

## BOSTON '87 CONCOURS UPDATE: Lofty England BANQUET SPEAKER

What's an awards banquet without a spectacular guest speaker? To be truly memorable a dinner needs to hear from someone who is an eloquent, well-informed, unique insider with a noted place in history. DRIVE YOUR JAGUAR AT ATCO SPEEDWAY SATURDAY, MAY 16th, 1987

featuring drag strip driving, slalom, & gymkhana

Join us for a full day's participation in driving events designed for average drivers --no special schooling required-- at Atco, New Jersey, on Saturday, May 16, 1987 (rain date May 31). Choose one event or try all three, and enjoy your car's unique acceleration, handling characteristics, and graceful performance under unusual circumstances.

The day at Atco is open to all club members in good standing, and dues may be brought current upon registration for the event. A member may bring up to two Jaguars, and each Jaguar may have up to two drivers. You do not have to own a Jaguar to belong to the club, but for this event, only Jaguars may run on the course. Remeber, all participating drivers and navigators must be club members and all participating cars must be Jaguars.

You will have a minimum of three runs in each of the three events, and more if time permits. The quarter mile drag and the slalom are run against the clock with only one car and driver out at a time. The gymkhana is also one car at a time against the clock, but will require a driver and a navigator. A good way to participate is in teams of two drivers (spouse/spouse, parent/child, firend/friend) with one Jaguar, so that each driver runs the three events and has a reliable navigator at the ready. If you show up single, you should have no problem finding another single who will swap navigator duties with you, or borrowing someone else's navigator.

We start at 9:00 a.m. with a safety check and registration. You will be checked for:

Bring a picnic lunch for yourself, your navigator, and your pit crew/cheering section. Cameras, sungear, and folding chairs will be useful; the club provides sodas and soft drinks. Our day is scheduled to end by 3:00 p.m.

Registration fees are \$20 per car, regardless of how many drivers, and \$10 per driver for each car that that driver wishes to take through the course. Navigators participate for free.






