kossar placed Best in class with his 1971 OTS.

Out of all the cars at the show that caught my attention was a 1947 Bentley Mk VI Cabriolet manufactured by Franay of France, owned by Gene Epstein and had 8,000 hours spent on restoration! The second was the unusual and extremely rare Facel Vega.

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#### PhillyMini and Delaware Valley Jaguar Clubs Joint Rally

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
