Membership Musings

May 2026

With your indulgence, I'm going to use my space in the *Purr* this month to discuss a new communication initiative being launched in May for DVJC members, namely the use of an application known as **WhatsApp**. For some, this column will be a welcome relief from my usual whining about the new direction of JLR, or the odd examples of Jaguar models and paraphernalia which have captured my attention, or even, heaven forbid, the relative softness of the British classic car market these days. For others, this may provoke that glazed over look you get when trying to understand some newfangled technology. If you're in that latter group, I'd ask that you simply keep an open mind for just a few more minutes reading time. Thanks.

So, what's up with WhatsApp? It's perhaps easier to start by disclaiming what it is not. It's not yet another form of dreaded social media. You don't "friend" people like on Facebook or get "followers" like on Instagram. Nope. WhatsApp is a new, and optional, way to communicate and stay connected with your fellow DVJC members, employing your smartphone or tablet. It has much in common with text messaging, only instead of communicating with one individual (or even a few) at a time, it allows an extended group conversation (a "Chat" in WhatsApp parlance.) In the case of the DVJC Chat, participation in the group will be limited to only those fellow members who have elected to join the conversation and who have been "admitted" to the Chat by a DVJC moderator/administrator (yours truly, for the time being).

It's important to note that this will be in addition to our regular channels of communication, such as the DVJC website, email blasts, and our monthly newsletter *The Jaguar's Purr* which you're reading right now. None of those are going away. The WhatsApp Chat is intended as a supplemental means of communication to facilitate event reminders, provide quick updates between events and meetings, and allow sharing of photos, videos, and other content which members of the Chat care to contribute. It's also noteworthy that, unlike other applications which may inhabit your smartphone/tablet, no content from any contributors outside of the DVJC Chat will ever appear. No spam, no advertisements, no politics, no nonsense.



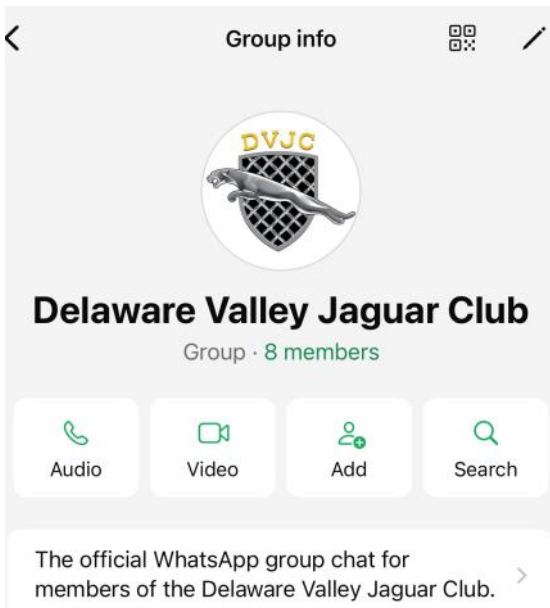
If you're still with me here, it's time for a preview of coming attractions. The first thing you will need to do is to assure that you have the WhatsApp application on your device. It looks like the green logo above with an old school telephone handpiece inside of a cartoon conversation balloon. Go figure. Assuming you already have this application on your screen, you're (almost) good to go. You'll just need to click on a link which will be supplied in our forthcoming instructional email to DVJC members, and which will take you to a portal to request to join the Chat. That link, which again will only go to DVJC members, is your "invitation" to join the Chat.



Assuming you do not yet have the WhatsApp application installed upon your device, you'll need to download it from the "App Store" application (for Apple product users) or from the equivalent function for Android devices. On Apple devices, the App Store can be found where the above blue logo with the stylized figure "A" appears. Did I mention that the WhatsApp application is free? It is. There is absolutely no cost to download it or to use it. I should also mention that once you join the Chat, you do not actually

need to “speak”, i.e., to contribute content. You can be a passive consumer of information, although we hope, and suspect, that we will have a good deal of member content contributed once the Chat is really up and running.



We'll be circulating an email within the next week to all DVJC members with specific instructions on how to join the DVJC WhatsApp Chat. Shown above is the home page of the DVJC group Chat where you will be able to join the conversation in progress. Again, there will be a link in the forthcoming email message which will

take you to a portal to facilitate your access. The email will also contain step-by-step instructions to get you through the “admissions” process. And, if all else fails, I'll see you at the Spring Fling on May 16, at which time I can guide you through the process (bring your smartphone along).

Why go through all of this when we have other ways to communicate? Basically, two reasons: 1. Our club survey and the Membership Engagement Strategy derived from that in 2025 suggest that we need to leverage all possible ways in which to keep members actively participating and therefore retained. Chief among those are our publications and communications, in addition to our schedule of events of course. 2. I suggest to you that this WhatsApp initiative will be enjoyable as well as convenient and informative.

I'll confess to my own substantial bias in favor of WhatsApp. With my grown kids living far away, separated by geography (three different continents) and time zones, having a no-cost, convenient, instantaneous, easy to use means of communication is indispensable. It's also a lot of fun. So, please give this a try. I'll see you soon on the DVJC WhatsApp Chat, and until then-

2026 DVJC Concours d'Elegance and Cars and Motorcycles of England, June 6, 2026

It is hard to believe that our featured JCNA-Sanctioned Concours d'Elegance is now less than a month away. The deadline for show car registration is midnight, Saturday May 30. My, how the time flies!

This year will mark the tenth anniversary of our popular concours held in conjunction with the Cars and Motorcycles of England (CMOE) on the vast lawns and gardens of the Historic Hope Lodge in Fort Washington, PA. As is customary, this major event is carefully organized by the DVJC planning team working closely with the Delaware Valley Triumph (DVT) Club, Friends of Hope Lodge and several other clubs and participants to make this year's event a special one for every enthusiast and fan of British automobilia. We usually see more than 150 show cars of all descriptions along with over a thousand spectators and enthusiasts! I can guarantee there will be something of interest for everyone attending whether they be a show field participant, spectator or just a curious onlooker. At the very least, I trust by now that all DVJC members have the date marked prominently on their social calendars.

Every event depends heavily on the invaluable contributions of the many volunteers needed to plan, organize and execute to ensure that these complicated events are enjoyable, safe and most importantly, FUN! If you have not already signed up to attend with a show car or to volunteer for one of the numerous support roles, this is a great time to consider volunteering to help with some positions still open now. Here is a summary of the presently open volunteer positions for this year's show needed to make this year's event successful:

- Show Field Parking Volunteers
- Spectator Parking Volunteers
- Concours Scoring and Support Volunteers



Should you have any interest in helping ensure the success of this year's event or have any questions about what these positions involve, please contact the Concours Chairman or Co-Chair at the email addresses below. All volunteer positions are of short duration ranging from one hour to several hours each with well-defined responsibilities. This a terrific opportunity to meet and work with fellow club members and to encourage recruitment of new members who share our collective passion for automobiles and motorcycles unique to England. Of course, volunteers may bring their Jaguars and enjoy free parking on the show field. There is limited space available on the show field so please register your vehicle information early even if you are a volunteer. We will make every effort to include all volunteer cars on the show field but cannot guarantee show filed parking unless you are also registered in the Display, Driven or Champion category and have paid the corresponding admission fee. Any overflow volunteer cars will be directed to an overflow parking area adjacent to the show field on the left side of the show field entry driveway.

For members who are new to the club or have not attended or participated in prior years, several concurrent events are held on the grounds of the Hope Lodge. For 2026, these are largely unchanged from prior years and will include the DVJC Concours, DVT CMOE, a Car Coral and the Hope Lodge Ales and Petals Celebration. Also participating are many smaller local car

clubs, key event sponsors and organizers along with numerous businesses who support our evolving British automotive interests. The DVJC's annual Concours d'Elegance is one of the club's signature events and brings together a wide range of Jaguar cars to be viewed and/or judged in this JCNA sanctioned event. The Ales & Petals Celebration helps support the Hope Lodge with their volunteers who host the food court including a local brewery and winery and with music provided by a live band in the gardens surrounding the mansion.



Of course, for many DVJC members, the most significant event of the day is our Concours d'Elegance. This annual event is sanctioned by the JCNA and is held to their very high standards of conduct and scoring uniformity for authenticity and condition of Jaguar automobiles dating from their original Swallow motorcycle sidecars to the most recent production passenger cars. There are three categories for entry on the DVJC show field: Display, Driven and Champion each with varying levels of judging scrutiny ranging from none to very rigorous. Pricing and details including official entry criteria and classes, can be found at the DVJC online registration page accessible anytime at <https://delvaljaguarclub.com/events/dvjc-concours-delegance-4/> You may also register using a paper application by following the online link or contact information included on the online link.

Please note that all DVJC entries must be preregistered and the registration deadline is midnight Saturday, May 30, 2026. All Jaguars must be registered with the DVJC for entry on the show field. All CMOE entries including Jaguars not entered in the DVJC Concours must also preregister at the Delaware Valley Triumph website. This year, no unregistered vehicles will be admitted to the show field. They will be redirected to the spectator entrance and parking area. This is a rain or shine event with no refunds possible for cancellations.

We hope to see you at the Hope Lodge on June 6, 2026!

Shanghai Darts to Premiere at 2026 Spring Fling

In conjunction with the 65th anniversary of the E-type and the 30th anniversary of the XK8, the Delaware Valley Jaguar Club is introducing darts, the quintessential British game, to our Spring Fling on May 16. The top three darts winners will receive prizes. (We'll also be awarding a framed 1961 E-type poster and a framed 1996 XK8 poster as prizes for other Spring Fling gaming event winners.)

In case you haven't played darts in a while (or ever), we've written this brief summary of the sport's history, evolution, and current variations.



From ancient origins to modern incarnation

The ancient history of darts traces back to England in the 1300s, when warriors played it to pass the time between battles. Bored soldiers sitting in trenches competed with one another by throwing spearheads at the bottoms of overturned wine caskets. This improved their throwing skills and aim. Players eventually progressed to using cross-sectioned tree trunks as targets. The trunks' growth rings and radial cracks became the template for the pattern seen on modern dart boards.

For centuries after the first British version of darts, the game continued to evolve. The modern history of darts originated in France in the mid-1800s, when Frenchmen played with small arrows called flechettes. Made from wood, they had metal points, with turkey feathers attached for more accurate flight. The 19th century saw numerous versions of the game. Various scoring systems were used in England and France, but no standard rule system had yet emerged.

In 1896, Brian Gamlin, a British carpenter from Lancashire, invented the 1-to-20 numbering system still used today. This gave rise to the professional dartboard with segments numbered 1 to 20; players took turns aiming for specific numbered segments.

By the early 20th century, darts had become a staple of the British working-class culture and evolved into a pub game with standardized equipment and rules. Official equipment includes steel-tipped darts used with a traditional bristle board—a durable, self-healing material.

The game became ubiquitous in British pubs and spread globally, soon becoming a competitive sport. The first organized championships took place in the 1920s. By 1924, the National Darts Association was established. In 1938, *The Times of London* reported on the emerging popular game in a Devon pub as “rowdy strangers” playing with “glistening, machine-made missiles” on a “new-fangled board.” By 1939, nearly 300,000 people had signed up for the yearly *News of the World* Dart Championship.

During World War II, darts became even more popular among British soldiers; as in centuries before, they played it to pass the time and enjoy some respite from the war. Winston Churchill was known to throw darts every once in a while as well. See www.thetimes.com/uk/photography-uk/article/a-history-of-british-darts-told-through-the-times-photo-archive-df0gtps62. American soldiers soon became enamored with darts, too, adopting it and eventually disseminating it throughout the United States.

Shanghai Darts -(continued)

By the 1980s, darts was a global phenomenon. Today the game is bigger than ever, with superstar players gaining instant recognition and fame. Earlier this year, Luke “the Nuke” Littler won Britain’s PDC World Darts Championship, earning a record-breaking £1 million prize (equivalent to \$1.35 million U.S. dollars).

In recent years, dart proponents have been pushing for the game to be included in the Olympics, citing its skill-based nature and popularity. But they’re up against several obstacles. The major hurdle: the sport lacks a single, international body recognized by the International Olympic Committee. Currently, its oversight is split between the World Darts Federation and the Professional Darts Corporation.

Dart variations

Here are the most common variations of darts.

- **501:** This the main competitive darts game, in which players subtract scores from 501 points to reach zero.
- **Around-the-clock:** Players aim to hit every number from 1 to 20 sequentially.
- **Cricket (English style):** One player is the “batter,” scoring points, while the other is a “bowler” aiming for bullseyes to take wickets.
- **Killer:** Players gain “lives” by hitting their own assigned number. Once they accrue enough lives, they become a “killer” and can hit opponents’ numbers to eliminate them.

- **Shanghai:** Players aim for numbers 1 through 7 (or 20) in order, throwing 3 darts at a time. The player with the highest score at the end wins—but a player can win instantly by hitting a single, double, and triple of the current number in any round. This is what the British call a “Shanghai.” Oddly, hitting the bullseye acts as a miss. We’ll be playing the 1-through-7 version of Shanghai darts at the Spring Fling, so you might want to bone up on the rules here: <https://tinyurl.com/m9vxac85>

What’s the connection between darts and Jaguar—and, by extension, DVJC?

Darts and the Jaguar marque are both quintessentially British. One is a game of sport; the other is a sporting vehicle. Where does DVJC come in? A few months ago, I heard that a long-time Jaguar restoration shop (Jaguar Specialists in Levittown, PA) had closed permanently and was selling parts and equipment. I decided to check it out; for a multiple Jag owner like me, it seemed like a good opportunity to pick up an item or two. When I got there, I introduced myself to the widow of the shop owner and explained I’d had my second E-type Jaguar repaired there 40 years earlier. I also mentioned I was a DVJC member. After surveying the premises for an hour without luck, I decided to leave. On the way out, I spotted a vintage official dartboard nailed to the wall, along with a dozen or so darts. I asked the widow if the set was for sale. She said, “Here, you can have it. Just take it.” After thanking her, I realized almost immediately how I was going to put it to use: It would be our new iconic British game for the Spring Fling, to be held May 16 at Ringing Hill Fire Company in Pottstown, PA.

So let the games begin! And as the Brits say, “Good Arrows.”
