Our 2024 DVJC Membership Survey has closed, and I'm happy to report that out of a possible 173 respondents, 88 of you actually did so. Thank This computes to a response rate of you! 50.87%. Interestingly (to me at least), our 2021 survey had 81 responses out of a possible 161, for a response rate of 50.31%. So, we have increased the rate of response by a little over one half of one percent. I'm told by folks who ought to know this stuff, that this is a very high rate of participation for a survey-unless there are matters to complain about-which is definitely not the case here. The survey is now off of your "to do" list, and onto mine, to prepare a summary of the results. Please expect a full report in next month's Purr.



Major thanks also to those of you who have renewed your DVJC membership for another year of Jaguar fun. As of this writing, our 2025 membership census is 133 regular members, 4 associate members, and 3 honorary members. Even accounting for the 7 new members who have joined us since October 1 of last year, we have a bit of a way to go in order to get back to our 2024 year end "high water" mark of 180 Jaguar enthusiasts. Each year we expect a bit of attrition due to Jaguars sold, member relocations, and other personal reasons. Your DVJC officers and directors are following up with an outreach to the approximately 30 non-renewals (a/k/a not paid)

members who have not already indicated they will not renew. We'll see how that goes, however last year we "recovered" about half of the people on that list.



Shape of Jaguar Things to Come?

For the last two months I have written in this column about reaction to the big JLR "reveal" of its reimagined, rebranded, image. So, I should probably now just leave well enough alone until the new Jags are ready for sale, right? Wrong. I just can't help myself. AND, fellow members, there is news to report-yes, the plot has thickened like 15W-40 motor oil . . .

On January 15, the automotive publication The Drive published an article intriguingly titled "Leaked Memo Reveals Jaguar Designers Were Worried About Rebranding Years Ago". Given that creativity naturally involves a level of sub-





1967 Jaguar E-Type 2+2 Coupe, February Calendar Car

Jaguar E-Type 2+2 Coupe is a late July 1967 open-headlight model known as a Series 1.25 E-Type. A total of 3,682 Jaguar E-Type Series 1 2+2 Coupe cars were produced from March 1966 to July 1967. The 2+2 coupe's wheelbase and body are 9 inches longer with wider doors and 2 inches of additional height designed to accommodate two child passengers on a small rear seat. The red leather rear seat rotates forward to provide extra room for storage.


This 1967 Jaguar E-Type 2+2 Coupe was originally dispatched from the Jaguar Coventry, England factory to Peter Lindner Jaguar Daimler Importeur, Frankfurt, West Germany as a German-specification car with 3.07 ratio 4th-gear drive (providing a cruising speed of 130 mph at 5,000 rpm) and distinctive German-Swiss safety knock off wheel hubs. It was sold new by Lindner

Jaguar in Frankfurt to a U.S. Air Force Captain in September, 1967 who sent his brand-new Jaguar to Riverside, California for his next posting at March Air Force Base. This matching-numbers car with just over 70,000 miles has extensive paper documentation from 7 owners, including 3 classic car collections since 1989 in Georgia, North Carolina, and New Jersey.

I purchased this car in 2018 and was able to drive it despite multiple electrical harness and engine seal leak problems. It always started and was a solid driving car, but the engine ran too hot in the summer. The Jaguar needed an engine rebuild, along with minor body rust repairs, a new paint job, and also the red leather interior replaced. Eddies Restorations, Elwood, NJ—with over 60 years of Jaguar repair and restoration experience—completed a 4-year total restoration in

June, 2024 including metal body work, Jaguar dark-blue polyure-thane enamel paint, rebuilding the original 4.2L engine with installation of new main bearings and "0.020" overbore Mahle pistons, rebuilt or new mechanical and electrical components along with new wiring harnesses, new MWS chrome wire wheels, and new OSJI red leather seats and interior.

This 57-year young Jaguar E-Type is road ready and regularly driven. The car wakes up at about 65 mph and will be driven on longer road trips once the rebuilt engine reaches the 2,000 miles mark. Since the restoration it has been shown at both the 7th Annual Philadelphia Concours D'Elegance at Simeone Foundation Museum and the Classics at Brantwyn in Delaware.







5.3-liter V12 engine






5.3-liter V12 engine from a 1973 XKE with less than 45k miles in excellent cosmetic and mechanical condition. All of the usual repairs have already been completed with some by prior owners such as cooling system cleaning and head rebuilds. These offer much better adjustment of idle mixture and fuel metering at speed and load. At that time, all fuel hoses and clamps were replaced. Also of note, the distributer has been re-





curved to incorporate vacuum advance rather than vacuum retard. This was done to encourage more suitable shifting from the OE automatic and better throttle response under load. These and other modifications retain much of the originality of these remarkable V12 engines but with notable performance improvement making this particular 5.3-liter V12 exceptionally well suited for use with a manual transmission. This engine runs perfectly and without fault as is shown in video clips that are available upon request. It is 100% reliable and in excellent cosmetic and mechanical condition and ready for installation in a suitable chassis.
