5 CONCEPTS THAT WILL CHANGE THE WAY WE DRIVE

So said the cover of this month's "Road & Track" and backed it up with a full frontal view of the Jaguar Concept C – X16. The four other filling in behind Jaguar are Lamborghini Aventador 1, Acura NSX, BMW i8, Cadillac Ciel. Their point is that these five super cars have real relevance to future production supercars. They tell us not to fear. "That in the face of higher fuel economy standards and stricter emission controls, the idea of fast, fun and fantastic 4 – wheel fantasies is not dead. These five concepts show, automakers are working overtime to blend efficient technology with stunning bodywork and outstanding dynamics. The future beckons."

So what do they say about the C-X16? Not a lot that has not been said before. Lightweight, hybrid power, aluminum construction etc., and that this car is still under development. "That cat, in the mold of the legendary XJ220, could be in production mid-decade. BUT what they do tell us is "Jaguar has announced that it will launch the F-Type 2- seater in 2013 with a design that is based on the C-X16" While the C-X16 is a coupe the F will be launched as a OTS with the coupe to follow at a later date.

Jaguar Director of Design, Ian Cullum, had this to say, "I have been waiting 10 years to do this car. We had two stabs at this previously. But the brand wasn't ready for it. Now we are and I think the car speaks for itself." Answering the question "Except for the top it will be the same as the C-X16?" he replied, "Concept cars are a bit of a tease. A lot of the times you don't deliver. But what's the point then. That's why we want the final product to be as close as possible." That is wonderful news because the C-X16 is stunning and in keeping with the Jaguar tradition.

Ian Callum is a renowned automotive designer. He is responsible for outstanding vehicles as the Aston Martin DB7 and Vanquish (ever notice how the Aston Martin looks so like the Jaguar XK), the Nissan R390 Le Mans race car. The British designer started at Jaguar in 1999 where he would go on to pen the XK, XF, XJ, C – X75, C – X16 and the new F – Type. What a resume'! When Tata took over JLR there were rumors that he would resign. Tata must have quickly realized his worth and done the right thing. As I may have mentioned many times "you can manage the \$'s but if you don't have an outstanding product you will manage the \$'s to bankruptcy". Such a great combination. Tata's willingness to invest and Callums' genius for design. What an exciting day it will be

when the F – Type hits the road. Can't wait.

I wonder if the Queen, in her wisdom, will make him "SIR CALLUM"?

MIKE SMYTH REVEALS MORE JAGUAR PLANS

Mike Smyth is the President of both Jaguar/Land Rover Main Line and Willow Grove and a very good friend of DVJC. He recently sent Brian Craig (PURR editor) and I the following e-mail:- "I have just returned from a dealer board meeting in NY and I wanted to take the opportunity to provide some feedback on what took place during that important two day meeting. Before I provide that feedback, I wanted to thank all of you for continuing to be great ambassadors of this amazing brand. A brand, as we know, that has struggled, only because the lack of any product cadence over the last 15 years. This has obviously hurt your membership due to our eroding customer base. This trend is very quickly coming to an end and I look forward to your membership growing rapidly over the next several years. The information listed below has not yet been released to the press so for first time your wonderful group will have some inside information.

Last year 84% of the vehicle volume in Jaguar competitive segments was all wheel drive volume. Despite how some purists may feel about all wheel drive it is a minimum customer expectation in today's luxury car market. Our lack of all wheel drive was absolutely killing our brand!

- We will have an all wheel drive Jaguar XJ this December. The XF all wheel drive version will follow in the first quarter next year.
- The new 3L supercharged V 6 (340 HP) went into production this June
- The XF with both the 3LV6 engine and also the 2L14 engine will be launched this fall
- We hope to see the new smaller convertible F-Type for the 2013 Spring market. The car will come with a 3LV6 that is 340HP, a 3LV6 that is 380HP and a 5LV8 that is 495 HP. It is truly stunning!!!
- All 2013's XJ's and XF's will have 8 speed transmissions.
- It appears that our 3LV6 compares very favorably to the other engines within our competitive seg-

ments.

The new 2L engine in the XF will deliver 240HP and this car will carry a sub \$50,000 price point

Our new V6 engine delivers consistent performance to today's V8

Our current Jaguar V8 will now only appear in the XJ8L sedan

Both our engines and our keys are getting smaller. In 2013 we will say goodbye to that old heavy key and get a 40% lighter Jaguar key

We will see new sound systems in all XJ's and XF's during 2013. The Meridian systems will reduce sound distortion at high volumes 9.8%

2013 XF pricing will be \$46,775 in the 2L engine. 3LV6 supercharged will come in at \$50,000 and our All Wheel Drive version is a \$3000 option. The XFR will continue to be available at \$82,000

On the back of each Jaguar we will see the LEAPER plus the words JAGUAR written. I know this sounds a bit obnoxious but surprisingly it looks great

In closing, for the first time in 10 years our studies have identified that younger people are now having favorable rating to the Jaguar Brand. Of course, new products and a new sexy convertible will only enhance our brand image. Thank you for your continued support and I look forward to seeing each of you in one of our showrooms."

Thank you Michael for sharing this information with us. It is indeed good news to see JLR bringing in new products and innovative thinking. William Lyons will be rejoicing together with Lofty England.

The following was received from Mike prior to publication.






