On the 18<sup>th</sup>, thanks to Mike Wolf, we met at the Eastwood Company in Pottstown, for a facility tour, a little car care advice, and some retail therapy. That was followed by lunch and libations at the nearby Sly Fox Brewery. Mike relates that these events were a year in the planning. Happily, they were well executed and attended.

Both of these were enjoyable and well spent Saturdays, shifting our 2023 schedule into a higher gear. Most importantly, during February we welcomed one returning members and three new member/co-member pairs, who are recognized elsewhere in this issue of the Purr. We're glad to have you join us!

As we are fond of saying around here, "Come for the cars, stay for the people." As your membership director, I am first concerned with maintaining our cohort of member Jaguar enthusiasts and supporting events and activities which inspire participation and enjoyment. However, as we all do, I also care about the cars! While they are mere contraptions (however aesthetically or mechanically wonderful they may be), more importantly they are the glue which holds us together through our common passion. Or diversion. Or obsession, as the case may be. Accordingly, and as I've done from time to time in this space, I thought I would check in on the collector car val-

ue scene.

One source of information which I follow, and I suspect many of you do as well, is the Hagerty Market Rating. It claims to be ". . . calculated through a comprehensive algorithm of fifteen weighted measures including the Hagerty Price Guide, auction transactions, insurance data, opinion from industry experts, and the world's largest database of private sale transactions." sounds impressive, right? Well, Hagerty reports that their Market Rating hit record highs in 2022, but ended the year on a slide which has continued into 2023. They point out that although there were record sales in the January warm climate auctions, that nevertheless those were achieved more through volume than price. In fact, average sale price at auction has dropped about 4% from the comparable period last year.

Hagerty suggests two takeaway messages: 1. The market appears to have shed the feeding frenzy behavior seen during the pandemic and returned to normal, albeit an elevated normal compared to pre-pandemic levels, and 2. Economic uncertainty continues to weigh on their Market Rating scheme. On the second point, Hagerty further speculates that ". . . economic uncertainty often leads average collectors to more defensive spending, while the ultra-wealthy buy up physical assets to hedge inflation." They cite Rick Carey, a noted auction analyst and industry expert: "The market appears to be bifurcated, with typical moderately-priced 'mainstream cars' that represent the bulk of the market being soft, and others in six and seven figures being avidly chased with wild amounts splurged on them."

All of this considered, I remain skeptical that an-

yone opining on the collector car market is any more accurate than the rest of the economic pundits, who are of course all over the lot right now. What I do know is that the acquisition and upkeep of the Jaguars we know and love is as much a passion play as it is an economic decision. When it comes to these types of automobiles,

### **JUDGES TRAINING 2023**

Dear fellow DVJC members,

This letter is an Invitation to Concours judge's training, in preparation for our Concours on Saturday June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2023.

All current and former judges as well as any member or co-member interested in becoming a judge are welcome. At these training sessions we will be using the 2023 Judging Guide, required by JCNA. We will also take the test provided by JCNA and discuss some of the finer points of scoring a Jaguar. If you have not judged in the past, as an apprentice, you will be assigned to a team of experienced judges, which provides the opportunity to develop your judging skills.

The venue and dates are as follows.

March 18<sup>th</sup> Workshop at Leo Kob's in Valley Forge, PA

April 2<sup>nd</sup> Training/Testing at Jim Sjoreen's in Wayne, PA

April 15<sup>th</sup> Workshop at Tony Tinari's in Huntingdon Valley, PA

April 22<sup>nd</sup> Training/Testing at Alan Brown's in Solebury, PA

<u>Training and Testing</u>: We will review the JCNA judging guide and any approved changes made this year. Participants will also take the test prepared by JCNA followed by a related Q&A discussion. Judges must attend at least one of the training/testing sessions.

<u>Workshops</u>: Hands-on judging of member cars followed by a review of each team's scores. The purpose is to expose new judges to the scoring process and provide all judges with the opportunity to review and discuss how potential imperfections should be evaluated and scored, including the proper methods for recording deductions.

- 1. Your confirmation of commitment to judge.
- 2. The model of Jaguar you would like to judge.
- 3. Which if any car(s) you will be entering.
- 4. Which of the venues you will attend.

# 2023 DVJC Concours - CMoE (Cars & Motorcycles of England) - Ales & Petals at Hope Lodge By: Jim Sjoreen, Concours Chairman

As Bill Beible shared in his monthly column, planning for this year's concours and CMoE is well underway. The planning committee, with representatives from DVJC, DVT (Delaware Valley Triumphs, LTD) and the Friends of Hope Lodge, is reviewing the results of last year's show and paying special attention to those things that need additional work this year. We have been fortunate since returning to Hope Lodge in 2018. The weather, attendance and support from both volunteers and sponsors have all contributed to the success of the event, year after year. Enough can't be said about our hosts, the Friends of Hope Lodge, who work tirelessly throughout the year to help maintain and promote the historic home that is Hope Lodge. Our co-sponsors and friends at DVT have made CMoE a go-to event for British car owners in the Mid-Atlantic states and beyond. The same is true for our club's concours, which is an important event for those who work to maintain the originality or in some cases, modify their cars in accordance with the judging guidelines published by Jaguar Clubs of North America (JCNA).

For those new to the club, the three title events are held on the grounds of the Historic Hope Lodge in Ft. Washington, PA and for 2023, the date is Saturday, June 3. It is a rain or shine event. DVJC's annual Concours d'Elegance is one of the club's signature events and brings together a wide range of Jaguar cars to be viewed and/or judged in this JCNA sanctioned event. Combined with the more than 150 British cars and motorcycles registered with the CMoE, there is something for everyone. Ales & Petals, sponsored by Hope Lodge, includes food, beer and music available in the gardens surrounding the home. More information will be forthcoming but mark your calendars...it is not to be missed!

The concours and CMoE are also opportunities for members to show their support for the club, both through registering their cars and volunteering. Those who have participated in the past know that it takes dozens of volunteers to make it happen and we've been fortunate year after year with members stepping up to help. Each year I'm amazed at the number of members willing to chip in and assist with all that it takes to make the show a success. Due to a personal commitment on June 3, I will not be in attendance but Jay

Greene and Greg Morrison have both graciously volunteered to lead the effort this year. To provide them with support that they will need, I'm calling on a few good men & women to help them manage the critical tasks that are key to the success of the concours and CMoE. It's vital to fill these leadership roles in order to provide a point of contact before and during the event. In no particular order, the roles are:

- Chief Judge Alan Brown
  - ♦ Responsible for recruiting, training, assigning & assisting concours judges.
- Show Field Parking Open
  - ♦ Recruit and assign parking volunteers on Saturday to direct registered cars to the assigned park spaces. (Starts at 7:30 AM and goes until all show cars are parked.)
  - ♦ Assist with field layout on Friday (Timing is dependent upon field layout by DVT)
- Spectator Parking Open
  - ♦ Responsible for coordinating with DVT and Hope Lodge on all things related to spectator parking including:
    - ⇒Coordinating the volunteer schedule (time slots) for day of show parking with Dave Samtman of DVT.
    - ⇒Help DVT with setup of spectator parking on Friday (if needed)
    - ⇒Recruit & assign DVJC volunteers to agreed upon time slots.
    - ⇒Monitor assignments the day of the show to ensure slots are filled.
  - ♦ Attend Hope Lodge monthly planning sessions (ZOOM or in person) when possible
  - ♦ The second largest commitment of volunteers behind judging.
- Concours Score Sheet Tabulation Open
  - ♦ Responsible for the timely and accurate tabulation of the concours score sheets.
  - ♦ Recruit volunteers (concours chairs to assist)
- Membership Tony Tinari
  - ♦ Recruit and assign volunteers to staff the membership tent
- Merchandise Noe Laframboise
  - ♦ Responsible for inventory and point-of-sale activities the day of the show

- Assistant Concours Chair(s) Jay Greene and Greg Morrison
  - ♦ Attend Hope Lodge monthly planning sessions (ZOOM or in person)
  - ♦ Recruit, assign and assist designated leaders of key roles above.
  - Recruit and assign volunteers to help transport tables from (Thursday evening) and to (Sunday morning) Graeme Park.
  - A Recruit and assign volunteers to help with setup on Friday.
  - ♦ Recruit and assign volunteers (2) to staff the Registration Tent on Saturday
  - Recruit, assign and monitor score sheet runners.
  - Assist with trophy setup and presentation.
  - ♦ Recruit and assign volunteers for cleanup on Saturday.

One thing to keep in mind when reading the above is that no one in any of these roles is on their own. Greg & Jay will be working with you every step of the way to make sure you have the necessary information and resources as will oth-

ers. It's worth noting that both Greg and Jay are certified and active judges so all the more reason to help them out. Other volunteers judge and enter cars as well. We simply need folks in these leadership roles to make sure our volunteers have the direction they need at any point in time, particularly on the Friday before the show and Saturday, the day of the show. PLEASE, do not be intimidated by what may seem to be an overly large commitment of your time. As the saying goes, "many hands make light work". 





## **Recognizing 1972 E-Type Changes**

For the April 2022 edition of the Jaguar's Purr, I wrote an article about recognizing 1961 E-Type changes that happened in that specific year. Each follow-on month covered the next production year. Last month introduced the Series 3, and this month we will talk about what happened at Jaguar in 1972, as well as seven easily recognized changes for that model year.

Sir William Lyons retired completely as Chairman in March 1972 (See October 2022 Purr article where I detailed the early career years of Sir William Lyons). The Jaguar factory suffered a labor strike in July and Aug 1972, bringing production to zero for those months. This was indicative of the turmoil that was going on in the motor industry. Here is a brief history of name changes and mergers in the British auto industry in relation to Jaguar.

In January 1934 Sir William Lyons became Chairman and Managing director. The company name was changed from SS Jaguar to Jaguar Cars Limited after the war to be politically correct. In April 1952 BMC (British Motor Company Limited) was formed with a merger of Austin and Morris. In September 1965 BMC took control of Pressed Steel, who made Jaguar bodies along with other products. In September 1966 BMC absorbed Jaguar, a decision agreed to by Sir William Lyons, hoping to secure Jaguar's future with the impending Japanese car market share threat. Sir William then became Managing Director. In December 1966 BMC changed its name to BMH (British Motor Holdings Limited). In December 1967 Sir William Lyons switched titles from Managing Director to Chairman. In May 1968 BMH merged with LMC (Leyland Motor Corporation Limited) to become BLMC (British Leyland Motor Corporation). In March 1972 Lyons retired as Chairman. In 1975 BLMC collapses, and was partially nationalized into British Ley-

# **MODEL YEAR 1972 easily recognized changes:**

1) Starting 1 October 1971 (after completing 2,435 LHD Series 3 cars), the emission control information sticker was changed from small to larger for U.S. bound cars. The location for both versions was inside the bonnet on the back of the right front wheel well inner wing. (See reference 7, p343). Starting:

LHD chassis- 1S20103(OTS)//1S72335(2+2).

2) Starting 1 January 1972 (after completing 4,004 Series 3 cars), the raised cast letters "JAGUAR" on the cam cover was replaced with a sticker. This was to facilitate also using the same cam cover on the Daimler V12. (See reference 1, p125; reference 7, p343). Starting: Engine number 7S3905.

LHD chassis- UC1S20169(OTS)//UC1S72662(2+2); RHD chassis- 1S1210 (OTS)//1S50968(2+2).

3) Starting 1 January 1972 (after completing 4,004 Series 3 cars), North American cars had an additional prefix "U" (for U.S. specification), followed by a "C"(for model year 1972) in the chassis number. I neglected to mention in last months' 1971 article that all Series 3 cars no longer had the chassis number stamped on the picture frame. Rather it was stamped on the bulkhead, near the heater, in addition to the bulkhead mounted commission plate. (See reference 1, p159). Starting:

LHD chassis- UC1S20169(OTS)//UC1S72662(2+2).

4) Starting 1 January 1972 (after completing 3,673 2+2 Series 3 cars), the feature to flip the rear squab (seatback) forward on the 2+2's was deleted, and the rear seat became fixed. This was done to modify and strengthen the rear seat belt attaching point. This started for the North American market, and later all 2+2 cars. (See reference 7, p294). Starting:

LHD chassis- UC1S72662(2+2); RHD chassis- 1S51013(2+2).

5) Starting 1 January 1972 (after completing 2,828 LHD Series 3 cars), remote control door mirrors were fitted to the drivers side on North American car doors. (See reference 1, p140, reference 6, p126). Starting:

LHD chassis- UC1S20169(OTS)//UC1S72662(2+2).

6) Starting 1 January 1972 (after completing 4,004 Series 3 cars), lashing points were added to the front chassis cross member, and to the rear lower shock absorber mounts. These were not for towing. By the way, this item really cannot be judged in a concours as the judge is not allowed to look under the car. (See reference 7, p290). Starting:

LHD chassis- UC1S20169(OTS)//UC1S72662(2+2); RHD chassis- 1S1210 (OTS)//1S50968(2+2).

7) Starting late January 1972 (after completing 4,102 Series 3 cars), fresh air vents with control

levers for passenger and driver side were added. The air feed consisted of a box mounted above each shock absorber with a screen filter and a corrugated tube. (See reference 5, p679). Starting: LHD chassis- UC1S20173(OTS)//UC1S72682(2+2); RHD chassis- 1S1236 (OTS)//1S51016(2+2).

Trivia item- The foot board that came with Series 1 and 2 cars was deleted on Series 3 cars. It was provided to be used on the passenger side for shorter passengers for something their feet could lean against. If you don't have one, don't despair, most got lost in the last 60 years.

REF 1- One of my favorite reference books is "Factory-Original Jaguar E-TYPE". It was written by Anders Ditlev Clausager, who was the archivist for BL Heritage and the Jaguar Daimler Heritage Trust from 1979-2012.

REF 2 - The JCNA website has the Judge's Guide for Series 3 posted. It references some changes and their respective chassis numbers.

REF 3 - My go to reference is XKEDATA.com. Approximately 30% of E-Type owners have their cars registered. Researcher beware, an owner sometimes types in the wrong data, or could post a recent (modified) photo of his car that is not original.

REF 4 - Dr Thomas Haddock has 2 excellent books titled "Jaguar E-Type Restoration Guide",

and "Jaguar E-Type Originality Guide", which document many changes with pictures. Dr. Michael Mueller co-authored the originality guide.

REF 5 - Philip Porter has an excellent book, "Jaguar E-Type, the Definitive History".

REF 6 - Paul Skilleter's book, "The Jaguar E-Type, A Collectors Guide", details many Engineering changes by chassis # and date.

REF 7- Malcolm McKay just published a new 400 page reference (June 2021), detailing more info on all three series, with many great pictures on almost every page, many contributed by Chuck Hadley of Monocoque Metalworks.

REF 8 - The three amigos---Robert Stevenson authored the Ser 1 judges guide, and was chief judge for Michigan. Stew Cleave authored the Series 1.5, Series 2 and Series 3 judges guides, and was chief judge in Oregon. George Camp lives in South Carolina and is president of the Coventry foundation. He oversees the tool loan program and assisted greatly in all judging guides. I have had the privilege to consult and learn from all three in the compilation of these articles, and without their assistance these articles would not have been possible.

# Recognizing 1972 E-Type Changes (cont'd.)

For the purposes of the production numbers in the tables below, a model year was produced until December, and the next model year started 1 January. It should be noted a car assembled in the fall and then delivered in the next year might/might not be registered as a newer model year, depending on

the country and dealer, and even the owner's preference. (Nobody wants to buy last year's model, at full price). These two tables will be recurring in the last two articles on the follow-on Series 3(5.3) model years.



Other work done during current ownership: New main engine seals; front brakes and calipers; stainless steel exhaust system; new seatbelts; overhead cam gaskets replaced; heater blower replaced; new shift boot and trim; replacement Motolita wooden steering wheel (original available) and wooden shift knob; new main and secondary clutch cylinders; new main brake cylinder; rebuilt oil pressure sending unit and gauge recalibration—now works the way it should.

This E-Type is a fine driver level E-type, but I am not driving it sufficiently, and I am at the point where I need to downsize. I would love to see the car go to someone in the club.




The intention here is for the DVJC's library to be easily accessible to all members.

On Groundhog Day, Brian sent me an email reminding me that my XJR was the DVJC Calendar Jaguar for March, and he pursued me to write a story about it. I said ok, but writing about the XJR has to be a story more about my other cars and DVJC experience that lead to finding and having my XJR.

Being part of the "Speed Racer" Generation, I always had an eye on a Jaguar. I always thought the Jaguar XKE, now I call it E-type, was an incredible looking car. Going to the New Hope Auto Show, I always found time to admire them. I went to my first IMSA sportscar race at Pocono in 1983, and saw the XJR-5, of Bob Tullius' Group 44, tear up the road course winning the race.

I became a real sports car fan, wanting to become an engineer to design race cars. My first car was a Triumph Spitfire, which gave me a taste of English car ownership. I became a big Porsche fan, and my dad went through a bunch of Porsche's. That could be another story.

I went to the 24 hours of Daytona and Le Mans in 1988, seeing the XJR-9's, of the Tom Walkinshaw Racing Team take First Place in both races. It was a 1984, the year I graduated high school. Could I buy the Top-of-the-Line Jaguar for 1984? did. I brought the XJ-S for \$2,800. I had my Classic.

Now what??? Join a Jaguar Club of course.

So I looked online and found the Delaware Valley Jaguar Club. The first event was Drag Racing Night at Atco. I had done Sports Car Club of America Solo II, Autocrosses. So Drag Racing was going to be Autocrossing in a straight line. I needed a current helmet and I looked up the specs. I got a new helmet at a Harley Dealer, and off to Atco I went with my XJ-S and new DVJC membership. Rich Rosen set the event up, so he was the first guy I met. It took forever to race. I was on the line with an XJ6, so there were a total 18 Cylinders on the line. I smoked the XJ6 with my 5.3 V12 XJ-S.

The next event was breakfast at Andy's Diner. It was the club Election Day, so it seemed everyone showed up. I will never forget that meeting. What a crew. Three guys really stood out. Charlie Olson , Michael Tate, and Kurt Rappold. Plus the food was good.

Well as time when on, the XJ-S transmission developed some trouble. I showed up at events with my Mustang, but began a quest for another Jaguar.

First which Jaguar??

Roger Bono had a neat 1996 Vanden Plas that I checked out and wish I had the funds for it at that time.

The big thing was the OBD2 Computer that was in all 1996 and newer Cars. I started to study the X300's, and began look for the ones 1996 or older.

### My XJR Story (continued)

Another car I checked out had the back quarter windows knocked out. That was a "No." I even went to Baltimore looking at one. The one with the most history was William Eastburn III's XJ6, now owned by George Carr's family. Eastburn pulled into his office in Doylestown and a female client blocked him in with her Audi 5000. She then shot him while he sat in his Jaguar. He did live to tell the tale.

I checked out a 1992 Vanden Plas. That had those crazy automatic seat belts.



Then one day there it was one on Craigslist list. A 1996, XJR (Factory Code X-306), with a Supercharged 6 and a 5-Speed Stick. Wait, Jaguar made a Supercharged 6??? I had to go see this. I

drove to Lebanon, PA in my Mustang to see. It was beautiful. All Black. I was in awe. It took about another 3 weeks to get the funds together. It was a little more than I wanted to pay, but it was a lot more Jaguar. I took ownership September 22, 2020.

With the Supercharger, it puts out 322 Horsepower. The 5 Speed isn't stock and makes it a rocket. I even found a vintage E-Type Shifter Knob for it. It is the fastest car I ever had. I took a trip down to Atlanta, GA with it. On the way back I hit 106mph on the Richmond, VA bypass late at night. That is the fastest I ever drove it. I read there is a lot more Engine to go, because this Jag-

uar is rated as 153mph top speed. The only major problem I had with the car is the tyres. It has Continentals on the 17 inch Smoked Stock Wheels. They just aren't strong enough for City Driving. The First Delaware Valley Jaguar Club Event I took it to was a Fort Washington Park Lunch. I loved the reaction everyone had to the car. I took it to a few car shows. I won a prize for the Jaguar at a Bucks County Mustang Club Show, and the Perkasie Foreign Car Show that Ragtops & Roadster Sponsors. I have to thank Dave Hutchison for handing me the trophy that night.

Kevin Fitzgerald had the idea of taking photos of the XJR for the DVJC Calendar. The fall of 2021, I drove to Kevin's place for a photo shoot. We took some really nice photos, but we lost the spot on disk of the better camera for the photos I wanted to use. I have an iPhone photo of the shoot that shows what Kevin's trees look like in the early fall. But not enough photo for the calendar. So, last spring, it was another trip to Kevin's for more Photos. It was worth the trip and Kevin's Place is a beautiful background. (See photo below)

The Supercharger belt just went, and I think it will soon be time to rebuild the Supercharger. The Rebuild kit is about \$180. Doesn't look too hard. I am having problems with the wheels being "old". They need to be worked on. It is a 27-year-old car, but X300 cars are built very well. They are Jaguars, so there are issues. But what a Great Jaguar I have. I plan to have my XJR a long time and take it to many DVJC Events.
