Your Monthly Bill December 2023



I woke up to flurries this morning and was rudely reminded that winter is on the way and that many of our Jaguars may not see the road again until spring. Fortunately, we had a long autumn with plenty of great driving days! I do hope that each of you experienced a relaxing and enjoyable Thanksgiving holiday.

DVJC members participated in two events during November. On Sunday, November 12, seven of



us took part in the 5th Annual Phil-a-Trunk food drive supporting Philabundance. Well over 1000 cars and trucks gathered in South Philly at the sports complex. Each of us filled the boot of our car with nonperishable foods. Together, our club donated over 400 pounds of food to the charity. After making our dona-

tions, we drove to the Penrose Diner for lunch. Food donations at this year's event totaled "approximately" 177,731 pounds. Ken Caplin, driving a beautiful triple black XKR, parked with our group of Jaguars. I am pleased to tell you that he joined DVJC that same day. Welcome Ken!

On the following Saturday, over thirty members made a destination drive to the Air Mobility Command Museum at the Dover, DE airbase. Lunch at McGlynn's Pub followed the excellent guided tour. About half of the group, then drove a short distance to the Johnson Victrola Museum. Thanks to Bill Thompson for planning and organizing the day's activities.

If you haven't already done so, <u>register now</u> to reserve your space at our Sunday Brunch at the Desmond Hotel in Malvern on December 10. The buffet offered at the Desmond is extensive and of the same quality as at the Plumsteadville Inn and what we enjoyed at the Springhouse Tavern before they changed their menu.

We are kicking off the 2024 event calendar with DVJC Day at the Movies on Saturday January 6. *Ferrari*, the film, follows the personal and professional struggles of Enzo Ferrari, the Italian founder of the car manufacturer Ferrari S.p.A. Event details will be shared as soon as they are finalized.



Registration is now open for the 2024 Holiday Party on Sunday January 21. We had a terrific turnout last year and hope to see even more members and guests this year.

Events for February and March are in the final planning stages and will be posted soon.

Earlier this month, you received an email soliciting nominations for Jaguars to be included in the 2024 Philadelphia Concours d'Elegance, a charitable fund-raiser supporting the Rare Genetic Disease Program at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. Jaguar is the featured marque this year and fifteen to twenty SS and Jaguar cars from all decades through the 1980s will comprise about half of the vehicles in this judged event. I encourage you to consider nominating your car.

Your Monthly Bill December 2023 (continued)



By all measures, JLR's current fiscal year-to-date (first half 2024) financial performance is dramatically better than that of FY 2023. Worldwide sales revenue through September 30 was a record \$17.4 billion, 42% greater than the prior year period. Two factors drove this achievement, 29% higher unit sales and a better (more profitable) mix of vehicles sold. They reversed the pretax losses of prior years and earned a solid \$1.1 billion of pretax income. The company is now in a solidly positive cash position and, in fact, paid down a substantial amount of debt. Assuming this performance continues, this bodes well for Jaguar introducing its reimagined vehicles beginning in 2025.

As I searched for the latest information, I learned a few things. First of all, the nearly production-ready all-electric XJ replacement was scrapped because design constraints of the underlying platform prevented differentiation of the car as "potent and exuberant" according to the new CEO, Adrian Mardell. The platform now being used is a long wheelbase configuration designed exclusively for Jaguar. They plan to offer three models, a four-seat GT saloon to be introduced in 2025, a Bentley Bentayga-sized SUV and an "imposing limousine" version of the same car.



The new face of Jaguar, according to a recent Autocar magazine article, will be "a copy of nothing," a quote attributed to Sir William Lyons.

- No obvious inspiration from any model, past or present.
- Larger and more luxurious than the most recent XJ.
- No Leaper!
- Bonnet longer than that of any previous Jaguar.
- No rear windscreen! A digital "mirror screen" will be positioned below the front windscreen.
- Smaller screens at the bases of the A-pillars will replace sideview mirrors.

Whatever the appearance and capabilities of the final version, its introduction will be an exciting time for Jaguar.



How To Place Your Order

All that is necessary is a visit to your nearest Jaguar dealer to select the exact model, and colors for the exterior and interior of the car. Make sure you buy through the American dealer to whom you will be going for future service. Payment is normally arranged with a small deposit and full payment 30 days before delivery.

Documentation has been reduced to a minimum. For Britain, car purchase order form and purchase tax exemption form (in duplicate). Both will be completed by the dealer. For the Continent, car purchase order form and Power of Attorney form (in duplicate), page 1887 to speed our registration in advance of arrival. necessary to speed car registration in advance of arrival.

Take Delivery In Any Major City

Delivery charges vary according to the country and city chosen, and the distance from the Jaguar factory in Coventry, England. Charges range for example from Coventry itself (\$39), London (\$56), Paris (\$182) to Rome (\$346). These charges include delivery by bonded bi-lingual drivers; license plates; and associate membership in the Royal Automobile Club, which has representatives at all major ports and cities; and who offer many useful services for the motorist. Current American driver's license covers you in most countries.

Airport or dockside deliveries are not necessarily recommended due to the uncertainties of late or even early arrivals. But such veries can be arranged at an extra charge of \$15 in the U.K. or \$25 extra on the Continent.

Car insurance is compulsory abroad and can be arranged through the International Department of the American Automobile

Arrangements For Shipping The Car Home
Return shipment is easily arranged and instructions can be confirmed before actually leaving the U.S.A., through the Jaguar shipping agents Dunnington and Arnold, Inc., 19 Rector Street, New York, N.Y. 10006; or abroad through the Jaguar factory representative or through a shipping agent. Shipping and marine insurance charges are for the account of the purchaser.

In Britain the car can be left with the Jaguar London shipping agents or at the factory itself in Coventry. It is then shipped to the U.S.A. with other new Jaguars under factory supervision. Cost varies according to model and ports, from about \$250 from England to East Coast U.S.A.





XJ12 1996 - X305 - "Nelson" (December Calendar Car)

I am pleased to share a bit of info about my 1996 XJ12, a gracious 4-door limousine in royal blue,

officially "Sapphire" blue. I gave it the name "Nelson" as a nod to Admiral Horatio Nelson, hero of the North Sea who broke through the French dominance in the years 1780-90.



As you may know, in Holland, the land of Heineken beer and tulips, we admire heroes of the sea, just as we love Jaguars.

I started with a 5th generation XJ6, a so-called X300 from 1995-97. A merlot red one. I soon figured out the bigger brother (a V12 with a 6.0L



engine, including many updated tech features produced under, at that time, the relatively new mother company Ford) was the one to have. The

6-cylinders sold well in those years and are still relatively easy to find, but the V12 - in good condition - is almost impossible to locate. Thanks to the various events and tours of the DVJC, I collected bits of info and insights and kept my eyes open.

In early 2020, just before COVID hit, I was on a multiple day business trip to Florida. During that

trip I found an advertisement for an "XJ12 for sale", in Sapphire Blue with only 64K miles . . . that could be something special. It was a two



owner sedan, from a real Brit with an engineering background. "That must be a great car," I thought. A few phone calls later I got in touch with the seller, Mr. Rob. He had 2 Jags (an XK and this



XJ) and was on his way from Punta Gorda, Florida back to the UK. During the year, he lived 6 months in Florida and the other 6 months in the UK, but now getting

older he decided to retire on the other side of the Atlantic, back home. He decided to only take the XK with him, not the V12. Lucky me!

My biggest challenge was to see and drive the car. The business event I was attending was near West Palm Beach, on the eastern side of Florida. The Jag however, was on the western side- a solid three hour drive. But I only had three-quarters of a day left as my return flight would leave at 3:00 PM. Luckily, I had a good rental car. I prepped the night before for an 'en route' breakfast with some coffee and left at 6:00 AM, in the dark, on a new adventure! My appointment with Mr. Rob and the car was at 9:00 AM for a brief inspection and test drive. Was that going to work? Well, yes, it all worked out well! With a handshake and down payment, the deal was settled at the spot.

During the flight home I could only think of how to get the car to central NJ. It was the middle of winter! I did some research and found a RoRoauto-train from Orlando to Washington DC, but

that left me with 2 legs of the journey unplanned, each about of 2-3 hours driving. Flying back and driving it home was a bit complicated and risky. In the end, I found a shipper who could transport it



door-to-door for a reasonable sum. It would take a bit longer, but I wasn't going to drive XJ12 too much anyway during the wintertime. Being a Florida car, it had never seen snow or salty roads!

Finally, I had Nelson in my driveway. Of course, a few things had to be done -like most Jags!- but



overall it was in great shape and I had the whole history from day one. It had initially been leased for two years in Florida near Boca Raton until Mr. Rob bought it. He was out for an XJ6

but could not resist this beauty in the dealer's showroom. He had it for twenty-one years and only put 40K miles on it, then he moved to western Florida, where I found it.

The first thing I did, with a passionate, professional Jag mechanic, Mr. Ross, was new tires, belts, hoses and some bushings. The wiper was dry-rotted and had probably never been used! Next was replacing the 'plastic side' wall radiator,

as it had started cracking, with an all-aluminum one; then recharging the AC and most recently, completely redoing the rear suspension, shocks and coil springs. Man what a limousine! It is always a great pleasure to take Nelson out for a tour. And the V12, it keeps going and going with all that torque, i.e., 4000 RPM at ~100 and we still have 2000 RPMs to go till the red zone(!); it sails smoothly, like the "HMS Victory" under Admiral Nelson on a serene ocean.









Some details:

The 1995-97 series is the **X300** (6 Cyl. with AJ16 engine), it was a 'conservative design evolution' of its predecessor, the XJ40.

This V12 is the **X305.**

The later V8 (from 1998) is the X308.

And the later Alu V8, from 2004 onwards is the X350.

The X300/305 received 14 individual honors from America to EU alone as 'Best Luxury Car' and 'Best Dream Machine'.

It was the first model, fully styled by in-house chief designer **Geoff Lawson**.

The AJ6 series and V12 were the last engines produced at the **Radford Coventry plant**, the old Daimler home (since acquired in 1960).

Good for **313 hp.**, 0-60 mph. in 6.9 sec., and ready for any Tesla above 70 MPH.

353 lb/ft @ 2850 rev min... I am sure it can pull a full size 5^{th} wheel.

It has all the 'Vanden Plas' features (incl. lw. body and walnut trays) but is not badged as such.

Hope to see you 'en route'!

Members interested in extending the loan period can do so if there are no holds placed by other members. The extension request can be made by emailing library@delvaljaguarclub.com


The intention here is for the DVJC's library to be easily accessible to all members.


To kick things off, here are some ideas based on past articles:




