Annual General Meeting Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the AGM and why is it held each year?

- a. Jaguar Clubs of North America bylaws require conducting an annual meeting of representatives for local clubs such as ours. Clubs are represented by delegates appointed by club boards of directors or by proxies that the clubs designate.
- b. Annual election of the president and vice president of JCNA occurs at the AGM.
- c. Competition rule changes (concours, slalom and rally) require affirmative votes of delegates.
- d. Other matters may, from time to time, require a vote of local club delegates.
- e. Review and discussion of numerous issues of interest to local clubs and their membership occur as part of the meeting. There is an extensive agenda published on the JCNA website in advance of the meeting.

2. Has DVJC selected delegates?

- a. Ed Petrow will serve as one of our delegates.
- b. A second delegate has not yet been selected.

3. Are there other benefits to AGMs?

- a. Developing and maintaining networks with members of clubs throughout North America.
- b. Exchanging ideas and sharing experiences helps all clubs improve.
- c. Local club members meet and interact with JCNA officers, directors and staff.

4. Is the AGM "strictly business"?

- a. Absolutely not! The weekend program includes the formal AGM business meeting, "tech sessions," a driving tour, two social events and ample free time to make new friends.
- b. Social events include an evening at the Simeone Museum with a "Taste of Philly" buffet dinner on Friday and a cocktail hour and banquet Saturday evening.

5. Are DVJC members invited to participate in the full slate of weekend activities?

- a. Yes! Our members are encouraged to participate in as many activities as they would like. All events are open to club members including the formal business meeting of the AGM which takes place on Saturday. However, only club delegates may vote on AGM proposals.
- b. "Members" includes both members of a household (member and co-member).
- c. Events are "a la Carte." You are only required to register and pay for events you will be attending. There is no general AGM fee and no fee for the Covered Bridge Drive.

6. What 'special' events will be central to the Saturday Evening dinner? Having just spent several hours seeing DVJC friends at the Friday events, is there something else about the Saturday dinner that would justify spending the time/money to come to it?

- a. The keynote speaker at the Awards Banquet on Saturday evening is Brandon Baldassari, Jaguar's Director of Brand Development. He will be addressing the reimagining of Jaguar and its new, highly anticipated product line.
- b. A famous "mystery guest" will join us for cocktails and dinner.
- c. Gary Kincel, Coventry Foundation Chairman of the BOD, will be presenting a Founders Award to someone who has made major contributions to sustaining Jaguar Heritage.
- d. JCNA service, competition and newsletter awards will be presented. DVJC members are usually well represented among the recipients of these awards

7. Why is DVJC organizing this "national event"?

- a. Hosting this meeting rotates between clubs throughout JCNA.
- b. We hosted a very successful meeting in 2015 at the Sheraton Society Hill in Philadelphia.
- c. Hosting that event gave our club a "big boost." As volunteers helping with the meeting, many members became acquainted with each other and the vitality of the club took a big step UP!



Membership Musings

March 2025

As Jaguars rest in the garage under cover and on battery tenders, awaiting the first signs of spring, I'm going to devote the entirety of this month's column to reporting upon our 2024 DVJC Member Survey. Surely, fellow members, this will be a relief from reading my usual monthly ramblings! Soon you'll be able to access the full survey report by visiting the "Members Only" section of the DVJC website. We'll send you an email when that is posted. Meanwhile, I'll summarize some of the salient findings for you here.



Of all the statistics to report, perhaps the most important is the final participation figure: 88 members (out of a possible 176) replied, for a response rate of exactly 50%. Interestingly, that is within a percentage point of the response which we enjoyed on the first DVJC member survey in 2021. Think of it this way-of all the events and activities of DVJC in the year 2024, the survey itself had the greatest member participation. And of those responding, a substantial number provided written comments in addition to their survey responses. Persons familiar with such things tell me that this rate of response and comment is considered very good for a survey of this nature, unless it is indicative of a controversy-which is certainly not the case here. While the survey instrument and data collection were completely anonymous, I extend thanks again to each of you who engaged and helped provide very useful data-you know who you are!

Our survey elicited information on several aspects of the club: some high-level demographics, our events and activities, our communications and media, and our members' perception of club value and their level of participation. Below, I'll

address findings regarding those categories of inquiry, and provide some comparisons to the results of our 2021 member survey. (Percentage figures in the following comments are rounded to the nearest whole number; the actual numbers appear in the results presentation.)

ABOUT US: We learned that while DVJC membership tends to be a long term commitment (42% over 10 years, 16% 5-10 years), there is also a healthy cohort of newer enthusiasts (36% 2-5 years and 6% first year members). About 64% of our members are Pennsylvania residents, followed by New Jersey (17%), Delaware (12%), and a few members in Maryland or elsewhere. Unsurprisingly, while Jaguar ownership is not a prerequisite for membership, about 52% of those responding own one Jaguar, while an additional 42% are caretaking two or more. It appears that the number of members with multiple Jaguars has increased about 4% since 2021, indicating that some of us apparently just never learn. Lastly, the number of members who describe themselves as retired has increased from 48% to 52%. (Maybe that 4% increase includes the same folks who bought another Jag . . .) The other 48% of respondents characterized themselves as employed, self-employed, or semi-retired.

ABOUT OUR ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS:

This time around we simplified the questions on this subject, and asked people to evaluate the categories of events in the three years since our first survey, without reference to any one particular event. We used a sliding scale of 1 to 5, with a higher number signifying a more positive evaluation. The data in this category are complex, yet extremely helpful to DVJC leadership in evaluating our past event offerings and planning for 2025 and beyond. To fully understand the survey findings, it's worth a look at the full survey report to be posted soon. For present purposes, here is a summary of the types of events followed by the percentage of respondents who scored them a "4" or a "5": Concours d'Elegance (95%), Holiday Party (90%), Gatherings of Friends (88%), Driving Events (84%), Spring Fling (83%), Monthly Breakfasts/Lunches (81%), Judging Clinics (80%), Multi-Day Tours (71%), Slalom (66%).

As in the 2021 survey, our signature event, the Concours d'Elegance, was the most highly rated, with other unique events, such as the Holiday Party, Spring Fling, Gatherings of Friends, and Driving Events receiving high marks as well. Given that the three-year period represented in the current survey was relatively "COVID free", it is especially interesting that the results generally track those of 2021 at which time the pandemic recovery was still getting underway.

To inform prospective event planning, we inquired about what types of events DVJC should sponsor in 2025. A chart showing those responses appears on page 11. We also asked what geographic location is preferred for club events and learned that most respondents prefer future events to be held in the suburban Philadelphia counties, followed by northern Delaware, central New Jersey, and Berks and Lehigh counties, in that order. As for the day of the week and time of day for the recurring monthly gatherings, opinion strongly favored Saturday (61%) vs. Sunday (39%), and lunch (75%) vs. breakfast (25%).

OUR COMMUNICATIONS AND MEDIA: We took the opportunity to ask you about the ways in which we communicate and learned that nearly everyone (96%) reads *The Jaguar's Purr* on a regular basis; this is identical to the 2021 percentage. Feature stories and upcoming events are the most appreciated elements, followed closely by the regular monthly columns and member articles. As for additional email communications from DVJC, a large majority (99%) feel the frequency of those is about right.

Quite surprisingly, only 48% of those responding are regular visitors to the DVJC website, down from 56% in 2021. Curiously, 95% of those responding are followers of our Facebook account (up from 31% in 2021) and 22% follow us on Instagram (up from 11% in 2021). HOWEVER, the total of those responding to the social media questions was only 37 of the 88 total respondents. So, we conjecture that among those who are fans of social media, more of you do Facebook than Instagram.

We dove a little deeper this year into opinions on the *Jaguar Journal*. Here, nearly everyone responded to the question. 91% receive the Journal in printed form, and 51% say they would react negatively if the Journal were only available electronically. That said, only 41% would prefer to continue receive the Journal in printed form if there were a \$10-15 surcharge for a print copy.

CLUB SATISFACTION AND VALUE: We dared to ask a few ultimate questions, the responses to which are shown in the charts on page 11. First, a new question for this survey: "How would you rate your overall experience and satisfaction with DVJC?" I'm pleased to report that the combined "4" and "5" responses on that one total nearly 96%. We then repeated a question from the last survey, namely "Do you agree you have received good value from your DVJC membership in 2024?" Nearly 98% of those responding replied with a "4" or a "5", up from 83% in 2021. Needless to say, a very gratifying response from the members who answered that question.



When posted, I suggest that browsing the presentation slides is worth your while since all of the verbatim comments, lightly edited for brevity, have been included.







With great pleasure, I present Tony with the 2024 Kurt Rappold President's Award.



My 2005 Jaguar X-Type Sportwagon, March Calendar Car

Question: Is it a Station Wagon, Estate or Sportwagon? Answer: It is all three and I use them interchangeably, but officially, it's a Sportwagon. Built from 2005 through 2009 Jaguar sold 1,602 X-Type Sportwagons in the US. At that rate my 2005 X-Type Sportwagon represents 0.0625% of the Sportwagons imported over that period. I purchased my X-Type Sportwagon in December of 2019. Depending on how you count I'm either the 2nd or 3rd owner. The original owner purchased it from Jaguar Cleveland, OH. He then passed the car to his daughter, keeping it in the same family.

Growing up, my parents always had a Ford, Chevy or Buick Station Wagon. Given my love of all things Jaguar, it was natural for me to want a Jaguar Station Wagon for my daily driver. Finding one that was relatively close to home was the issue. When my X-Type Estate appeared on eBay in Raleigh, NC, I decided the time was right and made what I felt was a low initial offer. As luck would have it, my offer was accepted. I concocted a plan involving taking an all-night bus from Philadelphia to Raleigh to buy the car and drive it back home to New Jersey.

Of all the Jaguars I have owned, my X-Type has more Ford in it than any other. My previous daily driver was a 2001 4.0L S-Type that sits on the Ford Lincoln LS and Thunderbird platform. For the X-Type, Jaguar did not have a front wheel drive platform where the engine was mounted transverse, so Jaguar/Ford took the European Ford Mondeo platform and added a transfer case to give the X-Type true all-wheel drive capability. It's a simple system and performs well in the snow.

The only engine option for the Sportwagon was the 3.0L naturally aspirated V6. Most think it's the Ford Duratec engine but that's only part of the story. Would you believe the engine is Porsche design? Porsche sold the design to Ford Motor Company who turned it into the very capable Duratec. But that wasn't enough for Jaguar who took the basic block of the Duratec engine and engineered better heads and ancillaries to better match the performance Jaguar owners expected. I can attest to the 3.0L Jaguar X-Type engine as being rock solid, smooth, with adequate power and good response. At 227 horsepower and 206 pound-feet of torque, I describe its performance as "peppy." The only change I'd make is the addition of a 6 speed automatic transmission in lieu of the standard 5 speed automatic transmission. At highway speeds a 6th gear would drop the rpms to around 1900 which is much preferable to the almost 2300 rpms in 5th gear at 65 mph now.

While the X-Type was designed by Jaguar, Ford Motor Company pressed for a somewhat retro design that would be more recognizable to the American purchaser. Jaguar's task was to build an Estate that avoided the look of a box and yet would meet Jaguar's eternal pledge of making cars that are "beautiful, powerful, and glamorous." The X-Type Sportwagon is Ian Callum's first hands on design effort after he became Director of Design at Jaguar. The Sportwagon was designed in concert with the Pininfarina Design Group and is totally unique from the "B" pillar back compared to the X-Type Sedan. good-looking car that I drive defensively knowing no body parts can be found in the unfortunate incident of a rear end collision.

The Jaguar X-Type Sportwagon meets my needs. I am one of those individuals growing up in the 50s and 60s who believed in form and function and appreciated the value of my dad's station wagons. When Joan and I vacation in Ocean City, NJ each September I can carry everything we need for the month in one trip. I enjoy the "personal fit" of its size, its more pleasing rear end visual lines and that it has a dedicated V6 engine rather than an inline 4 or a cut off V8. I

also enjoy the all-around visibility of a wagon and its cargo utility capability. Early on I replaced the factory radio with an up to date Pioneer radio adding both satellite radio and Bluetooth capabilities. I mounted a dedicated dash holder for my phone and with Google Maps can find my way anywhere.

Over the course of its production run (2001 to 2009) Jaguar sold 110,890 X-Types in the US (1,602 of which were Estates). The X-Type did have the Mondeo chassis but not much more. Approximately 20% of Mondeo components were shared with the X-Type, which answers the question; "yes, it is a real Jaguar."

Today the X-Type seems to have faded into the background of Jaguar's heritage. Depending on

condition and mileage the Sportwagons go for between \$4,000 and \$9,000. The X-Type Sedan and X-Type Sportwagon scored a number of firsts for Jaguar. It was the first Jaguar to have all wheel drive as standard equipment. The first to have a transversely mounted engine and the first production Sportwagon. It was the last Jaguar fit for a queen. Queen Elizabeth II owned and drove an X-Type Estate.

The X-Type Sportwagon and Sedan have a strong, instantly recognizable Jaguar identity and an acceptable blend of performance and style. Savvy Jaguar Club of North America members looking for a sound daily driver are snapping up the best examples for pennies on the dollar.







5.3-liter V12 engine

curved to incorporate vacuum advance rather than vacuum retard. This was done to encourage more suitable shifting from the OE automatic and better throttle response under load. These and other modifications retain much of the originality of these remarkable V12 engines but with notable performance improvement making this particular 5.3-liter V12 exceptionally well suited for use with a manual transmission. This engine runs perfectly and without fault as is shown in video clips that are available upon request. It is 100% reliable and in excellent cosmetic and mechanical condition and ready for installation in a suitable chassis. Most XKE Series 3 specific accessories are also included such as the recently rebuilt OE carbs, alternator, starter, electronic ignition and A/C compressor converted for R134. Some smaller trim and installation-specific parts such as hoses, balance pipes, wiring, accessory drive belts, etc. are also available. - -Hydraulic brakes: Castrol brake fluid, GTMLA (green bottle), is what they use at the shop.
- -Motor Oil: Kendall GT1 (with zinc in it) or Mobil 1 is fine for Jaguars.
- -Other classic cars oil options suggested: PennGrade High Performance SAE30, Break-in-Oil
- -Some people also use ZDDPlus to supplement their oil.
- -Gas: non-ethanol, if it can be found. Check specialty gas stations. Racing fuel, if it can be found.
- -Sunoco 94 works well, also

We were also given a demonstration of tire shaving. Very interesting. My friend with me, Sumra Manning, actually had this done for his Sunbeam Tiger at K&T's old location, about 15 years ago.

- Shortly after the Zinio notification a second email will be sent from JCNA with the current Member card and any white JJ flysheet content.
