LANCASTER AVENUE POT HOLES A MANUAL GEARBOX

Early morning on Saturday, April 12, I was driving my 1967 Jaguar 420 on Lancaster Avenue from the outskirts of Malvern to the Wayne headquarters of the local Jag

shop. Earlier in the week wife Mo had made serious contact with a pot-hole bending the passenger side front wheel on the X-Type and various other parts toting up an impending bill to correct the damage \$3,334. (I did not say a word). I set off for Wayne at 7.30am determined not to suffer the same

fate and foolishly thinking that it was the middle of April so plenty of time to have repaired every hole.

WRONG!!!

I have to acknowledge that there were stretches of road that were, as one would expect to find a highway, but these were in the outside lane of the two lanes. The inside lane was riddled. And after a short time I thought I could become exhausted changing gear and taking avoidance. Slipping into third I changed lanes with a sigh of relief only to find that not only were there holes in the middle of the pavement but, more confusing, holes in the area which divided my lane from the oncoming traffic lane. These indeed called for some fancy footwork calling for long forgotten arts from us of "heel and toe." Changing gear constantly in a 47 year old car is what driving is all about and I was certainly being tested now as I was using the engine as a brake to slow us down. I use the word "us" to illustrate that the old Jag Sedan and I had become one. I don't know if you have ever counted the traffic lights on this route, there must be one every two hundred yards, and each one was at red this Saturday again causing constant up and down changes. Of course I could have traveled on the 202 but that has been in major upheaval for months

My mind was concentrating solely on the job in hand when it suddenly darted to a topic of the moment, "Self Drive Cars." It is said that the motor industry is making great progress in inventing a car that will drive itself. How boring but how will they program it to deal with Lancaster Avenue after a rough winter? Perhaps the

> program will say "Lets get it over with. Drive into the next pot-hole and stop!" Perhaps the electronics will go into "weave mode" but what happens if the on coming car goes into weave at the same time? Of course the solution then hit me. The self drive car does not actually touch the road but floats above it eliminating

problem and the need to repair holes or the use of salt. The problem will be, if the past is an indicator, that the USA will be the last country to use such a system because of cost. This mirrors the recent hacking problem at Target where they are going to use chip technology in their credit cards in the future. Chip technology has been available for the past 20 years and is used in most industrial nations. The USA investigated the design and safety inherent in the technology and loved it but when the solution was put before USA top management it was rejected. Reason...Cost! Now they are paying the price.

No sooner had I written the above than I received a mail from a good friend of mine, Gordon Hudson, who disappears locally to his home in Florida in the winter. He allows me to garage the 420 at his local home during this time. He attached a report with the heading "Jaguar Land Rover Previews Pioneering Automotive Technologies." JLR predicted through their advanced research they will be able to deliver intelligent on –and off-road driving for customers of tomorrow. The technologies include remote control off – road driving, predictive infrared laser scanning and gesture and voice control activation, smart glass that transforms the connectivity of the interactive experience, and semi- autonomous driving both on and off-road. One of the subjects listed

said "next generation Terrain Response includes infrared laser scanning to predict terrain and Wade Aid to predict water depth." Another headline says ""Transparent Bonnet" (Hood) virtual imaging concept improves off-road visibility for Land Rover and helps high-speed driving for Jaguars". It's all too much to explain here but beware pot holes, your days are numbered.

Well it all sounds amazing but future generations will still be able to enjoy yesterday's and today's cars with their automatic and, preferably, manual gear boxes. Pot Hole evasion with a manual gearbox will be the sport of the wealthy and, because the roads will be less used, the holes will be wider. And deeper.

In last month's *Purr* I told you that I had been tipped off that the end of life of the XK was nigh. It has now been confirmed that the 2015 model will be the last finishing production this summer. There will be no direct replacement with Jaguar concentrating on the F-Type. The S and R F-Types are a match for the XK in both specification and price. Despite selling 54,000 XK's there is no direct replacement but it is said the company is working on a new, larger and more expensive four seat coupe which possibly will be based on the next generation of XJ which will rival the Aston Martin DB9, Bentley GT and Mercedes Benz S-Class Coupe.

The XK is Jaguar's second all aluminium car and will con-

tinue its legacy in the company's hall of fame as one of the most desirable and beautiful models. To mark the conclusion of this epic model you could be just in time to place your order for 1 of 50 of the final 50 XKR's to come off the production line. Hurry to reserve yours today. If you live long enough could be worth a million one day.

JAGUAR HERITAGE PLANS FOR NEW HOME

At last Jaguar Heritage have told us about their plans for a new building which will become there headquarters. It will be based at the Heritage Motor Center at Gaydon in Warwickshire, UK. Provided will be space to display and store 200 historic British cars from the reserve collections of both the Jaguar Daimler Heritage Trust and the British Motor Industry Heritage Trust.

The new museum will enable visitors to view cars from the reserve collections from both Trusts for the first time. Included will be a vehicle restoration and conservation workshop. Importantly office space will bring back together again all Jaguar Heritage staff under one roof. The new facility will be adjacent to the Heritage Motor Center museum and will compliment the existing Jaguar galleries in the Coventry Transport Museum and the Heritage Motor Center museum, both of which will continue as they are today. In addition to the large range of Jaguar models space will be provided for Jaguar Heritage's extensive collection of 30 Daimler and Lanchester models dating from 1897 to 2002, many of which have never been on public display. It is expected that the facility will be fully operational mid 2015.

PRICES STILL ON THE UP

A 1966 MKII 3.4, condition 1, went for \$30,836. A 1965 XKE OTS, condition 2, went for \$110,000. A 1955 XK140SE OTS, condition 1, brought \$103,000. Another XK150S OTS, Condition 2, attracted big bucks. This time \$167,750. A 1967 XKE Series 1, Condition 2+, sold for \$129,250. RM Auctions held March 8 at the Ritz-Carlton on Amelia Island produced three exceptional Jaguar sales. A 1954 XK 140 MC OTS, Condition 1, went for \$159,500. Next a 1961 Series 1 XKE OTS, Condition 1, sold for \$214,500 and, topping them all, was the 1949 XK 140 alloy roadster, one of only 184 left hand drive alloy bodied XK's made. (My comment. If the date is right then I believe it was an XK 120 not a XK140 and only 120's were alloy) No matter the confusion the buyer spent \$495,000 for this condition 2 car.

Prices continue to excel and taken overall exceed the average gains made on the stock market.

As I think back on the late 1960's and the 1970's there are a number of things that come to mind. I don't remember the exact date that I joined the club but I think it was in 1965 or 1966. At that time the club had dinner meetings which were all around and in Philadelphia. As I remember the club finances were in very poor shape. One needed to send in there check in advance so the club would be able to pay the restaurant for the guaranteed number of people coming. One place that I remember was not the best place to drive to was the Brass Rail near the airport. A lot of the places we went to in that time are no longer in existence.

During the time between 1967 and about 1978-79 the club had a large contingent of members that participated in events that gave one a chance to appreciate what a Jaguar was capable of doing. There were many years where we went to Lime Rock, times where we were at Atco drag strip in New Jersey as well as having gymkhana competitions and doing some "question – clue – and answer" fun type rallies.

Lime Rock was a blast. It was normally a three day event with inspection and instruction (for the people that needed it) as well as practice on Friday. The practice hour was divided into three twenty minute periods so that the three groups of cars practicing would be on the track with comparable drivers. There were Novice, Intermediate and Expert. On Saturday we had the actual competition. For the speed trials around the 1.58 mile circuit you were running against the clock not head to head. Even though this was done for safety there was still an accident now and again. Although I do not know of any person hurt there were a few cars that could not be driven home. They also ran a timed quarter mile starting in the "run off" at the end of the straight away past the stands going against what would be the normal running on the track.

There was also a "fun" gymkhana with both a driver and navigator. The navigator stayed with the car while the driver, who was about 150 feet away and blindfolded was spun around. At that time the driver had to get back to the car before the blindfold could be removed then both would complete the course which included picking up four tennis balls off the top of traffic cones which the navigator had to run with from the stop line to a bucket and drop them in.

The third day, Sunday, was when there was a brunch and the trophies were passed out. Lime Rock was always a lot of fun and ask anyone who went about the "Jaguar Juice" that always somehow did

show up on one of the days!

I have to admit that I did very well at Lime Rock and Steve Kress and I had a lot of good "head to head" competition. Between the two of us we came away with most of the first places in our class almost every year we were there.

One of our Past Presidents that I miss was Sid Levin. It was of great interest to here the stories that Fred told and I always enjoyed his "British" humor and accent. I hope that my next comment is not taken the wrong way but the Concourses then were more "fun" and not as professional as they seem to be to me now.

I have enjoyed the many friends and acquaintances that I have met through the club and in looking back can net even remember exactly what years that I was President as there were also many years where I was some other officer or director. All I can say is it was enjoyable.


Driving directions from the Pennsylvania Turnpike:

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
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
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Books Worth Reading

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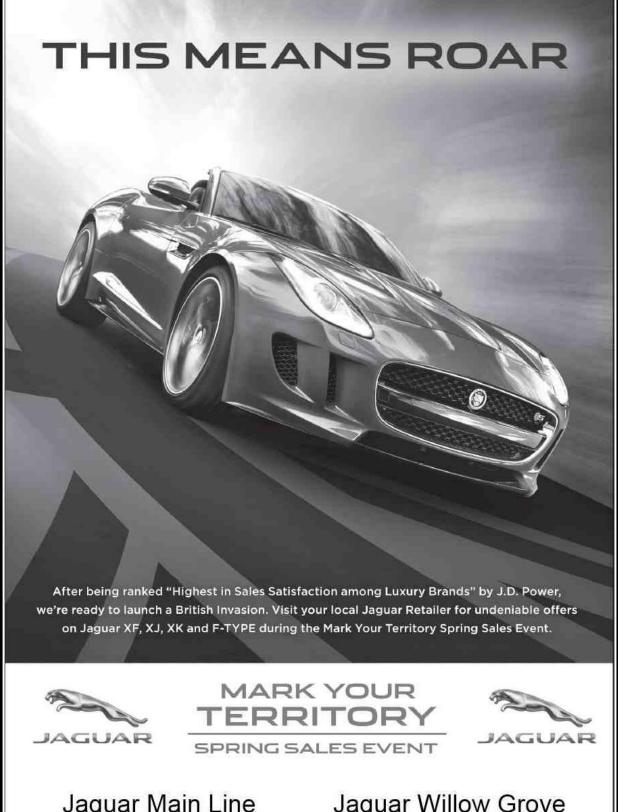
