



The Prez Sez May 2010

I've just returned from the "Friday only" rally in Millville, New Jersey sponsored by the

Northeast Rally Club. In last month's Purr I tried to interest club members in taking advantage of the "one day rally" which was free for those that wanted to participate in a JCNA sanctioned rally without the cost and time of the weekend event. It was disappointing to me that no one **new** to rallying took advantage of this opportunity. However, it did allow me, with Mike Tate as my navigator, to participate as well as Tom and Nancy Jones who could only do a Friday rally. The weather was perfect and the food was great provided by the Thunderbolt club members.



The next opportunity for a rally will be the Stone Barn event (see flier) for those that choose to participate when arriving at the Longwood Gardens starting point. I want to emphasize that this is a very simple, fun Rally called a Monte Carlo. As the group of cars assemble (not necessarily all Jags) at the starting point you will be asked if you want to participate in the rally or caravan . The caravan will be led by Kurt Rappold and the remaining cars participating in the Rally will follow in a manner as per instructed. The plan is to have everyone arrive at the Stone Barn around noon or before the champagne is finished by those that decided to drive directly from their residence! I jest, of course.

A week earlier, on April 24, Kurt Rappold and I conducted the first of two Judges Training Courses. Each judge was presented with a new "Judging Rule Book" 2010 edition incorporating all the changes thru the previous years. As you might know lots of pages needed to be inserted to make those changes and it was time to issue the new book.

We were delighted to certify two new Judges, Richard Carnegie, a new member, and longtime member Mike



Joyce. Perfect weather allowed outdoor judging practice on two Jaguars. The group was divided into two teams, one for the Champion Division and one for the Driven and with clip boards in hand, each team took turns judging. Then Kurt had them switch Divisions. I placed emphasis on correctly using the Judges scoring sheets, especially recording of the amount of point deductions as prescribed in Judge's Rule Book.

Our Concours is just 5 weeks away and it's vital to get enough certified judges to handle the task of judging over fifty cars in a timely manner. I'm hoping the appeal I have made to the new members will result in their attending the Judging Class this Saturday, May 8th at 8:00 AM, at the Oakbourne Mansion meeting room.

I'm also requesting volunteers for those of you not entering your Jaguar in the Concours to serve with the group involved with spectator parking. A great way for our youth enthusiast members to work in relief of others during the show. I'll need "runners" to take the completed judging forms from the entrant's cars to the score keeper. We also need help for spotting the entrants into their parking area assigned for the Champion or Driven Divisions.

Please let me know that you'll be willing to help with setting up with tents, equipment, and direction signs on a weekday evening before the show.

Friday was a short afternoon rally of only 126 miles and four (4) check points. We had 23 cars out there, five of which achieved the ACE Award — a perfect leg.

Saturday was rather long at 231 miles for 22 cars with five (5) ACE Awards. We saw many wild turkeys out in the fields we passed. It seems they know it's not hunting season. Due to all the marshlands we toured, many turtles were crossing the little roads. We observed a guy towing his big boat on a trailer stop then walk back and pick up a small box turtle to carry it to the other side of the road. That was nice to see, a big human being "saving" one little turtle. The two white swans we saw two years ago in a pond near Millville were still "out there" making a perfect photo.

After some really serious rallying from 7 AM till 5:30 PM and 8 check points we came back into town and the Thunderbolt Club House. The men of the Club were cooking all day for our (3 types of chicken) dinner, hot



roast beef, mushrooms, and green string beans.

The entire Jaguar Club was able to fit around one round table located strategi-

cally by a row of "coolers" full of cold drinks and ice. It was hot out there Saturday.

When we left, as we drove 9 miles back to the motel, we came across one of our members in the 1934 Ford Indy car. We stopped to lend a hand and found "no spark." Since Bob and I both had our share of the old

Ford flat heads we knew a lot about some of the symptoms and corrective action. Within a short time "we had em runnin." We then followed then back to the Wyndham, a beautiful hotel.

Sunday began with a nice breakfast at the Wyndham, then off to the starting point of the rally. We wound up on the western shore at a town called Fortescue. This is an old fishing town on the Delaware Bay. It can be a rough place to be during a big storm as it is wide open out in the marshes on the giant bay.

We then made our way back to Thunderbolt Motor Sports Park near Mille Airport to observe vintage cars racing and CCA Motorcycle racing. We lined up for 5 "tour" laps of the sports car track which was fun to try it out

We went back to the Thunderbolt Club where we presented awards and had an egg brunch. Even though our event attendance was down we still raised \$3,650 to donate to the Thunderbolt Club which is used for scholarships for young people's education. This is a very good way to invest in the future citizens of your community.

Our next rally will also be free and Monte Carlo in style. It is not a time, speed, distance as the Northeast Rally Club is. See you at the Longwood Gardens parking lot on May 23rd at 11:00 AM. Be early as we depart at 11:00 AM and I wish to pass out the rally route instructions. This one will be "short and quick" for those with low endurance. Our short Sunday rally took 5 hours. The Monte Carlo to The Stone Barn lunch is less than one (1) hour.

The next Northeast Old Car Rally is scheduled to run the last 3 day weekend in October. It benefits the community of Millsboro and its fire company. Costumes are in order on our fun list for this event.



The last Friday in April turned out to be a glorious day with clear blue skies as I pointed the XK Coupe

The journey down was fun. The Jag was so well behaved, the New Jersey countryside was laid out in its Spring splendor, the roads were clear and I could not think of anything better. I stopped at a market garden and purchased a few plants and some fresh vegetables so that I could again have a look at this wonderful machine that was effortlessly cruising to the club. Oh Joy!!!!

Arriving at 11 AM there were a number of vintage machines already assembled. I had answered our

A WET CAT & A HAPPY CAT

Under the above headline AutoWeek magazine announced "Jag's new XJ can handle anything: Rain, hurricanes and even luxury competitors". They went on to describe their test of the new XJ in foul weather conditions outside Paris. The car is exceptional to drive and to look at was their summary. The entry price is \$72,500 with the supercharged XJL Supersport at \$115,000. When we first came to live in the USA in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan in 1974 we purchased a very respectable house for \$74,000 and a Ford Thunderbird for \$5,600 so in the intervening years inflation has moved on but more in the car market than for houses!

THE X-TYPE WAGON

Last month I mentioned in the Purr that the X-Type Wagon had become an Icon in the USA and that we had, to my knowledge, two in the club. It appears I was wrong. Club member Alex La Roche pointed out to me that he owned two, not one, as I believed. As the vehicle is such a rarity and few people have seen one I am going to enter mine (my wife's) in the forthcoming Concours on June 5. Of course the rarest wagon actually manufactured by Jaguar was a one off MK 2. I will bring photos of this wagon taken in Philadelphia when it visited the city.

JAGUAR LAND ROVER RETURN TO PROFIT

In February, Tata Motors revealed that JLR had returned to profit for the first time in more than a year. They recorded a net profit of 4.6 bn rupees (\$103million) in the final three months of 2009 which is the first profit since the third quarter of 2008. Land Rover sales increased 34% and Jaguar 11.5%. Also it is thought that Land Rover sold 11,000 units in the UK in March which is more than any other month since the brand was founded in 1948. Amazing what a large dump of snow can do!. Yes they got it too! This of course is great news for Tata who since buying JLR from Ford have had to deal with losses of \$420 m as the economic crisis hit. However despite these losses it is most encouraging to see that Tata has not cut back on its product releases and product development, thus keeping to its promise when buying JLR. You will recall this was "We are in it for the long term"

SIR STERLING MOSS TAKES A DRIVE DOWN A LIFT SHAFT

Sir Sterling, one of the greatest F1 drivers never to win the World Championship and winner of many races driving Jaguars, narrowly missed killing himself recently when he took a 50 ft plunge down an empty elevator shaft. Sir Sterling, now 80 years of age, was in his home in London. He was leaving to go out to dinner with his wife Suzie and son and daughter in law Elliot and Helen. Sterling and Helen went for the lift on the third floor and the others took the stairs. All he remembers is saying to Helen "Let's go" and stepping side-

ways into the lift then plunged down this big black hole. Sir Sterling had landed feet first at the bottom of the narrow lift shaft, but the force of the fall propelled him backwards through the lift door leading to his basement office. He was found alive and telling everyone not to panic! He was taken to the trauma unit at the Royal London Hospital where it was found that he had fractured both his ankles, four broken bones in his right foot, a chipped vertebrae, a badly bruised shoulder and some interesting X-Ray's to add to his collection. The cause of the failure of the non appearance of the elevator was electrical.

Sir Sterling retired from racing, having won 212 races, following a near fatal crash at Goodward Race Track in 1962. This accident left him in a coma for a month and partially paralyzed for six months. He is recovering well from this latest incident. Just 5 days after the accident he asked a friend to bid \$1.705 million for a rare 1962 Porsche RS 61 Spyder to give him something to look forward to when he is recovered.
