As our Web-master, he posts the scores which at times require modification when the drivers contest the class in which they are registered.

There are 18 slalom classes sanctioned by the JCNA for national completion and many of the drivers from our club are National winners in their class so it's important to get them correct. We only give out three trophies for DVJC completion and don't recognize separation by class. I think we should for only three out of the 15 that entered received recognition at the lunch held afterward. Therefore I will have a certificate for everyone with the name, class and time that was registered, at least as a record of competing in the event, at the completion of our next slalom in 2014.

I might add the DVJC provides this JCNA sanctioned event for those that enjoy competing in driving events. We usually have at least a dozen competitors since we started in 2005. We will continue doing so until no one enters. It might be noted that a wet pavement will cause rescheduling as occurred last year in when it was held in November but we still eight competitors.

LE MANS 24 HOURS THOUGHTS

With the release of the F-Type coinciding with the running of Le Mans the question is being asked "Have Jaguar now got a car that would be competitive in this event?" Not only that but it has been stated that to cement their re-birth with Tata and to emphasize their arrival back as a manufacturer of top sporting vehicles this should be their next ambition. This was their heritage back in the 1950's with the machines that made them famous round the world. Now Audi has that honor and it is said they are outselling BMW worldwide! Audi won again this year, out-dueling Toyota, and continue to establish their reputation as manufacturers of exceptional top sporting offerings.

There is no media suggestion that Jaguar return to Formula One racing but that it was Le Mans that made their name world renowned. Called the world's "Greatest Motor Race" this year was the 90th running, not the 100th, as the first race was run



in 1923, time out was taken for World War 2. It is reckoned that Le Mans is a true test of

man and vehicle making both perform day and night starting and finishing at 3.00 pm 24 hours later. Jaguar's first victory was in 1951 with the C-Type. They put a streamlined body on the XK 120 and called it the XK 120C and became to be known thereafter as the C-Type. With Peter Walker/Peter Whitehead driving they covered 3611km in the 24 hours and the brand became world famous for a

dominating victory. The following year, in an attempt to get more speed, the body was redesigned with a longer nose. The Long Nose C-Type! Overheating caused a three car collapse so, humiliated, they had to seek vengeance in 1953. A three car team was entered reverting to the

original C-Type body. The competition in 1953 was one of the toughest seen for many years. Representing Italy were Ferrari, Lancia, and Alfa Romeo, France had the previous year's winner Talbot. Aston Martin fielded their new DB3S. Grand Prix drivers Fangio, Villoresi, Ascari, Farina and Gonzalez competed against the Jaguar drivers headed by Stirling Moss and Peter Walker. The bodies on the C-Types were described as paper thin alloy and they were equipped with a new innovation developed by Jaguar and Dunlop – disc brakes. Stirling suffered from a dirty fuel filter after leading for a long time but even then finished second with Tony Rolt/ Duncan Hamiliton taking the win. Two more C-Types came in 4th and ninth. The most important number was that the Jaguar win was the first recorded at over 100 mph! They travelled 4088km in the 24 hours, 477km more than the winning C-Type two years earlier.

The Jaguar D-Type had a near miss in 1954 when Ferarri won. The D-Type at the time was not fully developed. In WW2 Jaguar built bomber wings and it is believed that some of




their structures found their way into the D-Type. The D-Type won the ill-fated 1955 race where the Mercedes driver Pierre Levegh was killed together with over 80 spectators. The car covered 4135km. D-Types won again in 1956 (4035km) and 1957 (4387kM). Having been happy to have established themselves Jaguar withdrew from racing and did not win again at Le Mans until 1988 with the XJR-

9LM and the torque V12 engine covering 5333km in the 24 hours. (I wonder how my V12 engine in my 1988 XJS compares to this 1988 winning engine?) This win was followed in 1990 by the XJR-12 driven by John Nielsen, Price Cobb and Martin Brundle with the winning distance of 4882km.

DVJC Visits New Jersey Motorsports Park

On a very hot afternoon, Saturday, July 13th, 20 members of DVJC met at the Outback restaurant, in Deptford, New Jersey. From there they caravanned in two groups, over scenic, tree-shaded roads, to Millville, NJ - a distance of about 50 miles. The group included representatives from Cherry Hill Jaguar and Jaguar Main Line who brought along 2 new F-types, for us to see and HEAR!!

New Jersey Motorsports Park was built in 2008 on land occupied by Millville Airport. The Park includes two road course racetracks, named "Thunderbolt" after the P-47 and "Lightning" in honor of the P-38 (both WWII fighter aircraft) that were based there.

The event was organized and coordinated by DVJC Director, Rich Rosen. Sportscar Vintage Racing Association (SVRA) had scheduled a weekend of vintage racing on the 2.25 mile Thunderbolt circuit, including 11 classes of cars. This same organization will host vintage racing at Watkins Glen, NY from September 4-8th. We arrived at the Thunderbolt circuit in time to see the 90 minute 'enduro' race, which ended at about 6:00 pm. The field included some sports racers (Ralt, Royale and Mazda) plus a couple of Corvettes (1955 and 1966), two Alfas, three Porsches and a healthy sounding Datsun 240Z (from Rydal, PA) that retired after one hour.

Following a brief rain shower 17 cars were escorted onto the track behind a Subaru WRX pace car. The pace car was used to control the speed and no passing was permitted. The accumulated oil and grease from racing, combined with the recent rain shower, made the track quite slippery. Unfortunately, Anthony Cimino and his sister Carolin lost traction at the last turn before the main straight and got onto the wet grass. They hit the Armco barrier backwards, damaging his 2+2 E-type. Neither driver nor passenger appeared to be hurt, but the car was not drivable and that ended the session on a sad note.

We then adjourned to the new Finish Line Pub,

at the track, for dinner in air-conditioned comfort.

During dinner, there were raffle ticket drawings, as well as hats and souvenirs from the sponsoring dealers.

Rich Rosen plans to organize another event for next year with sponsorship from Cherry Hill Jaguar and Main Line Jaguar. The next event will have a strong emphasis on safety to include a vehicle inspection and a short classroom session with a professional race instructor. We want to keep this event one of the most exciting driving events during the year, but safety must be paramount for the club to continue this event.


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American British Reliability Run


