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

SO MUCH HAPPENING IN THE JAGUAR WORLD

"What are you thinking about ?" asked Mo, my better half. I gave her my standard reply "What to write in the Purr this month." This reply I have found does not solicit any further questions as she is not remotely interested in what I am going to write so I can go on with my real thoughts....IE...."What can I possibly write this month that will keep our members interest?"

Well this month it is easy; there's The River Horse Brewery run on 5/7; the Concours on June 4; the E-Type parade on June 5; the C-Type 60th celebrations; Brian Redman at the Simeone Museum with the Group 44 E-Type 5/6; the unveiling in Geneva of Jaguar's most expensive model since the XJ220....the XKR-S at \$160,000; the soon to be announced 2.2 liter diesel XF; the award to the XK as "the most stylish coupe" on the market; the 100 years of the Indy 500 and the Monte-Carlo Rally; the 50 year celebration of the MG Midget, also the 50th birthday's of the Jaguar MKX, the Mini Cooper and the Triumph TR 4; the 40th anniversary, March 1971, of Jaguar's V12 engine; the news that Jaguar plans a new engine factory employing 1,000 people; 100years since the birth of Juan Manuel Fangio; the emergence of JLR's owner Tata as a global powerhouse; yes...yes... did you see THE wedding. ? Mixed in with all those Rolls Royces and Bentleys was the new Jaguar XJL.

It really held its own. It carried Kate's Mother and Brother. So the Middletons really got lucky not only adding a Prince to their family but getting a ride on clear roads in a XJL!

So much happening and most of it reflecting the past so the fact that Jaguar is planning an engine factory either in India or England is the best of everything. Reflecting on past success is always satisfying and makes me realize not only did Jaguar build beautiful car bodies but they designed outstanding engines that powered those amazing bodies to racing success. The 6 cylinder XK engine and the wonderfully silent and powerful V!2. Where would those bodies have been without them? The combination shook the world in 1951 when the XKC (or C -type) took Le Mans 24 Hours at its first attempt and followed up with a 1, 2, 4 in 1953. This was followed up eight years later in 1961 with the introduction of the E-Type or, as it was known in the USA, the XK-E As I have told you before, it is told that Managing Director Lofty England said to a customer complaining that his *E*-Type was rusting "we only sold you the engine...we gave you the body to carry it away in!" Presently Jaguar engines have been supplied by Ford but with their dynamic expansion plans they are confirming their intent to be in charge of their own destiny with the announcement of the engine factory plan.

All this is happening because of the newly assembled management team and the "give it a go" attitude of Tata Corporation. When Tata purchased Land Rover & Jaguar it was said that their main interest was Land Rover. With the success of the present range of Jaguars that has changed. Many people sneered when they mentioned that Jaguar was owned by an Indian Company called Tata. To me it was a reminder of my days in Detroit when the local car people sneered at the Japanese manufacturers! So you don't fall into the same trap let me tell you something about Tata

TATA GLOBAL POWERHOUSE

It is said that under Ratan Tata the business group that bears his name has transformed itself from an Indian giant into a global powerhouse. He focused on six industries that have provided most of its revenues since 2000 – steel, motor vehicles, power, telecoms, information technology, and hotels. The group also championed globalization. Foreign acquisitions have grown dramatically. Between 1995-2003 Tata companies made, on average, one purchase a year, in 2004 they made six; and in 2005-06 more than 20. Tata Tea in 2000 purchased British Company, Tetley Tea, for \$450 million. 2007 Tata Steel purchased Corus, Europe' second largest steel maker for \$12..1 billion. In 2008 Tata Motors paid \$2.3 billion for Jaguar Land Rover. In total Tata spent about \$20 billion on foreign companies. It now earns three fifths of its revenue abroad and employs more British workers than any other manufacturer and two of its largest companies, Tata Motors and Tata Communications, are listed on the New York Stock Exchange. In total they have 98 operating companies and it is said that total revenues in 2009-10 will be \$67.4 billion. After a rocky start with JLR it is expected they will make \$1 billion in profits this year!

DVJC Visits the UK for a Motoring Tour

Delaware Valley Jaguar Club member Bob De Lucia, along with fellow Jaguar owners Mark Bulwicz (Radience Red 2005 x-type estate) and Lou DiFabio (Pacific Blue 2001 XK8 Hardtop) had a long weekend trip to the UK in March of 2011 to attend several motoring events.

Mark Bulwicz and I arrived a day early and visited the "London Transport Museum", in the theatre district at Covent Gardens. This museum is a "must" as it explains the various transports of London along the Thames, an excellent history of the Tube, and the iconic red double-decker Routemaster buses. <u>http://www.ltmuseum.co.uk/</u>

Our other travel companions, Lou DiFabio and Steve Klein arrived at Heathrow the next day and off we were in our rental car for a day of exploring south of London and Heathrow. The first stop was the always enjoyable Brooklands Museum, in Weybridge, Surrey. Built in 1907 as the world's first purpose built motor circuit. A great combination of cars, aircrafts (including a full-size Concorde, built near Brookland), various displays, and of course the sight of part of the famed Brookland track, home to many historic races. The steepest section of this famed track is nearly 29' high before descending onto the "Railway Straight". Brooklands had a car auction the day before we arrived, and there were several nice Jaguars there, including several E-Types up for auction.

After lunch at Brooklands, it was off to the south and the "New Forest" for another great museum in the beautiful small town of Beaulieu, the "National Motor Museum". Since a few of us are regular viewers, it was fun to see the actual vehicles used for the various races and challenges that "Top Gear" usually presents. After a full day, we met classic British Motoring author Graham Robson for a few pints and dinner, catch-up on what he has been writing lately, and where he was headed, as well as some great conversation and some great stories. It is always a pleasure to get together again with this renown automobile journalist, author, and friend. It was really appreciated that Graham took the time to drive about 90 minutes each way to meet us, especially since he was departing for the USA and San Francisco on that Sunday. Graham has several projects in mind that would be of interest to mostly Triumph enthusiasts. The latest Robson book is a massive and detailed history of *STANDARD*, which mentions Triumph of course, but is really a corporate history of Standard from 1903, including the study of cars, people, factories, political events, money, etc, etc.. It is now finished - proofing and index writing were completed in March, printing is going ahead, and it will be available in the UK in May of 2012. In the USA, therefore through Amazon and other retail outfits soon after that. Graham is also working the 2013 Standard - Triumph event called *STAR90* (Standard Triumph Anniversary Rally).

The next day it was back north to Oxford, where we visited the "Oxford Bus Museum and the Morris Motors Experience" north of the city. A small, private run museum with just volunteer help, they graciously opened the museum for us and gave us a tour, even though they are usually closed on Saturday. The volunteer staff was very friendly and accommodating. Many of them are former Morris Motors employees. The museum is as it names implies, buses, and Morris Motors, home to Morris Garage (MG).

Since the four of us own Triumphs, we were there Sunday, March 6th to attend the 18th year of "The International Tri-umph Show & spares day" in Stoneleigh Park, Warwickshire, near Coventry. If you have never had the opportunity to attend one of these specialty margue shows, you are missing a great opportunity. With hundreds of vendors, and hundreds of driven vehicles, these shows are a brilliant experience for the classic car enthusiast. For example, every year there is also "The Jaguar Show Spares Day", which this year took place at the same location on March 27, 2011. Both these events featured over 200 stallholders from the U.K. and abroad. Among the thousands of visitors were the ever-increasing numbers from Europe and the rest of the world who found parts for the full range of Jaguar and Daimler models of all ages, both for routine servicing and maintenance and for major restorations. Many stalls are taken by enthusiasts clearing out their garages of miscellaneous spares. Regular stallholders range from established major Jaguar parts suppliers like SNG Barratt, restoration specialists to replica manufacturers.

Like the Jaguar Show, the Triumph show is still one of the largest indoor British car events in the world, there is a huge amount of old and new parts. In addition to the many vendors stalls, the show is also the opportunity for the many UK classic clubs to have club displays. The club displays are varied, with probably at least a ¹/₂ dozen various models per club display, as well as their own club regalia, DVD's, books, etc., for sale.

In addition to the clubs, there is usually a huge car corral, with many classic British cars for purchase. There are usually as many as 40 cars for sale, from restoration projects to roadworthy cars. And in addition to all that, there is special parking right next to the vendor sheds for the day, for those that drove a Triumph to the event (remember we are talking about March 6th, not warm). Fred Mack Jumps Out Of The Sky On His 100th Birthday!

It was a cool sunny morning on March 20, 2011, not a cloud in the sky. I got in my car and headed to Freefall Adventures in Williamstown, New Jersey to see Fred Mack jump out of an airplane on his 100th birthday! The thought of it scared me, and I wasn't even leaving the ground. Fred must have nerves of steel.

When I got there Channel 3, 6, and 29 vans were waiting for his arrival. Fred showed up with his cardiologist Elliot Gerber and then all the activity began. The cameras were set up, the other parachuters greeted him. Fred was the star of the show. A few times someone would ask Fred if he was ready to jump out of an airplane, every time he said "No." But he didn't look the least bit nervous. He just kept getting ready, putting on the equipment, and listening to last minute instructions. Finally it was time to get in the plane with his instructor and about 8 other parachuters. They all got in, the door shut, and the engines revved up and off the plane went down the runway and into the sky.

I stood near the landing field with some of Fred's friends talking about how we all can't believe he's actually jumping out of a plane doing a free fall from 13,000 feet (that's over 2 miles up) on his 100th birthday. We saw the plane go by way up there and waited a long time before finally seeing specs in the sky floating down. The other parachuters landed, one of them getting his camera ready to record Fred's landing. Then here came Fred and his instructor in a tandem parachute sliding in with a perfect landing. Everybody including the TV station camera men went running up to Fred. He seemed very calm and was happy to talk to everybody. He said it was difficult to hear what people were saying at first because his ears had popped, and he was still freezing since it was cold up there. Jericka Duncan from Channel 3 began interviewing him asking him how he enjoyed it. He said, "Well, I lived." She asked him why he did it. He said he promised his friends when he parachuted 5 years ago that he would do it again on his 100th birthday thinking that he wouldn't live that long, but he did so he didn't want to disappoint them. He said it was very exciting but very cold up there.

As he was being interviewed by this attractive woman, he said "Hey Spiked Heels, where did you get those shoes? How can you walk in them? There's a lot of force per square inch on the heels." There was Fred's engineering background talking. Everyone was laughing.

He also talked about his birthday party that was going to be at the Desmond Hotel later on in the day. She asked Fred if she can be his date to his birthday party. Fred said, "The party is 28 dollars a person. Ya got 28 dollars?" Again everyone was laughing hysterically.


