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

In a recent press release, Jaguar Cars announced that they have shared sound recordings of the 2024 F-Type R 75's exhaust with the British Library archives to preserve the V8 sound of the last combustion engine Jaguar sports car. Personally, I'd much prefer to hear and drive "real cars" than ride in an EV.



While not publicly acknowledged by Jaguar, some automotive industry publications are now reporting that Jaguar plans to reduce its U.S. dealer footprint, currently nearly 400 dealers, to less than 100. Apparently, the initiative is already underway. I know of several instances in various parts of the country where dealers have resigned from their franchise agreements.

The reimagined Jaguar Cars will be offering a limited number of all-electric models and will be competing "head-to-head" with Aston Martin, Bentley and Maserati. Jaguar Land Rover has chosen to cede the larger market segment that includes Audi, BMW and Mercedes Benz to those companies and other competitors. Their business plan for materially increasing profitability is based on selling a smaller number of cars, each with much higher selling prices and unit profit margins, in sufficient volume to earn an acceptable return on their investment in development and factories. The limited product line requires correspondingly lower investment than a broader selection. It follows logically that far fewer dealerships are necessary and that the dealers that remain will be concentrated in wealthier areas of the country.

No dealers have been or are being forcibly terminated. Contractually, dealership franchise agreements are "evergreen" and may only be terminated by Jaguar for cause, typically fraud. Instead, dealers are offered an opportunity to "resign the Jaguar franchise without penalty." Nearly all dealer franchises include both Jaguar and Land Rover vehicles. The penalty that would otherwise be incurred is loss of both product lines. Terms of the resignation require dealers to continue providing Jaguar parts, service and technical support for a minimum term of five years which can be extended by mutual agreement. Here's hoping the company successfully competes in this higher priced, extremely demanding market segment.

You may recall that in this column last month, I introduced our "Nice Jag" membership initiative, featur-

ing a newly minted leave behind piece for the recruitment of potential new members and their cars. With your indulgence, I'll quote myself from that article: "In the spirit of full disclosure, this is hardly an original idea." As it turns out, that was more than accurate, as I have now learned from our friend and colleague, Noe LaFramboise.

When Noe and I met up for the New Hope Automobile Show on August 13 (at which Noe's gorgeous XK 140 won the Jaguar class for the 5^{th} or 6^{th} time-I've lost count . . .) he presented me with an artifact of DVJC history, pictured below.



This was apparently the precursor to our current offering, proving that there is really no new idea under the sun, and also the truth of my earlier disclosure. The reverse side of this card, in font a bit too small to reproduce legibly here, went on to cordially invite owners of "show-worthy" Jaguars to the DVJC Fifth Annual Concours d'Elegance at the Glenhardie Country Club, King of Prussia, PA on October 11, 1970. The event was billed as a "beauty contest" for modern and vintage Jaguars.


Noe reports that the card had been placed under one of the three windshield wipers of his thenowned 1969 Series 2 E-Type 2+2, and that it motivated him to become a new DVJC member. He still recalls that both the setting and the catered September 2023

food for the 1970 Concours event were wonderful. I'm uncertain whether his car was deemed sufficiently show-worthy to win the beauty contest that year. However, he obviously contracted a chronic and persistent case of Jaguar fever, of which the example below is acutely symptomatic



Now, just for the record, when that card was distributed in October 1970 Richard Nixon was in his first term as President, the war in Vietnam was still ongoing, and the internet had not been invented, let alone smartphones and QR codes. I was a first semester freshman in college with way too much hair (photo ID proof below) none of it yet gray, and my 1970 Series 2 E-Type was presumably in the hands of its first owner with less than 1,000 miles on the odometer. And they were still making them. And I had no idea that I would ever own one someday. How time flies. Sigh.



Noe has remained an active DVJC member since that first encounter. It seems to me this is reinforcement of the "Come for the cars, Stay for the people" principle which I believe still informs

The Winemaker's Ride-Jaguar E-Pace



Our dear friend and fellow DVJC member since 1996, Amos Gerald Kunkle, Jr passed away peacefully on Saturday, August 5, 2023 in his home, surrounded by his family. Gerry, as we knew him, was 85 years old, just a couple of weeks short of his 86th birthday and spent 63 of those years with his lovely wife, Ella Jane, affectionately known to us as EJ. Gerry was an active member of both our local club and the Jaguar Clubs of North America (JCNA) and a tireless worker for both. He served as treasurer for the DVJC (as well as being advertising director) for eight years, the Coventry Foundation for seven years, the Austin-Healey Sports & Touring Club for 20 years, and the Lehigh Valley Chapter of the American Rhododendron Society for many years and he regularly volunteered at America on Wheels Museum. Gerry grew up north of Harrisburg and was a graduate of Greenwood High School where he played the clarinet in the school band and was an Eagle Scout. He went on to earn his bachelor's degree from Susquehanna University and worked for Price Waterhouse and Bethlehem Steel before starting his own practice as a Certified Public Accountant in Bethlehem. Throughout his life, Gerry assisted both the young and the elderly to ensure their physical and financial health. He was a life-long blood donor to the Miller-Keystone Blood Center.

Gerry was definitely a full-fledged "gear-head", that malady with which most of us (and our significant others) live. He always enjoyed sports cars and his first was a Triumph TR4A. That was followed by a brand new 1972 TR6 which EJ drove for many years. His first Jaguar was a 1970 By: Paul J. Merluzzi

Series 2 E-Type followed by several more E-Types, an XK120, and a Mk2. He has driven his E-Types to Championship Challenges in Phoenix, Indianapolis, Atlanta and Sturbridge. Most recently he owned a 1966 E-Type coupe, a 2016 F Type coupe. His daily driver was a 2015 Land Rover Evoque. Gerry also owned an Austin Healey 100 and an Austin Healey 3000.

Gerry was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in January of this year and by the end of March was in very bad shape. But his medical team, with the blessing of Gerry and EJ, tried a more aggressive treatment and he started to improve. By the beginning of July, he was walking again, at times up to three miles. But by the end of July, after his chemo treatment, he started to slide downhill again and was placed under hospice care. According to EJ, he claimed that he suffered no pain and he was very lucid to the end. His neighbors and members of the Rhododendron Society paid a visit to honor him with an early birthday party. The Austin-Healey Club was planning to honor him at their Concours d'Elegance in September, due to his failing health they brought him an award the night before he died. The Coventry Foundation has renamed their library 'The Amos Gerald Kunkle Research Library' and will have a ceremony and hang a metal plaque in his memory at the JCNA International Jaguar Festival to be held in September in Columbia, SC. The library was established in 2018 and is dedicated to the history, repair and maintenance of Jaguar Cars.

In addition to EJ, Gerry is survived by daughter Barbara Elaine Kunkle of Manilla, Philippines (who came to the US to be with him in his final days). his son Douglas Gerald Kunkle of Allentown, and his sister Joyce Kunkle of Myerstown. Funeral Services were private per Gerry's wishes. In lieu of flowers Gerry requested that contributions may be made to the Coventry Foundation, 6236 St Andrews Rd, Columbia, SC 29212 or to the Miller Keystone Blood Center, 1465 Valley Center Parkway Bethlehem, PA 18017.

Rest in peace, Gerry. Wherever you are, it is a better place because you are there.

How To Photograph Your Jaguar

It is time to start thinking about making photographs of your special Jaguar. The 2024 DVJC Calendar Committee will assemble all the photographs in October and print it in early November. Here is a short guide to making great photographs of your car. If you would like me to do it for you at no charge, call me to make arrangements (see below).



1- Lighting is important. The open sky lighting that occurs during the 1/2 hour before sunset or 1/2 hour after sunrise is called the golden hour. Notice how nice your paint looks during these times compared with broad daylight. Work in the open shade. Don't stand with the sun at your back and cast your shadow across the car!



2- The background is important. What is behind your car completes the story about your car. Try to find a place that is a similar era to your car. The car is part of a composition. The most visually important places are at 1/3 and 2/3 of the horizontal and across the center in a diagonal. The car will make a diagonal leading your eye from front to back. The background helps bring your attention around the top and back to the front. Avoid distracting background content.



3- Avoid a wide angle lens. Todays camera/ computer/phone devices are very capable. They default to wide angle "to get everything in." What you want is a portrait lens that is equivalent to about 80mm in 35mm format. The portrait setting that blurs the background on your phone might work, but it is designed to recognize people, not cars. Be prepared to stand back about 25 to 30 feet from your Jaguar.



4- Resolution and cropping are important. Each year we receive lovely photographs that are too small or cropped too tightly. The calendar page is 8.5x11 inches and the printer's standard is 300 pixels per inch (ppi). A high quality photograph that measures 7x10 at 300 ppi will work well. A little will get cropped off each side. A full frame 35 mm has an aspect ratio of 2x3, which works out to 6.7x10 inches. About 1/2 inch will be cropped off each side. Some camera phones have an aspect ratio of 3x4. This is more square, so some is cropped off the top and bottom. Use the 16x9 video setting with caution. It is very narrow.

5- Have fun and be creative. Try low angles, high angles, looking at the other side, the back and different backgrounds.



September Calendar 2023—My Jaguar Story

As a child I was always very interested in



cars. My parents, both teachers, had little interest but I enjoyed building models of ships, planes and especially cars. One car I remember building as a kid was a large model of an

XKE coupe. Its unique design fascinated me and I might have seen a real one once or twice. The neighbor next door was a young nurse and she had just gotten a new '64 Mustang convertible. Boy, I wished I had one.

As I got older, I asked for magazine subscriptions for Christmas like <u>Road and Track</u> and <u>Popular Mechanics</u>. From about age thirteen, I would read about the cars for sale in R&T and wished I had enough to buy just one. As I approached driving age, I would read the Inquirer classified ads and scan the "cars for sale" section. This was the best way to see what was available at the time. No <u>BAT</u>, <u>Hemming's or Auto Trader</u> back then

Instead, first car was my great aunt's '54 Oldsmobile 2 door HT in robins egg blue with white trim and wide whitewalls. She had passed so I got a car that was unreachable for a teenager with little to no money. Despite it being fifteen

years old, the car had only 23,000 miles and was in nice shape with a Rocket V8 engine. It was a struggle to pay



insurance and other expenses at the time. I taught myself basic auto maintenance and installed an 8-Track player in the car. During college, the car stayed at home but, since my home was in State College, I could walk over and get it anytime.

After graduation, I began teaching school outside of Philadelphia. My Oldsmobile had finally died and I was carless but needed transportation for teaching. My parents would select my next car. (ugh!) It was a big ugly 4 door Chrysler Newport. I tried to convince them to buy a Chevy Monte Carlo for only \$200 more. No deal! I knew the car was going to be a problem from the start but there was no telling them. As a single teacher I had little budget for a car.

Still reading car ads in the paper daily, I came across an old '46 JEEP CJ-2A for \$400. I jumped and purchased the clunker. A friend in a



service station nearby helped me fix the electrical wiring and I was on the road. The old Jeep was fun but it was short-lived as a car turned in front of me and it was totaled. How was I to satisfy my

car passion? With the insurance payoff, I was on the hunt again. I traveled to a new classic car dealer looking at an AC Bristol (\$12,000), Ferrari Super America (\$18,000), and a Ferrari Daytona (\$28,000). Everything was out of reach on my salary.

Again the classified Ads provided a very interesting car, 1960 Austin Healy (model BN7) 2 place for cheap (\$800).

The car had been driven hard but was fairly rust free with a new paint job. The engine needed a complete overhaul. I loved the British cars from the start and this was one of my



favorites. I took a chance and found a good mechanic to rebuild the engine with me supplying the parts. That Spring, I had a great driving Healy that I took to the shore for my summer job. What a time I had driving the Healy at the beach!

The fall of 1976 brought my special car to me. As always, I was reading the auto classifieds and



came across an Ad: **1969** Jaguar XKE 34,000 mi. with new red line Michelin tires \$2900. This sounded compelling to me and it was local. I called and found that the father of the owner was selling the car because the origi-

nal owner just couldn't sell it. He had bought the car upon returning from Vietnam and his wife was now having a baby. He needed the money but just hated parting with his car. I was interested so I gave the father \$50 to hold the car for three days. I went to banks but they didn't do loans on older cars. I got a loan at my credit union and went to pick up the car. Wow, was I stoked.... Finally, a car that I really wanted to own! Now I owned two fabled British sports cars. That winter I found an empty local garage for the Healy and, for one winter, drove the XKE. In bad

weather I took my beater, a VW Squareback Wagon. That summer, my pocketbook could not support two English sports cars so I grudgingly had to part with one. I sold the AH 3000 at a small profit. That next winter, I found free storage in my grandmother's garage for



the E-Type. She told me that when relatives would stop to see her, they always asked if my car was in the basement and wanted to see it.

The next year I met my wife, Carolyn, and all she knew was that I had a horrible VW ride. The passenger door was held closed with a bungee and, during the winter there was no functioning heat or defroster. We usually took her car, an early stick shift Subaru wagon. That spring, I asked her to go with me to pick up my Jag at my grandmother's. She was in disbelief and thought I was joking. When we arrived I introduced her to my beautiful XKE. A year later (1979) it carried the newlyweds away as our wedding car.



At this point, my parents thought I should get rid of the yellow "money pit". Carolyn said no, that it was part of my life, my hobby. Later that year, we were building a new $2^{1/2}$ car garage for our first home. We made sure it was

just big enough to get both of our cars in and the Jag would just fit diagonally in between Carolyn's Volvo and my 1969 MB 250 4 speed. Ten years later, one of the major points when looking to up-



grade from our starter house was a three-car garage or barn.

In the 1980's we built our beach house on the Outer Banks. We even managed to drive the E down to the house once. The car ran great on that long haul but comfort wasn't like a modern car. We often forget, when driving a 50 year-old car, how much autos have changed, even the Jaguars. Despite that, the XKE made many visits to State College on football weekends.

Over the last 45 years, the car has been well maintained and updated (electronic ignition, Aluminum radiator/fans, complete front end rebuild, triple carbs, stainless exhaust, updated starter, new seat leather, much more) as best as I could and regularly

driven by both Carolyn and me. I did try to contact the original owner, Tom Ebaugh, in 2007 but found he had passed at an early age. I'm sure he would have loved to see the car again after all these years.

My son, Jake, really loves the Jaguar and



enjoys driving it. He and I had a great shared adventure at Watkins Glen in 2018. Recently, Jake got married last September 24th 2022 in Boston and his wedding car was my wedding car. My XKE Jaguar is a legacy car for our family and will continue to be passed down. It has truly

played a starring role in the family history----







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
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2023 Car Show Calendar
