### **Roving Reporter - September 2013**

It is 5:45am Sunday September 8<sup>th</sup> and I have to get my *Purr* piece completed. There is lots to tell after our vacation in glorious sunshine, golden beaches, rolling green grass, blue skies and endless roads with history. Where were we? England of course!

I decided to complete this piece in a series of news alerts as there was so much happening in the Jaguar World. I tried to collect my thoughts as I travelled for eight hours in the back seat of a diesel XF from the very North East of England to Devizes in the South West. Expert driving by my sister – in – law Pattie demonstrated the pure power of the XF keeping up a steady 80 mph. Most top class cars moved at this speed and I am told that the authorities are seriously considering moving the speed limit from 70 to 80. Presumably then traffic will move at 90 mph! The XF back seat comfort is excellent and whisper quiet. Very little road noise. As we travelled through the industrial Midlands we saw signs inviting us to visit Solihull, home of Land Rover, and Coventry, home of the cat. We just breathed in the air and hurried on with not a sound from that diesel engine. The roads were busy and the models of cars using them vastly different to the USA. Mainly of European manufacture and very fast and small. SUV's don't dominate and if gas was \$8+ per gallon here they wouldn't either. So here are my thoughts:-

### **JAGUAR NEWS**

O The Frankfurt Motor Show is about to open and it is rumored that Jaguar will announce an SUV. This has been rumored many times before but dismissed as their sister company is Land Rover. But this time it seems very sure it will happen. It will not be based on a Land Rover but the chassis of the XJ and code named XQ or Q-type therefore making it completely different. Smart. We should find out soon...even before the Purr goes to press! It is also rumored that Bentley will announce an SUV gently priced at \$237,500! Which will make the Jag look low cost.

0 "Jaguar's Most Cultured Cat At 65" announced the Classic Motoring magazine. They reminded us that the XK 120 made its debut at the 1948 London Motor Show. Buyers flocked to buy it making a story in it- self. Our own



103 year old Fred Mack purchased one in 1953 for in the region of \$4000+ and sold it recently at auction for \$80,000. Not many one owner XK120's come on the market and there is another one gone.

0 "We invite you to conquer the track." "Learn how to tame 510 horses." So said an elaborate invitation to attend the Jaguar PERFORMANCE Driving Academy. The cars are the XFR, XJR, XKR. The tracks are –Monterey, -Las Vegas, -Miami. The dates are October, December, and March 2014. Cost is complimentary if within the past 12 months you have purchased any of the cars listed or their stable mates. Otherwise you can pay \$1,850 for the Basic Course and \$2,495 for the Advanced Course. Jaguarusa.com/academy.

0 "Classic Car Mart" magazine's front cover raved about the "Jag XJS vs MERC SL" terming them "Classy Drop-Top Cruisers." They promoted both cars as equally good on the road with the Merc costing more than the Jag.

0 There is much excitement and speculation as RM Auc-



tions brings one of the only five Works team long-nose Dtypes to auction in early September. XKD504 competed at LeMans and was

then sold to the Ecurie Ecosse team in whose colors it now races. Estimates in the \$5 million range are being discussed so it could beat the top auction price for a British car set last year by Bonhams with the ex Tim Birkin "Blower" Bentley which fetched \$5,149,500.

0 Jaguars in the UK continue to sell well. Examples are: 1968 Jaguar 420 estimate \$13,000 sold for \$14,750; 1970 Jaguar E-type 4.2 roadster. Estimate \$68,000 sold for \$83,000; 1972 Jaguar E-type Coupe estimate \$28,000 sold for \$42,000; 1973 Jaguar E-type S3 roadster estimate \$73,000 sold for \$86,750; 1976 Jaguar 4.2 XJC estimate \$8,000 sold for \$86,750. The great sale recently, nothing to do with Jaguar, was of course at Bonhams Goodwood sale where Fangio's 1954 Mercedes Silver Arrows GP car sold for 19.6 million pounds (roughly \$30 million) also \$307,000 for a 1958 XK150S Roadster was a great number for this car. (Tears...why did I sell mine?) Also I saw a super 1959 Mark IX for \$106,400. Under the heading "The last E-Type sold in the UK" I spotted a 1975 roadster

V12 in the rare factory color of unmarked Heather (looked like a very pale pink) Low mileage. Like new. Your's for \$195,000

So be happy.....the old car market has never been so Healthy!!!

O News I heard or read somewhere said, "Sales Boost For Jaguar." It followed by saying "New sales figures suggest that, after piggy-backing on the success of Land Rover, Jaguar is starting to turn its business around." The problem was that Jaguar built cars that customers did not want. Since the launch of the current XK in 2005 Jaguars have been well engineered, desirable cars that, according to the fact that it stands at the top of the JD Power satisfaction survey, customers absolutely love them. The problem was that Jaguar made cars that people wanted but could not afford or did not fit into their lives. In Europe the XF did not have a four cylinder diesel engine. In North America and Canada people would not buy Jaguar because they did not have four wheel drive. China loved the XJ but could not afford the huge duty required on the 5-liter V 8 engine.

All these omissions have been corrected and business is booming. At the half year Jaguar retail figures are up 29% with more sales in China at the 6 months than in total in 2012. Sales figures in the USA are up 59%. And note that this is before the impact of the F-type. Jaguar is heading in the right direction and at considerable speed. What an amazing job Tata has done!

O In the news has been mention of what Jaguar term "Project 7." This is the prototype of an F-type with a tail fin like the D-type. Seeing a photo of it I at once said, "Oh yes, so you are looking at a car to enter in Le Mans?" You will recall I suggested this in last month's *Purr* and believed such a move would greatly enhance the Jaguar reputation as it did in the 1950's. Do not forget we have only seen the F-type in roadster form so far. The F-type Coupe is still to come and I am sure it will be stunning as all Jag Coupes are...the E-type, the XJS with flying buttress, the XK8 and the current XK (YES! I am going to say it again "Why didn't they give it a number?"). All have been dream cars so we can expect another. You can do more with a coupe than a roadster to make it extraordinary.



O Here is one for the amazing column. This is copied from the British paper the Daily Telegraph of September 3. Headline announced "SKYSCRAPER

MELTED MY JAG-

UAR" The new "Walkie Talkie' skyscraper in the City of London caused parts of a Jaguar car to melt by reflecting sunlight, it's owner claimed.

Martin Lindsay parked his Jaguar XJ on Eastcheap near to the 37-storey building being built at 20 Fenchurch Street. Mr Lindsay, who owns a tiling company, claimed the sun's reflected rays warped panels along the side of the car. Developers Land Securities and Canary Wharf said they were investigating, adding: "As a precautionary measure, the city of London has agreed to suspend three parking bays in the area which may be affected." The companies agreed to pay \$1,470 for repairs to the car!

On a more dangerous note I recall that the actor Dick Van Dyke, in his late 80's was, some three weeks ago, pulled out of his blazing Jaguar by a passing motorist. I only saw a smoke shrouded photo of the back of the car but I believe it was the current XK. I have to ask "What is a man of that age doing driving a car like that?!!!"

O So the eight hour journey in the back of the XF left me refreshed and ready to meet my brother and his wife, Peter and Kit, at the Bear Hotel, Devizes. With Pattie and husband John and Mo the six of us were able to enjoy a wonderful Sunday dinner together while the XF cooled its heels. Only a journey to Heathrow was left in our niece Antonia's totally black Mercedes Wagon. The black interior in complete contrast to the cream of the Jaguar. She competed magnificently with the morning traffic. "What speed are you doing?" I enquired from the back seat. "Why" she replied "Do you want me to slow down?" "No.. faster, faster. Faster" I responded. We caught the plane so here we are. "Can I go back to bed now?"

0 September 10<sup>th</sup>. The Frankfurt Show opens Thursday September 12<sup>th</sup> but Jaguar unveiled today their concept CX 17 SUV. Initial reviews were favorable.

The original date for the 2012 Delaware Valley Jaguar Club in July was rained out. As a result the slalom was run in November and only 8 participants were able to attend. Hoping for better circumstances for the 2013 slalom all eyes were on the weather report. Initial forecasts indicated rain would not be a problem, however, some high temperatures were predicted. The day of the slalom, July 20<sup>th</sup>, was partly cloudy at daybreak but no signs of moisture. Fortunately for all 15 competitors the clouds hung around for most of the morning and moderated the temperatures.

Pauline and I arrived at the Garnet Valley High School shortly after 7:00 am to find the slalom area of the parking lot taped off and all the cones in place. The amazing Kurt Rappold had been there the day before and set up most of the equipment. He and grandson Jeff Dement II arrived with the rest of the equipment including the all important timing device. Jeff got to work and had it working perfectly well before the first car approached the start line.

Don Mullin and Clara Saxton, faithful club members, arrived to help Pauline and me administer the event. Pauline and Clara handled the timing duties and Don assisted the contestants at the start line. Once the inspections and walk through were completed I spent most of my time with my camera.

Jaguars started arriving about 8:00 am. All were inspected prior to entering the course. Most participants were ready for the runs. Several had to be reminded to remove loose items from the passenger compartment and trunk and take out any floor mats. All the cars passed inspection of the brakes, suspension, steering, etc. Additional cautions were issued regarding the use of helmets and keeping the driver's window open to hear instructions. We were ready to go.

Each slalom course consists of three laps; an hour glass, a figure 8 and an oval. To insure the drivers are familiar with the layout a walk through is conducted prior to the first car entering the field. During the walk through John Larson, our friend from the Nation's Capital Jaguar Owner's Club, noticed we had forgotten two cones, one on each side of the course. A quick consult of the slalom rules, a measurement, and the cones were put in place. The walk through was completed and we were ready for the competition.

Each driver is given five opportunities at completing the course. The best recorded time is reported to JCNA. The five attempts allow the drivers to become familiar with the pattern and to make a mistake or two. Going outside the required pattern or knocking a cone out of place results in a disqualification for that run or a time penalty. While several drivers completed the required course all five times several were thankful for the multiple opportunities. Our newest member, Irv Carson, needed a run or two to get the sequence right. Rich Rosen, a veteran, knew the course as well as anyone. Being the highly competitive individual he is he pushed his E-Type beyond the limit. Once Rich made the error he decided to entertain the crowd with some additional theatrics that resulted in a lot of smoke, the tread life of his tires being reduced by about 50%, and a later visit by the Pennsylvania State Police. Thanks to Kurt Rappold we had the necessary permits for the event and the Trooper accepted subsequent explanations.

Once the competition was over the area was cleaned up, the gear packed away in Kurt's truck, and we were off To McKenzie's on Route 202 for lunch and presentation of the awards. Third place went to Rich Rosen in his 1971 E-Type 2+2. Second place was taken by our distinguished visitor from the Nation's Capital, John Larson, in his 1977 XJ6C coupe, an unusual and modified Jaguar. First place was awarded to Steve Schultheis in his supercharged 2009 XF. The best time of the day was attained by a visitor from New York, Bill Ramsey, who ran the slalom in a car that looked suspiciously like a 2003 Volkswagen GTI. Since Bill was not a JCNA member he was not eligible for club or national awards. However, he and his family were welcomed by all and they stayed and shared lunch.

Kurt Rappold's grandson, Jeff Dement II, competed in Kurt's XJ6 as a youth enthusiast. We all know how Kurt supports and promotes JCNA and our club. Kurt also supports his family in participating in events. We


### Driving directions from the Pennsylvania Turnpike:
