#### The Prez Reflects:

All seven of the current Officers of the Executive committee will need to run for re-election as their term expires December 31st 2010.

This will be my **fourth** complete year **as President** and **I will not be running for office for 2011, <u>unless</u>, I can obtain and appoint an assistant V.P. that will be a <b>non-executive member** to assist the President and learn the scope of the job. I offer this opportunity to all of our members, who otherwise might never consider being a candidate for this office. This would not change the By-laws and the elected V.P would automatically be President in case the President would become incapacitated, according to the By-laws.

**President:** I'm basically responsible for the overall direction and well-being of the club. I'm required to preside at all executive meetings, fill vacancies and appoint heads of committees, and follow-up on tasks of those appointed without micro managing.

Vice President: His main focus is membership development and that's very important! In working with the Director of Membership, they form a team that adds and renews, including follow-up, of those who do not renew. As for obtaining new members, we all work on that!

The Treasurer is basically accountable to record receipts and expenditures for our club. In addition, he currently acts as the Ads Chairman, to promote our club to new customers and collect revenue in support of our club. We owe a fiduciary responsibility to them to issue one Purr newsletter per month. Also, we owe that to our members as an information responsibility and is the life blood of our club. He also works in conjunction with the membership director to account for the dues owed to the JCNA.

**The Secretary** is accountable for taking minutes at all executive and official meetings, mailing out or dispatching correspondence as directed by the President ,and arranging for the filing of the official minutes and documents in a formal manner.

**The Directors,** there are three of them, Director of Membership, Directors of Sanctioned Events, Social Activities, and coordination of "Other Events" who develop an activities calendar for the year.

That's a brief description of the responsibilities of the executive group of officers.

If you look at the category "DVJC officers Information" on page 3 of the Purr, there are many tasks that are available for you to volunteer as an assistant to one of the members listed. It's a way of learning how they operate, without taking on the prime responsibility!

During the month we have the Radnor Hunt show on the 12<sup>th</sup> and the Buckingham Car show on the 19th — both being exceptional shows with several hundreds of top classic cars being shown. For many years these two shows were on the same date buy now they are separated so we should see even greater numbers of both spectators and cars at each show. Taking my car to Buckingham is one of my favorite events because, of course, they throw in a full breakfast for two, starting at 8:00 am, for each car entered in the show. So the day can start with all these forbidden things: orange juice/champagne, scrambled eggs, bacon, bagels/toast etc. followed by a day (hopefully) in the sun and a feast for the eyes with all

those exotic vehicles. The good weather must continue with Bugatti blue skies each day.

Then, on October 17 Ella Jane and Gerry Kunkle are organizing a DVJC drive to Hawk Mountain which will be the clubs way to honor the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Jaguar badge. The Philadelphia Inquirer September 2 announced that Hawk Mountain was "Tops in hawk-

As outlined in the August Purr September 5 the UK Jaguar Enthusiast Club has its "Drive It Day" to celebrate the birth of the Jaguar name 75 years ago. September 23 is the day the Jaguar Company celebratea its birth because it was on this date that in 1935 the Jaguar badge was coupled with the SS 100 Sports Car and the SS Sedan. William Lyons chose the name that, thankfully, is still with us to-day. Not only did Sir William have a great eye for design but he knew how to choose a name that depicted a wild animal with a beautiful muscular and stealthy body that became encapsulated in the immortal phrase "Grace, Space and Pace." I have said this before but I believe it's worth repeating...:- The custom of the day was to name cars and companies after the founder..like..Ferrari after

Enzo Ferrari; Morris Garages (MG) after its founder William Morris; Morgan by H.F.S. Morgan; Ford after Henry Ford, Bugatti after Ettore Bugatti; Cunningham after James Cunningham; Prince Henry Vauxhall introduced the Vauxhall now owned by GM; Adam Opel introduced Opel etc, etc so to his everlasting credit William Lyons resisted calling his cars "Lyon" or even "Lion" — they just would not have purred off the tongue with such a growl. However you pro-

nounce it "JagUAr" or JagWIre" it expresses the breed

#### SOME HISTORIC FACTS

We all know, I am sure, that Jaguar is one of the world's greatest marques. In 1922 William Warmsley and William Lyons founded the Swallow Sidecar Company. The SS Series was launched and in 1948 the XK engine was introduced.

## **Roving Reporter (cont.)**

This engine was intended for their new Sedan the Mk V11. To introduce it at the Earlsourt London Motor Show they hurriedly built a sports car body using aluminum. They only expected to sell a few of what they called the XK 120 their main expectation being the MKV11. The XK 120 was the fastest production car at that time and was an unexpected runaway success. Steel bodies were introduced after the first 200 came off the production line and the aluminum cars became known as the "lightweights" now worth in the \$100k's, Lyons sensed that the best way to showcase his products was to enter them in the Le Mans race but he would only do this if he was reasonably certain of success. To achieve the success he needed, the amazing C-type and D-type were introduced dominating with five victories between 1951 to 1955.

In 1961 at Geneva the motoring world was shocked and amazed with the introduction of the Etype which is still regarded as the most beautiful car ever made. Another triumph followed with what was hailed as the best sedan in the world. The Series 1 XJ 6. This was introduced with the XK six cylinder engine and the car later shared this with Jaguar's mighty V12 engine which led to further success at Le Mans with victories in 1988 and 1990. During these times the company had survived a disastrous fire at their Browns Lane factory in 1957, the takeover of both Daimler in 1960 and Coventry Climax Engines Ltd., makers of F1 and many other engines, the merger with British Motor Holdings (BMH) in 1966 and in 1968 BMH's merger with Leyland becoming part of the disastrous new British Leyland Motor Company. In 1975 they introduced the controversial XJ-S which now is becoming a sought after classic in its own right. In 1984 they were "floated" on the Stock Exchange as a newly privatized business and then in 1989 Ford buys it out, modernizes its plants, and brings it close to Aston Martin and Land Rover leading to the sale in 2009 of JLR to Tata Corporation of India with all design, development and manufacturing remaining in the United Kingdom.

Tata has really honored all the promises it made when negotiating the purchase with Ford making major investments in both top management and product. It has introduced exciting new cars with the XF, XJ, and XK which are having a big success against the competition in the market place.

William Lyons was knighted by the Queen, and Mr & Mrs Lyon's became Sir William and Lady Greta in 1957. In 1972, aged 70, Sir William retires from the business. He dies aged 84 in 1985. (September 4 1901 to February 8 1985)

Coincidently I was thrilled to receive in the mail from our correspondent in the UK, PGT, an original copy of "The Autocar" magazine dated May 3 1935. It has 160+ pages and is priced six pennies!. The front cover announces that the magazine was founded in 1895 and that this is the "Royal Silver Jubilee Number 1910 - 1935". As PGT points out its contents illustrate the amazing progress that had been made in those 25 years in the motor industry. The adverts are a joy to read and the cars for sale pages are a list of todays classics. Examples:- S.S. 1 Saloon 360 pounds (With 20 hp engine 365 pounds); S.S. 1 Open Sports 4 -seater 335 pounds and 340; Rolls Royce 25, immediate delivery, latest chassis with limousine coachwork by Thrupp and Maberly 1,560 pounds; Very special type 40 Bugatti fitted with 1934 2-4 seater drop head coupe body with flush fitting indicators and latest type guards and running boards, cellulosed blue, special chromium plated radiator shell with quick action filler cap, Ashby steering wheel, engine has been rebored and chassis and gearbox overhauled, new battery and 5 excellent Dunlop's all at a cost of 200 pounds, undoubtedly the prettiest type 40 on the road. Price 146 pounds or exchange!; Among many Chryslers for sale there's a 1929 model "70" seven passenger Coachbuilt Limousine, leather throughout, occassionals face forward, exceptionally good order, 95 pounds.

New Studebaker sedans sold from 298 pounds and you could "Motor to Music" with an Echo Car Radio for 20 pounds. So it all sounds wonderful to-day but to put it in perspective my Father who had a pretty good job I know earned 600 pounds a year in the mid 1930's and he drove a Rover Sports and my Mother had a Morris Cowley two seater with a dickie seat, which held a further two, in the back. So it was pretty much the same as to day re the relationship of cost to earnings.

I wonder where the motoring world will be in another 75 years when Jaguar will be celebrating its 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary. I am sure they will be there but there is one certainty I will not be! Enjoy the next two months and I look forward to seeing you at one of the events taking place or all of them. Remember it






