## **Roving Reporter - October 2012**

#### **IT WAS THE BEST OF TIMES**

It was in the spring of 1995. I had recently returned from working in Europe for four years to our home in Gwynedd Valley close to the William Penn Inn. We had rented our house to two of our children for the time we were away. It was still standing and YES we did make them pay having paid all their college fees 'cos we reckoned that now they had graduated it was time for work and pay their way. I only charged them what they would have paid for an individual apartment. Fair deal !?

When we returned my company (Burroughs now Unysis) had agreed, as I had retired after 40 years of blood, sweat and tears, that we could travel home on Cunard's Queen Elizabeth 2. Now it turned out that Cunard had a special deal on for our November trip. Included in the full fare you could bring one animal (Other than your spouse) and one car. So Ming, our Persian cat, got a free ride. I had two cars I could have shipped. A red Series 3 OTS V12 E-Type Roadster right hand drive and a Mark 2 Sedan left hand drive. The choice was not obvious as I loved that Series 3 but the Mark 2 won the day and if I had not chosen it I would not have been able to tell the following tale as it would not have happened.

So this spring day I was standing in my driveway admiring the Mark 2. It was two-tone, maroon/cream, and I was debating if to get it re-spraved to its original color of cream when a car came up the drive and out leapt a young fellow who stated " I am Paul Racette and I have one of those" pointing at the Mark 2. So began a lasting friendship and the forming of the "Ambler/Gwynedd

sub branch of the DVJC." Our headquarters was the Drafting Room located on North Bethlehem Pike, Springhouse, where there were meetings every Wednesday lunch time if you happened very close proximity supervising from a distance and dispensing drinks to our homes we



found there was Dave Duckett (E-Type Roadster) John Murphy (SS 100) and Jim Shields (XK 140 Roadster and others). All within a 5 mile radius. This story could be about the 8 to 10 years that followed but it is not. It is about Jim Shields.

Jim is a dedicated Jaguar man. He joined our club in 1972. Yes 40 years ago when he purchased his XK 140 from Larry Schear. Since then he has owned 11 further models covering an interesting selection of Jaguars range including a 1970 Series 1 XJ6, 1967 E Coupe, 1967 MK 2 3.8, 1997 XJ6, 1964 2.4 MK2 since converted to 3.4, 2002 XK 8 Coupe, 1985 Series 3 XJ6, 1997 XJ6VDP, and his most recent purchase, in the past few months, a 1970 E type 2+2. Jim still owns all these Jags except the 1970 & the 1985 XJ 6's, the 1967 E type coupe, and the 1960 Mk 2. As the fleet of cars grew his garaging facilities had to be expanded. Shelter was also required for his very old Indian Motor cycle. Quite a petrol head this guy! Also he is most knowledgeable in how to restore these cats and repair them. I was completely devoid of technical knowledge and Paul Racette, I am told, once said to my brother that "he had never known a guy so involved with Jaguar cars who knew so little about how to diagnose a problem and fix it." He was of course correct. I reckoned I didn't have to when I had four buddies who would roll up their sleeves and dive into one of my ailing cars when I only had to say something like "my E types doing so & so."

Back to Jim. He decided only a few years ago that as his plan was to restore his 1967 E Coupe which was dismantled into various sections, and other cars needed better shelter, that he would build a new garage with specified facilities. This he did and what a fine structure it is.

Jim and his wife Jane also have found time to join in club events and could be seen at holiday parties and Jim regularly helps out as a judge at the annual Concours d' Elegance. In fact he was to be seen at this year's event completing his judging duties. Some of you who talked to Jim would have noticed that he had difficulty talking. In August 2011 Jim was diagnosed with ALS, or Lou Gehrig's disease as it is more commonly known, and this is now taking a toll of his vocal chords. ( I asked Jim to proof read this story and he requested that I add after "it is now taking a toll on his vocal cords" " and this will spread to the rest of his body as ALS is always fatal within a few years"). Because of this Jim sold his E type coupe as, in his own words " I could not restore it in my life time." However, after it was gone he realized how special E types were, how he had been looking for-

ward to restoring his coupe, and that is what he really wanted now, after all the years with other Jaguars. So



he started looking for an affordable E coupe and in June of this year

he purchased a red E 2 + 2 coupe and after rebuilding the engine has a car he can really enjoy. He in fact drove the car to Watkins Glen for the vintage race weekend held over the recent Labor Day weekend. He travelled there and back on back roads and he told me the trip was totally trouble free and a real pleasure. Jane told me that the next trip on their bucket list is to travel to England in October on Cunard's Queen Mary and then spend a few days in London. Jim told me that he has many fond memories of times with our club including the Concours held at the country club in King of Prussia in the early 1970's; Barbara Ponsell's beautiful XK140 DHC which was the inspiration for his 140; drag racing at the ATCO Speedway in '86,'87 with the club and his E - 90 degree temperature and it didn't overheat; Bucks County covered bridge tours from Al Pincus' beautiful home in Lahaska; Slaloms at Garnett Valley High School- always the hottest day of the summer until rained out this year; and the "best of all" the lunches of the Ambler/Gwynedd DVJC sub branch at the Drafting Room and the friendships made there and the following afternoon car sessions.

As always time and life's changes have sent these individual friends to different locations. Paul Racette is back in his home in Montreal, John Murphy has moved to Santa Fe and I have sold our Gwynedd home and moved to Malvern. Also the Drafting Room has closed its doors. I suppose we would spend \$500 per month there so our loss would not help. It was only right that it should shut as a suitable concession to the dispersal of our club. Dave Duckett lives close to Jim they still meet and John, Paul and myself stay in contact.

Jim's son, Jim Jr., wrote to me recently explaining his Father's situation and the drive to try and defeat Lou Gehrig (ALS). He was looking for contributions to fight the fight. I am also sure that we will all remember "Jaguar Jim" in our thoughts and prayers. There never will be a more enthusiastic and dedicated Jag-man.



AT LAST THE F- TYPE IS REVEALED

At the Paris Auto Show week September  $25^{\text{th}}$  Jaguar's new two seat sports car was revealed. Promoted as the rightful replacement for E-Type the car, to me, has a similarity to the existing XK in its early release form but smaller and with a front end that reminds me of the concept C- X16. 


