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Speaking of Things Jaguar - April 2021

If You Don't Know Where You're Going,

Any Road Will Take You There...

In September 2017, then Jaguar Land Rover (JLR) CEO, Dr. Ralf Speth, made the following electrifying announcement: "Every new Jaguar Land Rover model line will be electrified from 2020, giving our customers even more choice. We will introduce a portfolio of electrified products across our model range, embracing fully electric, plug-in hybrid and mild hybrid vehicles. Our first fully electric performance SUV, the Jaguar I-PACE, goes on sale next year." Not expressed during the announcement at Tech Fest in Frankfurt, but very heavily rumored at the time, the all new fully electric powered XJ was already under development.



As 2020 ended, Jaguar had one electric vehicle in its lineup, the I-PACE, introduced in 2018, and no hybrids.



The rest of the lineup is ICE powered. ICE is the in-vogue acronym for Internal Combustion Engine. It would seem that global warming is going to melt the ICE car along with the polar caps. Perhaps if more ICEs are melted there will be more ice left at the north and south poles. We can only hope. By the end of 2020 there had been enough spy photos of camouflaged BEV (Battery Electric Vehicle) XJs to confirm its imminent launch in 2021.



There were also enough rumors to suggest the J-Pace, a large three row SUV to compete with the Porsche Cayenne, was also well under development.



On February 15th 2021 JLR's latest CEO, Thierry Bollore, announced that Jaguar will pivot away from its heritage and become a fully electric car brand by 2025. It was like a "Day after St. Valentine's Day Massacre" of Jaguar as we know it. The announcement had

followed similar commitments from both Rolls Royce and Bentley suggesting the electric powered XJ would be Jaguar's flagship to reestablish the marque as a player in the luxury car market. Bollore went on to talk about some barriers to success that Jaguar must overcome going forward. The one most pressing in the eyes of the owners, Tata Motors, is financial solvency. Last year JLR lost \$525M following an eye-watering loss of \$4.5Billion in 2019. Serious rationalization is certainly in order. One of the areas where rationalization will be focused is the corner JLR has painted itself into with their chassis platforms. JLR has way too many platforms for its market size. Even the largest of manufacturers are now down to three platforms and some down to two. JLR has at least six. More about the "painted into a corner" platform issue later.

Another significant barrier to success is reliability. The perception of poor reliability has plagued Jaguar since the British Leyland days, despite several periods when the reality was otherwise. However, poor reliability has been the reality of late. Bollore recently told investors that poor reliability is costing JLR 100,000 car sales per year. That is a staggering figure for a company that only sells around 500,000 cars in a good year. Beyond the loss of sales is the overwhelming cost of warranty repairs which can run hundreds of millions of dollars per year; a significant hit to the bottom line. Given the huge pyre of burning cash and a reliability reputation that is lower than Alfa Romeo, Jaguar's future may be on such perilously thin ice that abandoning ICE powered cars may not save it.

I've not been known to embrace electric cars. I've been very up front about my seemingly shallow reason; the sound or lack of it. However, I've come to accept that battery electric vehicles (BEV) are the future. There's nothing I can do about it anyway. Had I not grown up with ICE cars, I'm sure my perspective would be different. So, going forward I'm trying to embrace the astounding performance and design potential of BEVs, but I have yet to see one that has both. Jaguar has always been a car that makes you turn around and look as you walk away. A Jaguar is the perfect balance of beauty and performance. A Jaguar is the essence of "The Art of Performance."

Since 1938 Jaguar, a stalwart of the British automotive realm, steeped in tradition and heritage, has survived World War II, Margaret Thatcher and Ford. Unfortunately the current owners, Tata, and the current CEO, Frenchman Thierry Bollore, have no ties to that heritage. This was disturbingly apparent as further details of the JLR "Reimagine Jaguar" plan were shared. Any concerns you might have had about the new all electric XJ being worthy of carrying on the tradition of Jaguar's flagship since 1968 can now be set aside. After a \$1.4 billion development investment, it has been scrapped. There are no current plans for a replacement XJ, signaling the possibility that Jaguar's longest running model and flagship of the company for more than fifty years has reached the end of the line. There were a couple of factors contributing to the demise of the XJ. Both related to the "painted into a corner" platform issue.

First the platform that the electric XJ was built upon would apparently not have produced the type of Jaguar electric luxury car needed to compete in the emerging luxury electric car market according to several noted automotive journalists.

Secondly, as indicated by JLR, the MLA (Modular Longitudinal Architecture) platform developed for the electric XJ is not one that Jaguar plans to use going forward. Further adding to the confusion about the path forward, Jaguar does not have a BEV platform suited Apparently the I-PACE for future models. platform is a one-off. Replacing Jaguar's entire existing architecture with a single new BEV platform is a daunting task and one well beyond Jaguar's pockets and timeline. In a recent discussion with investors Bollore was very open about the fact that Jaguar will have to use an existing BEV platform from another car manufacturer. While platform sharing is nothing new in the automotive industry; it is a

clear break from tradition for Jaguar. JLR is currently talking with a number of other makers about using one of their existing platforms, seemingly having abandoned even the idea of joint development. Let's hope they are talking to someone like BMW or Mercedes and not Kia or Fiat. There does not seem to be a contingency plan in place.

On top of dropping both the XJ and the J-Pace, Jaguar has indicated it is moving away from the SUV market, pushing that over to Land Rover. Since the introduction of the F-Pace SUV in 2016, the SUVs, F-Pace and E-Pace, have been the sales leaders helping to keep Jaguar afloat. There are also indications that the rationalization plans may have the XE and XF on the chopping block. That would leave just the I-PACE and the F-Type left. Of course, being ICE powered, the F-Type's days are numbered, four years worth at best.

Jaguar has never been without a sports car in the lineup. From the SS-100 to the F-Type, Jaguar and the term sports car have been synonymous. Jaguar is not Jaguar without a sports car. When asked about the future of Jaguar's sports cars, Bollore replied "It's a question that we are looking at very carefully; I'm not going to answer that right now because it's a question of importance for us, and we will answer when we have decided exactly what we want to do with this new portfolio of Jaguar." I suspect obtaining a platform that will facilitate a BEV sports car may not be a priority in the selection process. It should be.

So, all indications are that Jaguar will essentially be starting from scratch with another manufacturer's platform to build a single platform lineup of BEVs within the next 58 months. Perhaps this signals an intention for Jaguar to become a niche marque like Bentley or Aston Martin. On the other hand, perhaps Tata is shopping the Jaguar name to other investors or manufacturers. Perhaps Canadian billionaire Lawrence Stroll who recently put together a consortium to pump \$250M into Aston Martin will come to the rescue and put the two British sports car companies together again. They shared a platform once before in the mid-nineties. Fantasy on my part? Maybe.



This could go a number of ways. Worst case we become an orphan car club like the MG and Triumph clubs are today. Best case, other than my Aston Martin fantasy, is that Jaguar finds a BEV platform that facilitates a sports car, a luxury saloon and a sports saloon. I believe JLR's newly appointed Chief Creative Officer, Professor Gerry McGovern OBE, will play a huge role in that path to success. Gerry has a long list of creative automotive designs from the MG EX-E concept



and the MG F sports car



to the Land Rover Freelander.

He was awarded Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) in 2020 for services to automotive design. If anyone can take advantage of the endless possibilities that a BEV platform offers for redefining automotive design I believe Mr. McGovern can. With the burden of the engine and fuel tank eliminated and placement of batteries low in the chassis with electric motors pushed out to the wheels the shape of a car can truly be re-imagined. There is potential for a BEV sports car design as beautiful and revolutionary as the E-Type was 60 years ago or a saloon as timelessly striking as the XJ6 was in 1968. Perhaps the sports sedan concept will be redefined as it was with the introduction of the Mk II 3.8. The potential is there.

Predicting the future is risky business. Jaguar Land Rover has decided to abandon its heritage and strike a "Reimagined" path forward. It seems the Jaguar part of JLR doesn't quite know what it wants to be in its BEV future. I've heard it said (or sung) "If you don't know where you're going, any road will take you there." Let's hope Jaguar chooses the right road.

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USING MEMBER FORUMS by Tom Shaner

During this time of confinement, if you find something interesting to our fellow car club members, you can share it on our website through the use of MEMBER FORUMS. Here are the steps to post information, pictures or even videos.

- 1. Logon to the DVJC website.
- 2. At the top of the menu bar on the far right choose Member Forums.
- 3. Now click on DVJC Connect on the left side of the screen..
- You will see a list of viewing topics for you to peruse at the top. Below that, is a section called Create New Topic. You may click and select any topic from the top to find out more on that topic and you can then respond to that topic at that point.
 OR if you don't select one you can make your *new* topic for people to respond to.
- 5. Now make a Title (up to 80 Characters) that accurately describes your subject.
- 6. In the large section below place text information with any JPEG files or links to movie clips (You Tube videos). ****Use the** instructions below for more info on images and video**
- 7. Topic Tags are for people who are searching for information. When you place descriptive info in this box about your post, it will help users to find that specific information.
- 8. "Notify me" check box (when checked) will give you an email reply when people respond to your post. Check this **only** if you want a reply to your posts.
- 9. Lastly, after you have entered all your info, you need to enter **SUBMIT**. Your post will now be listed with the other posts at the bottom for other DVJC users to see, use and react to. Check back regularly to see new and interesting posts from other DVJC members.

Note: After viewing one post and you want to go back to the full list, look to the top of the page and find **DVJC Connect** and click on that (it's small text).

***Posting pictures and video's ***

- Pictures need to be in a certain format to be displayed in the forum properly. They can't be stored on the DVJC website as is due to space requirements. Here is a short list from which pictures can be **displayed directly on the screen** in the forum. Facebook, Flickr, Giphy, Hulu, Instagram, Photobucket, Tumblr, Twitter, Viemo and YouTube.
- Make sure the link is shareable or on the above list (Ex. Flickr), then copy the link (Ctrl C).
 Ex. With a dropbox link, right click the mouse and scroll down to Share section and copy the dropbox link. (It works with Google drive or OneDrive too.)
- 3. Now go to the forum box and Ctrl V (paste the link). The image will now appear in the forum box if from the short list, otherwise a link forms.

This doesn't mean you can't display your JPEG pictures, you just will have a link to the cloud (ex. Dropbox) that needs to be clicked on to see the picture. This is an example using the free Dropbox program. This process works for YouTube videos too.

After you have pressed SUBMIT, the link will work for your picture. Anytime it is pressed the picture will appear. After viewing the posted picture, to go back to read more of the forum, use the *back arrow*. You are back at the forum screen.

Hope this website technology brings more of our club members together in this time of distancing themselves from each other.
