NEWS - JAGUAR

JAGUAR plc REPORTS 1987 FINANCIAL RESULTS

Excerpt from report - LONDON, March 16, 1988 -- Jaguar plc reported today that the Company's revenues for the year-ended December 31, 1987 exceeded £1 billion for the first time in history. Total sales were £1,002.1 million, 31% up on the £830.4 million achieved in 1986.

Profit before tax was £97.0 million as compared with £120.8 million recorded in 1986. This decrease was largely due to forther significant weakening of the U.S. dollar against sterling, a £15.3 million increase in depreciation charges, a £15.2 million insrease in research and development expenditure and inefficiencies associated with the phasing out of six-cylinder Series 111 production and the gradual build up of new XJ6 sedan volumes.

Vehicle production increased by 16% to 48,020 units despite the substantial reorganization of sedan car manufacturing facilities which occurred during the year.

The Company's Birectors recommended a final dividend of 6.80 pence which, added to the 3.70 pence paid as an interim dividend, gives a total dividend of 10.50 pence per Ordinary share - a 10% increase over the 1986 dividend.

Editor's Note -- Jaguar Cars Inc. is the U.S. subsidiary of Jaguar plc. Jaguar plc is now quoted on the New York Stock Exchange. I checked with my broker this AM (4/5/88) quoted - \$5.23.






