Paul served as vice president and president of the club and was the prime mover behind the successful 2015 JCNA Annual General Meeting hosted in Philadelphia by our club. For Jaguars driven to the visitation and memorial service, Mike Wolf arranged special parking, including a “missing man” space honoring Paul.



For many years, Paul closed his emails with this postscript, “Life is not a journey to the grave with the intention of arriving safely in a pretty and well preserved body, but rather to skid in broad side, thoroughly used up, totally worn out, a Martini in one hand, a cigar in the other while loudly proclaiming – WOW – What a ride!” He lived it! We will sincerely miss Paul, a man of many talents and, most of all, a gentleman.

While it seems like ancient history, our 2024 Concours and CMoE at Historic Hope Lodge was another huge success. The weather was ideal and the grounds were filled with beautiful and unique

The Philadelphia Concours d’Elegance was a raging success! DVJC was well represented at the Saturday evening Gala Preview Dinner, during the concours on Sunday and as entrants in the show. Fame all contributed banners and other materials that were displayed throughout the Simeone Foundation Automotive Museum. During the Gala Preview Dinner, I made brief remarks about DVJC's partnership with the concours team and shared a video introducing our club. Paul Trout produced the video which will be posted on our website in the near future.

There was a total of sixty-seven cars entered across the three divisions in the show: Concours d'Elegance, Jaguar Field of Honour and the Car Corral. Of those sixty-seven cars, forty-three were Jaguars, twenty-eight of which are owned by DVJC members. Our club members "took home some hardware." Tony Tinari organized a membership table that included information on our club, JCNA and the Coventry Foundation. Our DVJC video played continuously on one TV and a JCNA video looped on a second TV. Tony, Kevin Fitzgerald, Kathy Goldberg and others staffed the table throughout the weekend.

JCNA has reorganized the membership committee under a new leader, Nedra Rummel of the San Diego Jaguar Club. A new, complementary, Marketing Committee is now functioning under the leadership of former JCNA president Les

Hamilton. The membership committee's primary focus is improving the effectiveness of individual club's membership activities to maintain and increase their rosters. The marketing committee's mission is focused on external promotion of the JCNA brand. Tony Tinari regularly represents DVJC in both forums.



The final Jaguar F-TYPE sports car made at the brand's manufacturing facility in Castle Bromwich will join the Jaguar Heritage collection – 50 years to the day since the last Jaguar E-type drove off the production line. It is a 5.0 litre V8 Convertible in Giola Green with a black roof and a Tan Windsor leather interior – [similar to](#) that of the 5.3 litre V12 final E-type Series III Convertible built in 1974 and registered as HDU 555N. 87,731 F-TYPEs have been produced since their introduction in 2013. This compares favorably to the total of 72,528 E-types manufactured by Jaguar.

Jaguars were front and center with a wide range of models and years. We welcomed several new members and their cars this year, which bodes well for the health of the club as does the addition of many late model cars.

The coordinated efforts of volunteers from all three organizations are responsible for hosting what has become a must-see event in the Northeast. 

The back story about this month's calendar car

I confess. Like many JCNA members of a certain age, I have always admired the shape and beauty of the Jaguar XK series. My favorite has always been the XK 150 DHC and I have longed for one since I first saw them at a neighborhood Jaguar dealership in New Jersey when I was just a budding motorhead. But alas, an opportunity for ownership never materialized even after a long and storied history of owning a variety of sporting cars from the US, Italy, France and England including Lotus, MG and Triumph. That is until we retired in 2019 and decided to stay in our home instead of moving away to some exotic location or downsizing. So, after suitable garage space was constructed and we joined the supportive members of the DVJC, I started looking for just the right car pausing momentarily to acquire several other exciting and worthy Jaguar automobiles.

Following years of searching and scrutinizing XK examples on a variety of on-line sales venues and working with local dealers, my number of disappointments grew and grew. I had watched and bid on one Imperial Maroon over Tan example that caught my eye but bidding quickly exceeded my budget and never hit the owner's reserve that I, like probably other bidders, thought was unrealistically too high anyway. In the meantime, I found a genuinely nice XK150 DHC example that had been extensively restored by a well-known restoration shop in California over 20 years ago. It was driven extensively throughout the west by an

immensely proud owner and enthusiast who put quite a few miles on it. Although this example had been modified with a BMW 5-speed, upgraded electrics including a modern starter, alternator, and audio system, etc., the owner kept all the original parts along with a mountain of receipts and manuals. However, the paint was beginning to show its age with some areas that made both the owner and me suspicious of emerging tin worm damage. Making inspection difficult, the car had been relocated to Hawaii years ago and the balmy sunshine augmented with salt air had not been kind to the car. Still, we negotiated back and forth for a couple of months, even planning for shipping from Oahu to PA, but I just could not bring myself to offer what he wanted for it. He subsequently listed it on BaT but still did not receive an offer he could accept. Below is a picture of that car resplendent in the brilliant Hawaiian sunshine and foliage.

But the example I found on BaT earlier and that did not sell wound up as a consignment at a large Corvette and muscle car dealership near Los Angeles, CA. Understandably, the dealer apparently knew little about Jaguars and even less about this XK150 DHC but it was obvious this car had been subjected to extensive restoration that included the drivetrain, electrics, interior, bodywork, and paint. The owner's reserve was well over what was bid on during the previous BaT auction.

I began to develop the history of the car and discovered the present owner owned several Corvettes, many of which were extensively modified. Moreover, he knew little about this particular Jaguar and never drove it. He had purchased the car at a well-known Pebble Beach auction several years ago for about 20% over what he wanted for it now. But his health was rapidly failing, and he and his family were getting anxious about selling this and some other cars in his collection. Armed with some additional information and VIN, I was able to track down the auction sale in Pebble Beach and more importantly, the dealer who sold it there. He is a very well-known Jaguar marque specialist in southern California who sells a lot of XKs and is a frequent advertiser in the Jaguar Journal. He confided he did not do much to the car following his purchase of it several months prior at an estate auction near St Louis, MO. But he did say he had reason to believe that the previous owner was the person who paid for the extensive restoration work that was mostly completed at a "Jaguar marque specialist" in Indiana between 1995 and 2005. Who else could this have been but Muncie Motors and OSJI? He also explained that the car had an immensely powerful audio system installed when he bought it which he removed prior to showing it at the Pebble Beach auction. He also opined that the interior was "over restored" and the colors had been changed making this car less than ideal for concours judging to JCNA standards. But he left the interior intact and thought that the odometer was rebuilt when the car was restored and correctly read about 400 miles when he bought it. He ordered the Jaguar Heritage Certificate of Authenticity that revealed this particular car had left the factory in 1958 with a black exterior and red inte-

rior. He also confirmed the car's cylinder head did not leave the factory at the same time as the car but it was otherwise a number matching example with a comprehensive bare-metal color change performed to an extremely high standard. In spite of these irregularities, he was quite surprised when it was sold at auction for such a high price but was probably very pleased to have made a tidy profit on the sale.

So I was confident this was a good car with a decent history but simply wasn't worth the asking price. I moved on. A couple of weeks later, the dealer called me and said the owner was willing to reduce his price and asked if I would like to make him an offer. Also, the dealer had experienced typical Jaguar problems trying to drive this unfamiliar car on demonstrations and experienced the predictable challenge of finding someone to work on such an alien car in a universe of Corvettes. So, I offered him what I thought was fair which was much, much lower than the owner's highest bid on BaT by about 30%. The dealer called me back later that day and said we had a deal. Naturally, I questioned the wisdom of my offer but felt confident that I could overcome whatever mechanical problems lurked beneath that pretty bonnet.

Since our car was in LA and we are in PA, I followed the dealer's advice to let him arrange shipping with the transport company he uses for Corvettes. A couple of weeks later, our "new" Jaguar arrived at a convenient location near our home. Following an hour of trying to get one of the Corvettes on the transporter started and unloaded to make way for the XK150, the Jaguar was difficult to start and ran poorly. After putting some gas in it, we limped home and immediately began finding things wrong with it.

I discovered the poor running condition was caused by a clogged pick-up tube in the fuel tank so a quick shot of compressed air fixed that problem only to uncover a questionable fuel pump and carburetors that were way out of adjustment. After fixing the fuel problem, replacing the wire wheels and tires and addressing a number of other drivability problems, we were off and took the XK150 on its maiden DVJC event that was not too far from our home.

We were so pleased, we decided to take our “new” Jaguar on the New England 1000 Vintage Road Rally in just a few months. We drove our “new” Jaguar about 400 miles of varying road and weather conditions and decided it was ready but needed a few adjustments that I felt were best completed by Ralph Steinberg at Cloverleaf.

To our surprise, Ralph prepared a long list of things wrong with our car, for which he is well known. The most significant was the fact that the engine was running on only five cylinders. Although he admitted it did indeed run pretty good for a five-cylinder car, internal inspection revealed a stuck intake valve that was probably caused by the car sitting around for many years without being driven. Fortunately, we have a back-up Jaguar that we decided we would take on the rally leaving our “new” Jag in the capable hands of Cloverleaf who fortuitously had a completely rebuilt and correct head in stock. Predictably, the car was still in pieces for the 2022 DVJC Concours d’Elegance so we missed that event.

Finally, the Jag was ready a couple of months later and we decided to show it at the JCNA Concours d’Elegance hosted by the Jaguar Association of New England (JANE) August 20. The event was being held in Sudbury, MA where we used to live



20 years ago so we could combine the concours with visiting our old friends. We registered for the event, made some hotel reservations, polished up the XK150 DHC for show and loaded it along with some spare parts into our car trail-



er. The event was a huge success and the location at the historic Wayside Inn could not have been better. The JANE members welcomed us warmly and helped us park the car in the Champion area under a magnificent, carpeted tent complete with chandeliers and a bar! The judges were very knowledgeable and the competition was keen as our car was flanked on both sides by two expertly restored XK150S Roadsters, one of which earned Best of Show, Champion Class with 99.07 points. We were very pleased with our car’s score of 96.81. Several unknown deductions were pointed out to us could be easily corrected in time for the 2023 DVJC concours.

Following a pleasant visit with our friends where we drove the car, we loaded the XK 150 back into the trailer and left Sudbury MA headed north to Maine for a visit to Wentworth-By-The-Sea. We drove the XK 150 everywhere along the coast and historic seacoast towns receiving many favorable complements. We encountered some rain, heavy at times, and discovered de-misters in old Jags are not so good especially when it is warm outside as inside. Nevertheless, we identified a few more problems to attend and began making more travel plans for this wonderful Jaguar.

We returned home and drove the XK150 on the Chester County Road Rally at the Radnor Concours d’Elegance on September 10, 2022.



Following that event, we motored up to the Brown’s beautiful home for DVJC outing on a spectacular sunny day where Brian Craig masterfully shot this beautiful calendar photo. The car ran flawlessly and we could not have been more pleased with its performance and comfort. On the way home, we decided our “new” Jaguar was now ready for a longer trip without the support of a truck and trailer so off we went to Jaguars on the Chesapeake in September. Readers of the October Purr may remember the brief description of this excellent event including the Rock Hall Yacht Club Car Show.



We were quite surprised and pleased to be awarded first place among many Jaguars and Best of

Show overall! Pictures still remain posted on the DVJC website.

Following numerous additional repairs and rebuilds of either incorrect, incorrectly installed or not present at all mechanical components, we finally had everything back together and working properly. As we had hoped, the only things required were mechanical in nature and the coachwork and paint remained in pristine condition. So we put our precious Jaguar XK 150 DHC in our heated garage along with several other cars awaiting the arrival of spring. That winter was very, very cold with temperatures well below freezing and with wind chills, well below zero. On Christmas day 2022, our faithful and attentive dogs awakened us to the sound of running water in our master bath above the heated garage. Apparently, a copper solder joint failed dumping high volumes of water over everything taking much of the ceiling and insulation down with it.

Worse yet, the water had run down both the interior and exterior surfaces of our overhead garage doors so both doors were frozen in place could not be opened to let the cars or the water out. Alas, our XK150 was completely doused with a generous quantity of very wet and frozen drywall and insulation. I was finally able to chip away enough ice on the garage doors to start the car and move it outside into the sunshine to melt.

After filing an insurance claim for damages to all three floors of our home, I had the XK150 DHC professionally detailed, polished to a very high standard and ceramic coated. It looked absolutely wonderful and thankfully, the well made DHC hood kept the beautiful interior dry and clean. Our homeowner's insurance paid for all the damage except the cost to repair the defectively soldered pipe joint (\$20). Likewise, they did not cover the detailing of the damaged cars as this work was covered under our vehicle insurance policy with a sizeable deductible on each one about the cost of the detailing work. Nevertheless, we are continuing to repair damage to our home nearly two years later but thankfully, our garage and workshop have all been repaired bet-



ter than new. But that's a story for another time.

In the Spring of 2023, we decided to take our XK150 DHC on a more challenging road rally beginning at the French Lick Resort in Baden Springs IN. The route was about 1200 miles on mostly secondary roads through beautiful mountainous countryside in Tennessee, Kentucky and Indiana. We would drive our XK150 DHC for about eight hours a day for four full days with stops at the National Corvette Museum and GM Corvette Assembly Plant in Bowling Springs TN, the Lane Motor Museum, Gaylord Opryland near Nashville, Andrew Jackson's Hermitage, the Lure Lodge, the Lanier Mansion, the Glen Lake Farm and home of the Lutz's and many other interesting places along the way. Organized by Rich and Jean Taylor's Vintage Road Rallies, these rallies are not particularly competitive although they are timed and scored. Our rally masters were Rich Taylor and Ed Watts of Passport who set the time for each stage that generally includes three or four timed stages per day. We found the stage times challenging to meet in our old Jaguar compared to many participants driving much more modern cars. We quickly made friends with many participants and enjoyed great comradery at the meals and rest stops. If you have never participated in one of these well organized and managed rallies, we encourage you to do so and further information is available anytime at <https://www.vintagerallies.com/> Carol truly enjoyed the event and although we did not finish with the fastest participants, we truly enjoyed the event that was our 5th with Rich and Jean. Thanks to Rich and Ed Watts who snapped these photos.



As some readers may already know, these old XKs are not easy to drive quickly especially on unfamiliar, mountainous roads with their primitive gearboxes and heavy steering. Carol took some driving tips from a couple driving their 1956 XK-140 S-Roadster who had bought the car new and raced it competitively ever since! They were both accomplished

drivers and were generous in offering their advice and experience with us. Carol got very good at driving our XK150 and received complements from other accomplished drivers of much faster cars who had trouble keeping up with her!

When we returned, we cleaned up the Jag which we had trailed to and from Indiana and immediately entered it in the 2023 DVJC Concours for judging in the Champion category. This was the second time we had it judged at this JCNA level. The crack team of DVJC judges found a number of unauthentic items that had not been previously discovered. Nevertheless, we received a very good score of 97.830.

We don't expect to increase our JCNA Champion score unless we make several important changes back to the car's original equipment and specifications. This would include reverting back to an OE Lucas generator in place of the GM single-wire alternator and removing some modern wiring and of course, refitting our cooling hoses with those troublesome Cheney-Style OE hose clamps. So instead of competing for better scores at the Champion level of JCNA judging, we will continue to drive our XK 150 DHC and enjoy the reliability and comfort of the car as it presently stands. It is truly a wonderful car and we remain very pleased with it.





2024 Car Show Calendar

If you're looking for places to take your car this season, you've come to the right place. I've assembled the following list of 2024 noteworthy events, including several first-time listings, which are marked with an asterisk. **For all events, I recommend calling ahead or visiting the organization's website to confirm dates, times, and weather contingencies.** The first listing in this article is our annual JCNA-sanctioned Concours event, which will happen rain or shine on June 1 at Hope Lodge in Ft. Washington. At the time of this writing, the weather forecast for that day looks picture perfect.

You probably know about **Cars & Coffee**. In southeastern PA, the biggest one is in Bethlehem. It's huge (at least 500 cars), held one Sunday per month from April through September at the Steel-Stacks campus. April 21, May 19, June 16, July 14, August 25, September 22. Traditionally, European show cars and exotic cars are directed to park up front, near the pavilion. www.steelstacks.org/carsandcoffee.
