

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The Prez Sez April 2013

I've just returned from the AGM and had a week of catchin' up on things. Why is

it when you take a trip for a few days it takes twice as many days to take care of things when you return? The AGM was held in Dallas, Texas at the Sheraton Hotel near the airport. I tried to be very observant to see how they arranged things since it's our turn in 2015. It was my first AGM as your delegate and it felt good to participate in the business portion on Saturday. As your Concours Chairman I'm always concerned with rule changes, especially when it comes to Judging. The thing that surprised me was that you need to have 8 certified judges to qualify for a JCNA Sanction, probably because we don't have that problem.

The Jaguar Concours Rules Committee (JCRC) is always adding and rearranging things to the extent of reprinting the entire addition for 2013. I'm not unhappy about that, as it makes the Judges training less complicated trying to insert the changes. The only thing that remains unchanged are the Judging forms.

Rather than go thru the items in this article you may go to the JCNA website and click on AGM Scroll down to the Business items. But as of this date they're not posted. Perhaps you don't care about the rule changes except when it affects the Sanctioned events, Concours, Slalom and Rallies. All of the rules approved are effective for 2013.

I was rather vocal making suggestions and asking for clarifications, which resulted in my being placed on the **JCNA Special Awards Committee.** We look at the rules pertaining to all the Special Awards being given to members who are recognized for their particular contributions to the JCNA. I'm proud to say that our Roving Reporter, Mike Tate, won **two** 2nd place Newsletter Awards for his Roving Reporter articles in our "*Jaguars Purr*" under the Travel Category "Gray Skies and Wet Cars" and for the Heritage Category, "How Does It Measure Up?"

As a Delegate attending the Awards Dinner on Saturday evening you applaud the winners as their names are announced. In order to receive their trophy at the dinner, they must contact the Awards Chairman and indicate whether the winner wishes to receive the award in person or have it shipped to their home address. In the case of the Special Awards, it's announced that evening. I was delighted that Mike had won and I accepted the Awards for him. It would've been nice to have the Regional and National winners from our club in attendance, but it's expensive to travel to receive them, so- I want to recognize them listed below, entitled "DVJC National Winners".

I am late in writing my report this month. It is April 3 and the delay has been caused by a number of key interruptions to life's normal flow. My eldest son, Russell, and family have been visiting which demands my top attention. All family Jaguars were out and needed testing including second son Gary's XJL V12. For all vehicles March was a record sales month. 1.5 million sold and the highest since August 2007 with 1.7 million. Two cars entered our family. Gary decided that his Chrysler with 150K miles was due for retirement and was bequeathed to his eldest son Christian. Gary really looked after that car and it still looked like new. How long will it last now??? The replacement was a spanking new black with white stitched red upholstery Chrysler 300S. A really cool car with every imaginable extra. I, remaining faithful to the brand, was told by Gary that there was a beautiful 1989 red



XJS OTS V12 for sale at a local garage. He was correct. It

was a beauty. Very hard to find these days....clean with no rust and everything working. It is now being kept warm in my garage. The last thing that caused a delay was a little bad health where I landed in Paoli Hospital Emergency as my diabetes took control and my blood sugar spiked to 435! Very high I was told. Well if you're going to do something then do it well !!

March contained two birthdays that focused my mind on the history, progress and future of the motor car. On March 20 our fellow member Fred Mack was 102 and brought his 1953 XK 140 OTS to 60 years old. Must be the oldest one owner Jaguar in existence. March 14 was my birthday but I was 20 years exactly, take a day or two, younger than Fred. Made me feel really

good and young. So Fred and I have lived through the evolution of the motor car. From crank starting to remote engaging of the ventilation system and starting. From manual shift, through automatic to paddle shift on the steering column. From speeds in the low 20's to over 200 mph. So many innovations too numerous to mention. But to me the question is: " will there be another period like the 40's, 50's,60's?" Of course there were earlier periods especially, in the USA. William Lyons launched his SS company in the 1930's and released the SS100 in the latter decade of that period. I read that a 3.5 SS100 which was purchased for a few hundred \$ in 1939 sold recently for \$457,000! The 40's through 60's produced manufacturers such as Allard, Morris Garages (MG), Triumph, Austin Healey, Fraser Nash (now BMW), Aston Martin, Lotus, Sunbeam, Ferrari, Porsche, Lagonda, Jowett, Wolseley and so on. Then think of the many different models these manufacturers have made and the value they represent. E-types regularly sell for over \$100,000. A 1948 Jaguar MK

1V drophead coupe recently sold for \$84,500. The XJS has bottomed out (We said they would) and good ones are fetching top money. One iden-



tical to the car I purchased, but one year younger, sold at auction for \$32,822.

I am sure there are cars that are being produced now that will be part of the classic car trade in 60 years time. But with all the gadgetry how will they restore them? Will it be the 40's to 60's cars that people lust after? I think they will. Especially those British models. Why do I say this?. In the April 8 *Time* magazine, the one with two guys kissing each other on the front cover,

there is an advertisement saying "Take Back Your Freedom." The advert is for the new blu electronic cigarette. A really modern time device. There is a young good looking guy (no I am not) sitting in a left hand drive open top car smoking a blu. So this is trying to depict a guy who is with it. Cool. Got it all. So what's the car? The latest sports Merc? The new F-type? The new Corvette? No.! He is sitting on the folded top of what looks suspiciously like an MGB. Get my point? These cars that Fred and I have been fortunate enough to be around during their production and perhaps have owned are going to be the gold standard in 60 years time. If we had been smart we would have lived like a hermit and purchased a very large barn and filled it with cars of the period. I have always been loyal to our brand except when I first arrived in the USA in 1974 and purchased a Porsche Targa. It was a bare bones thing and rattled and shook for \$10,000. I see they will bring in excess of \$30,000 now. In another rash moment, when I think I was trying to make my sons envious, I got a new (PURPLE) Mustang Cobra! Again I was told "That's a young man's car" so I saw the error of my ways and traded it in for one of the latest S – types.

The next question is "Will people be able to afford to buy these period cars.?" As I have said, E -types are regularly selling for over \$100K. I got my E-type OTS II/2 which was like new for \$25,000 in mid 1990 and sold it a few years later for \$50,000. The best example is my XK150S Roadster which I got in Jamaica in the 1970's for \$1,000. I spent a lot getting it restored and sold it for \$50K. They are now selling top condition \$130,000+. I recall that when I lived in England I was driving home from visiting my parents and I saw a 1950's Aston Martin DB 2 sitting in a second hand dealer's lot for sale at \$2400. One was recently advertised for \$379,000!

So answering my own question I suppose earnings will keep pace with inflation and people in tens of years time will say I picked my E-type up for \$100K in 2013 and sold it for \$425K. When compared to Aston Martins, Ferraris etc etc the E is low cost. XK 120 OTS have been bringing \$100K+ but I did see one for sale recently for \$94,500. Grab it while you can!! Other recent sales were a 1972 XKE Series III V12 sold for \$116,341! A 1966 XKE 4.2 convertible sold for \$104,038. Now here is an interesting one sold in England. A 1960 MK II 3.8 Sedan. Had a new

body and expensively upgraded with modern auto box, power steer-



ing, a/c, electric windows, parking sensors, new tan leather. Stated as perhaps the best in the world. Sold for \$108,449. At the same auction as the MKII a 1962 red Leyland Routemaster double-decker bus sold for \$31,663. Just think you can travel in it. Party with your friends. Live in it! Rent out space> What a bargain.

At Bonhams Boca Raton sale in February a XK140 MC roadster with lots of goodies sold for \$143,000. A 1962 XKE Series 1 Coupe condition 2 sold for \$165,000. A 1964 XKE Series 1 convertible sold for \$96,800. A 1965 XKE Series 1 convertible 4.2 sold for \$92,000 and a series 3 V12 convertible went for \$55,000. I saw an advert for MK V 3-position Drop Head Coupe for \$95,000. So the variation in price is of course quality of the offering. Keep your car in really good shape and it will bring the \$. Also in today's market there are many modern Jaguars available at very low prices. This applies to the X-type, XK8 which is one of the best buys now and will soon appreciate. Various Sedans including the S-type and XJS. When I say "low cost" I mean compared to their price when new and compared to a new Jaguar now! Don't forget the golden rule when buying. Pay top \$ for a top car. It will save you \$1,000s in the long run
