### JAGUAR AND CASTROL JOIN FORCES

### TO COMPETE IN IMSA CAMEL GT

New York, October 19, 1987 - Castrol Inc., the United States company of the world famous oil company, will be the primary sponsor of Jaguar's IMSA Camel GT entry for the next three years, it was announced today by Graham W. Whitehead, president of Jaguar Cars Inc. and Thomas R. Crane, Jr., president of Castrol Inc.

The program will field Jaguar V-12 powered XJR-9 racers. The cars will be prepared and run by TWR, the racing organization headed by Tom Walkinshaw which won the World Sports-Prototype team championship for Jaguar in 1987. TWR will operate from a base in Valparaiso, Indiana.

# THE WORLD'S FIRST

(Editor's Note: This article is taken from the July/August, 1987 issue of FOCUS, a magazine produced by the World Wildlife Fund)

n a move to help save the species after which it is named, Jaguar Cars Inc. presented a donation to Word Wildlife Fund in April to help support the Cockscomb Basin Jaguar Preserve, the world's first jaguar reserve in the small Central American nationa of Belize.

Over a three-year period, Jaguar Cars Inc., Jaguar Canada Inc., and Jaguar Cars Ltd. in England will donate funds to the

project.

"We are proud to contribute to the survival of this endangered cat and to ensure that nature will not be deprived of an animal of great beauty, agility, and distinctiveness", commented Graham W. Whitehead, president of Jaguar Cars Inc. "Since the company was founded in 1935, we have tried to emulate these same characteristics in the design of our cars."

Wild jaguars once ranged across South and Central America and even as far north as Arizona; now only small, scattered populations remain in South and Central America. The jaguar --

the New World's equivalent of Africa's and Asia's leopard-- is the only great cat endemic to the Americas.


Since 1985, WWF members have supported the establishment and development of the Cockscomb Preserve, which is believed to include twenty-five to thirty of the country's estimated total of five hundred jaguars.

In accepting the donation, William K. Reilly, president of Worl Wildlife Fund, called the project "an important step in protecting the jaguar from possible extinction due to the loss of tropical forests and hunting."

The donations from Jaguar will assist WWF in managing the reserve, training and equipping rangers, and building tourist facilities and an educational center to help visitors learn more about the status and lifestyle of the species.




