





Leonia, N.J., July 16,1987 -- Jaguar Cars Ltd., report record worldwide retail sales of 22,184 cars in the first six months of 1987. In addition, a new half-year production record was set with 23,663 cars built, 7% higher than the same period in 1986. 1986 figures were 20,276 and 22,049 respectively.

The company noted that demand for the new XJ6 sedan, introduced in May, was extremely high and that supplies of the 1987 Series Ill sedan were now exhausted. Jaguar anticipates 1987 sales to be slightly higher than 1986 at year-end, as production of the new model catches up to the demand. Deliveries will begin to accelerate in the final quarter of the year.

JAGUAR-RACING NEWS

TWR JAGUAR TEAM WINS 1000 KILOMETER RACE AT BRANDS HATCH, ENGLAND

Leonia, N.J. - July 28, 1987 - Raul Boesel and John Neilson, driving the Silk Cut Jaguar XJR-8, won the Shell Gemini 1000 kilometer race at Brands Hatch on Sunday, July 26 with a lead of 73 seconds over the second place Porsche 962C, driven by Mauro Baldi and John Dumfries. The second team Jaguar, driven by John Watson and Jan Lammers, finished third.

Run in sunny, dry conditions, the race was the 5th victory for Jaguar in the 1987 FIA Sports-Prototype World Championship and gives the TWR team a commanding lead in the team championship, 118 to 74 for the Porsche factory team. With this victory, Raul Boesel takes over the lead in the drivers championship with 90 points, ahead of Derek Bell and Hans Stuck who are tied at 84 points each.

The next race for the Silk Cut Jaguar team will be at the Nurburgring in Germany on August 30th. TWR will field a US-based Jaguar entry in the IMSA Camel GT series in 1988, beginning with the 24 hours of Daytona.



friend of mine came up with a thoughtprovoking little comment during the last
month. We were chatting about Ferraris
and he dropped a sentence into the
conversation: "That was in the days," he said,
"when people still club-raced their Daytonas."
He has a point: when did you last see a Daytona
being driven in anger in a race meeting? Is it
inevitable that great cars must become too
valuable to use as their creators intended?

These days we are accustomed to astronomical auction prices, over which the general media and public can gasp in wonder as millions change hands for some great Classic cars. In a way it is a great thing, for it means that these precious things are preserved for posterity and properly restored where appropriate, but if a car becomes so valuable that it has to be treasured like some exhibit in a glass case it is, in a sense, lost.

Fortunately, most enthusiasts have a healthy desire to get out in their cars and use them properly. This does not mean that it would be remotely intelligent to park a Classic Ferrari GTO out in the city streets and use it for daily business commuting; only a maniac would do that. I have to say, however, that I recoil in horror at the thought of a once-proud car being carted about to concours events on a trailer.

The National Classic Car Concours, held at Beaulieu in June, provoked a great storm of controversy when somebody not connected with *Classic Cars* actually wrote into the regulations a few words about the provision of a trailer park for concours entrants! If any readers have any practical ideas that might lead to the abolition of trailers at concours events altogether we should be pleased to hear from you.

Meanwhile, look out for next month's issue which will with a bit of luck contain news, colour photographs, driving impressions and the full history of an important and historic British car being returned permanently to this country. 


