Each of the club cars listed above has a unique history and personal story associated with it. That is what makes this hobby of collecting vintage cars so enjoyable. We don't have room for all the stories here, but possibly in future issues of the Purr we can select a car and tell its story.

After giving the guests time to stroll through the museum to view the famous collection while enjoying butlered hors d'Oeuvres and the cash bar, I summoned everyone to attention in order to acknowledge the Great Britains Automotive Group, the evening's sponsor, and to introduce some special people. The first was Dr. Fred Simeone, founder of the museum that bears his name, who welcomed everyone and declared Jaguar as his favorite marque (I'm trying to remember if he said the same thing about Ferraris when we had our Ferrari Club holiday party there). Next, Kim McCullough, VP of Marketing for Jaguar Land Rover, arrived just in time to be introduced as the Keynote Speaker for the Saturday night Awards Banquet. She said she was thrilled to be a part of the AGM activities and emphasized Jaguar Land Rover's support of and commitment to the JCNA. I then acknowledged Kurt Rappold for gathering the wonderful collection of "extra" cars for the event after which he introduced our very special guest, DVJC member Fred Mack, who celebrated his 104th birthday that evening. I believe Fred is the oldest Jaguar Club member in the world.

The food was prepared by Bryce's Catering and they did a magnificent job. In keeping with the 'Philly Theme', soft pretzel bites were included in the hors d'Oeuvres along with individual mini antipasti cups, grilled Italian sausage & peppers on a skewer. The main course was served at two 'Taste of Philadelphia' food stations: a South Philly Cheese Steak Stand where you could design your own steak sandwich which was then served on an Italian roll and a China Town stand where wok stir-fried Sesame Chicken and Korean Beef Bao were served along with a variety of Asian accompaniments. Dessert included miniature blondies, brownies, home-baked cookies, and of course Fred Mack's birthday cake.

Shortly after the food service began, six members of various Mummer string bands made a surprise appearance and lifted the energy level of the evening with their up-beat musical selections. The group included players of an accordion, string bass, banjo, saxophone, trumpet, and tuba. Several people (no doubt Philly natives) could be seen doing the 'Mummers Strut' (continued on page 8)

The 2015 AGM at the Philadelphia Sheraton

When I suggested to the DVJC Officers that we should celebrate our 50th year by hosting the AGM in Philadelphia in March of 2015, I was met with ambivalent skepticism. However, I was not met with opposition and after explaining I have a template from several clubs that have hosted an AGM in the past it seemed we could do it, for we had a group of officers and members that were certainly capable. **Paul Merluzzi**, our then Vice President, and I were designated as Event Co-Chairmen.

The first thing we did was establish a Site Planning Committee to explore and lay out the basic tasks for the event. This committee included **Paul Merluzzi**, **Kurt Rappold**, **Bob DeLucia**, **Ann Perry**, and me. The first act of the committee was to reserve the Simeone Foundation Museum for Friday night, March 20, 2015. There was no question that we wanted to hold a Welcome Party there and establish it as our keystone event.

The next task of importance was to select a host hotel for the weekend event. The consensus of the committee members was to find a location as close as possible to the Historic District of Philadelphia. The Sheraton Society Hill Hotel was recommended by committee member **Bob DeLucia**, who had experience with events held there in the past. It appeared to be the perfect match for the size of our group and the location we wanted. The objective was to provide an opportunity for spouses and friends of Delegates to visit the historic sites of Philadelphia without having to plan for transportation. The Sheraton Society Hill is within walking distance of Independence Hall, the Liberty Bell, and many of the other great historic landmarks of the City of Brotherly Love.

A contract was negotiated with the hotel and signed after a bit of consideration to determine the guaranteed number of room-nights the delegates and guests would stay and the total cost of the food that would be consumed. We would now be obligated to meet those guaranteed amounts. Now that the foundation was established, we formed a Finance Committee to devise a way to pay for it! Along with the Finance Committee, several other committees were formed to organize the effort:

Finance Committee. Paul Merluzzi was designated to be Chair of the Finance Committee and to establish a budget and the means to finance the event. The committee consisted of **Bill Bieble** as the DVJC Treasurer, **Alex Giacobetti** as the AGM Treasurer to receive all of the registrations, **Brian Craig** as delegate/guest Registrar, and Paul to monitor & record Sponsor's donations. Based on information from other AGMs held in the recent past, Paul drafted a budget that included the estimated income/expense for each of the activities that made up the AGM. He then established ticket prices for the activities that were to be paid for by Delegates and guests. Since the ticket prices had to be at a reasonable, affordable level, they did not cover the costs of all planned activities. This created a shortfall that allowed us to estimate the necessary sponsorship money that needed to be raised to allow the DVJC to remain solvent after the event. We added a buffer to that estimate and set our sponsorship goal at \$27,000. Committee members then contacted vendors that advertised in our local newsletter, the Jaguar's Purr, and in the Jaguar Journal (the national JCNA publication), solicit sponsorship money. Through the hard work and persistence of the committee, we slightly exceeded the sponsorship goal.

The operation Paul set up to manage the finances and registrations was very simple. Alex rented a PO Box in his office building, picked up the registrations, deposited the money into the club account, and forwarded the information electronically via a "Drop Box" file. All the Finance Committee members were given access to the Drop Box and could view the transactions almost as quickly as they occurred. Bill Beible maintained a record of deposits, Brian made up a registrars list from the online images of the registration sheets, and Paul monitored the income/expenses for the budget.

Publicity Committee. A logo was needed for all event correspondence and publications. **Sheree Richnow** came up with a draft design that required several modifications to avoid Jaguar Land Rover LTD, LLC copyright issues. The final result is what I consider to be a classic design that embodies the Host City of Philadelphia with a background color of British Racing Green. The JCNA Jaguar Journal required articles in the Nov/Dec and Jan/Feb issues to nationally publicize the event. Our DVJC Secretary, **Clara Saxton**, provided articles for both issues which are extremely well written and informative to delegates/guests coming from outside the greater Philadelphia area (and possibly to many of us who have lived in the area for many years, as well).

Facility & Food Service Committee. This task was handled by Paul Merluzzi, who coordinated with the catering services and selected the menu offerings for both the Welcome Party at the Simeone Museum and the various breakfast, lunch, and dinner activities at the Sheraton.

Registration Committee. This committee has two separate tasks. The first task is that of Registrar which is best served by a committee of one for a relatively small event like the AGM. The Registrar maintains a record of all

who have registered for the event including the activities and meal choices they selected. This task was quite ably handled by Brian Craig who set up a Microsoft Access data base to hold all the necessary delegate/guest information. From this data base, he was able to perform a number of tasks, including generating status reports for the Finance Committee and printing the tickets for each attendee. The ticket identified by color coding, what event the attendee had paid for and what food selection he/she had chosen for the banquet. This eliminated having a separate, small meal-choice ticket - that can get lost! The lower portion had the logo of each sponsor and the backside had the weekend event schedule. They were attached to Lanyards provided by the Jaguar West Chester. It was a daunting task, especially accounting for last minute entries and tracking down food choices. Great Job, Brian.

The second task involved checking people in at the registration table at the hotel. This task was managed by **Noe LaFramboise** and **Jim Sjoreen** They recruited volunteers and set up a schedule for duty at the registration table. The distribution of the attendee registration envelopes and goodie bags were handled by two people at a time working in two hour shifts. This combination appeared to work well. **Peter Daniel** worked the Thursday evening shift. On Friday and Saturday the volunteers were **Rich & Dianne Carnegie, Kathy Moyer, Bill Beible, Irena Merluzzi, Ann Perry, Steve Kress, Noe LaFramboise, Clara Saxton, Jim & Denise Sjoreen and their son Gunnar.**

Transportation Committee. Ann Perry was the lone member of this committee. She handled negotiations and logistics for busing people from the Sheraton Hotel to the Simeone Museum on Friday night. All Ann needed to know was how many people and to what location! However she also suggested the logistics involved and back-up support for contingencies. Wouldn't you know it – a bus did break down. Ann convinced us to spend a few extra bucks to have a bus company supervisor along. As a result, the bus that broke down was replaced in a short period of time. Thanks to Ann's foresight!

Audio/Visual Committee. This was another committee of one - Tom Shaner. When Paul and I were discussing the requirements for A/V support for the JCNA we thought of using the hotel's services, but the price prompted us to discuss it at a Breakfast Club meeting. Tom Shaner, who was sitting nearby, said matter-offactly, "What do you need?" In a confident manner, he said," I can do all that!" After Paul described what equipment was needed, Tom did the rest. He was instrumental in setting up and monitoring the equipment for all the JCNA meetings plus the Awards Banquet.

Photography Committee. Who better to ask than **Brian Craig**! We weren't sure about JCNA supplying a photographer, but I suppose I should have checked with Jaguar Land Rover. When Brian was taking photos of the Award winners, another photographer (and obviously a professional) started shooting alongside him. It turns out that the pro was sent by Jaguar Land Rover!

Program Booklet, Signs, and Banners Committee. Paul laid out the program booklet and worked with the sponsors and advertisers to specify the ad requirements. The booklet also contained the AGM event schedule, a listing of the DVJC and dealer cars at the Simeone Museum, a bio of Keynote Speaker Kim McCullough, acknowledgements of all the volunteers who worked on committees, and welcome letters from Paul and me. Paul and I developed the locations where signs and banners were needed after which he designed them and had them printed, along with the program booklet, by someone with whom he has worked for many years. This relationship was a great asset in that much of the printing work had to be done at the last minute due to changes in schedule or late submittal of advertising copy. Paul's ability and experience to know what was needed saved a lot of time and money.

Silent Auction Committee. Mike Tate is the quintessential chairman of such matters. He cataloged and advertised every item offered in the silent auction, many of which were donated by DVJC club members. His planning was so well organized that it went on bumplessly even though he was hospitalized shortly before the AGM with diverticulitis and an abscess on his pancreas. Happily Mike is home and recovering quite well and fortunately committee members Noe La Frambois, Jim Sjoreen, and Steve Kress took up the effort. All the items were ready and on display at the appointed time in the area that was filled with the people gathered for the cocktail reception on Saturday evening. It was a huge success (raising over \$2000 for the club). Congratulations to Mike for the planning - and to our committee members who made it happen in his absence.

Goodie Bag Committee. Chairman Charles Olson, Steve Kress, and Alex Giacobetti selected and purchased the goodie bag souvenirs, along with items donated by our vendors and sponsors. A decision was made to put quality items in each goodie bag. We provided Liberty Bell Key Chains, Flashlight Key Chains, AGM logo Coffee Mugs, AGM logo Magnets and Post it Notes, among other items. **Ann Perry** added several pins from Philadelphia Visitor's Bureau. Alex negotiated the bags from Hagerty Classic Car Insurance

and obtained several other books and pamphlets describing the sights of Philadelphia. The bags were all stuffed the day before the event by Jim Sjoreen, Noe La Framboise and me.

Hospitality Room Committee. Co-Chairs Noe La Framboise & Jim Sjoreen did a magnificent job. In all my experience attending AGMs, I have never experienced a more organized and inviting Hospitality Room. I credit Noe for purchasing, providing, and arranging the snacks, drinks, food, and "hospitality bar" that encouraged most to gather round the tables and chairs and enjoy conversation and camaraderie. Many thanks to Rich and Dianne Carnegie, Jim Sjoreen, Bill Bieble, Leo Cobb, Steve Schultheis, and of course, Noe who made sure everything was stocked! I'm sure the hospitality staff will attest to my opinion!

Awards Banquet Committee. Co-chaired by Paul Merluzzi, several volunteers, and me. It was my task to obtain a Keynote Speaker by requesting help from our Jaguar/JCNA designated Director, Fred Hammond. With the help of Gary Kincel, the JCNA business manager, we booked Kim McCullough, the relatively new Vice President of Marketing for Jaguar Land Rover North America. Our AGM committee approved the purchase of a gift for Ms. McCullough and **Irena Merluzzi** selected a crystal 'Celebration Bowl' from Simon Pearce and had it engraved with the words "2015 JCNA AGM Philadelphia PA". What's a table setting without a centerpiece? Ann Perry put all twenty of them together with an imaginative use of used bottles of various types to hold the flowers. We were all impressed with Ann's artistry! Then it was Tom Shaner again, to set up the video screens and ensure the hotel sound system projected the sound in a balanced manner over the large banquet room.

Business Meeting. I have described all the fun things that happened throughout the AGM weekend but, lest we forget, the center of the activities was a business meeting conducted by the Officers, Directors and Delegates from all over North America. This meeting involves reviewing by-laws, the rule-book, and kicking off new initiatives. Alex Giacobetti and I represented the DVJC at these meetings and the results will be summarized in a future edition of the Purr.

Conclusion. Planning a large event like this requires people who are flexible and can multi-task when needed. It was evident that we had DVJC volunteers that were dedicated to do just that. The 2015 AGM at the Sheraton was a smoothly run event, a great success, and our club came out of it financially in the black. A big thank-you to our staff for the many hours of planning meetings at Andy's Diner and Paul's office in King of Prussia. Another big thank-you to Stacey Campbell, our liaison at the Sheraton, and to the rest of the hotel personnel who executed our plans flawlessly.
